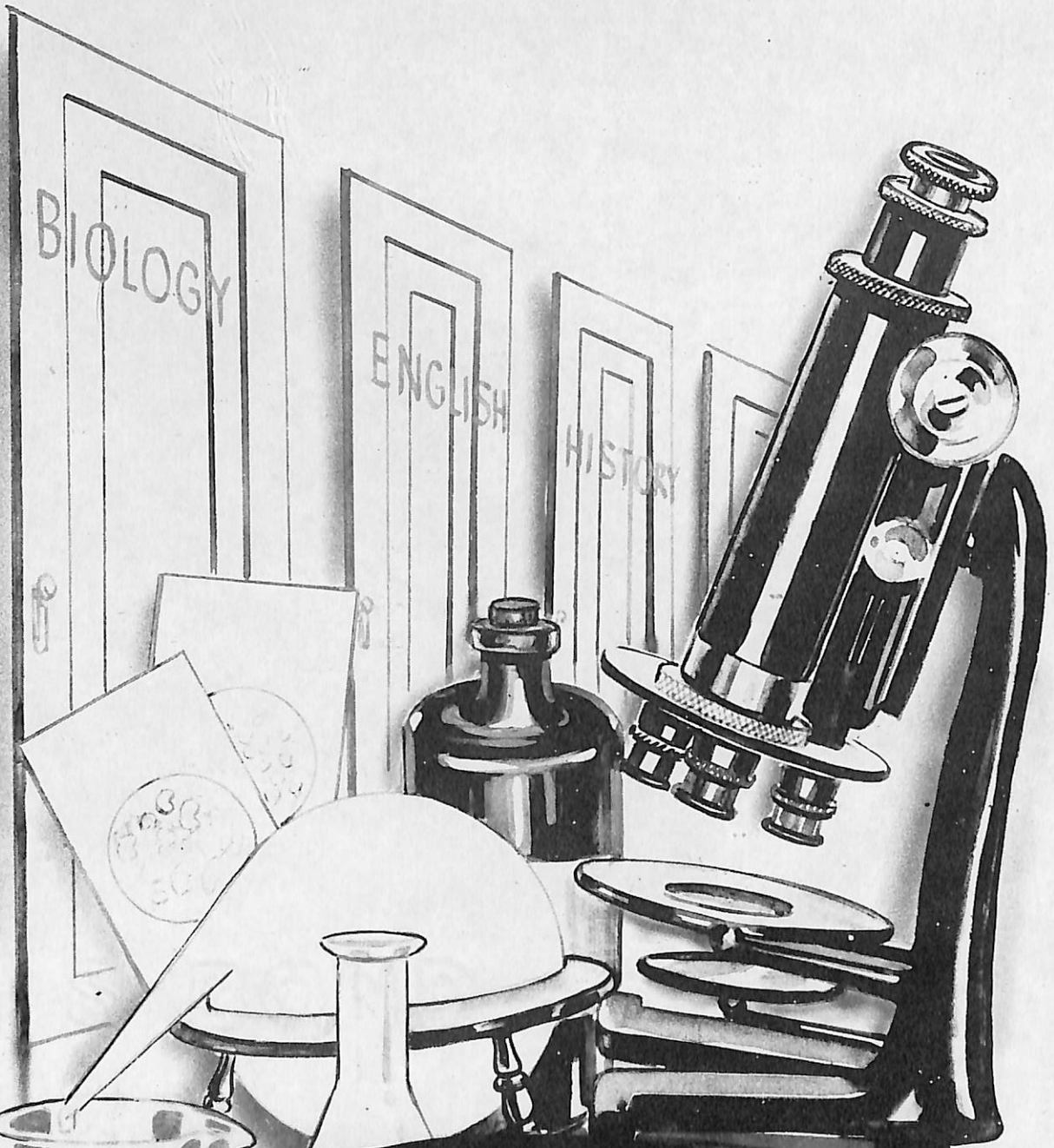
## JUNIOR CLASS

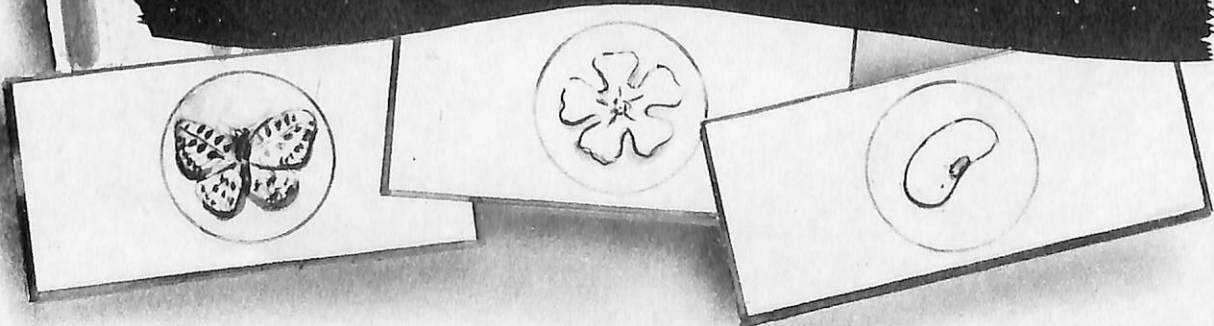
## SENIOR CLASS

## ART CLASS




## ATHLETICS

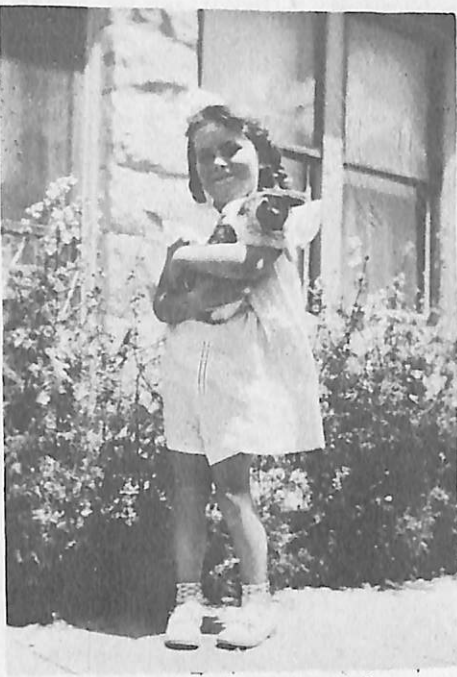

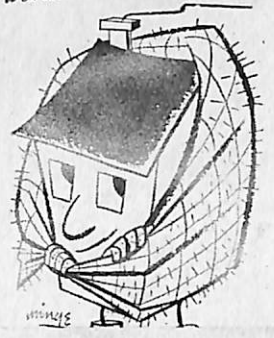
