# Increasing Singing Ability

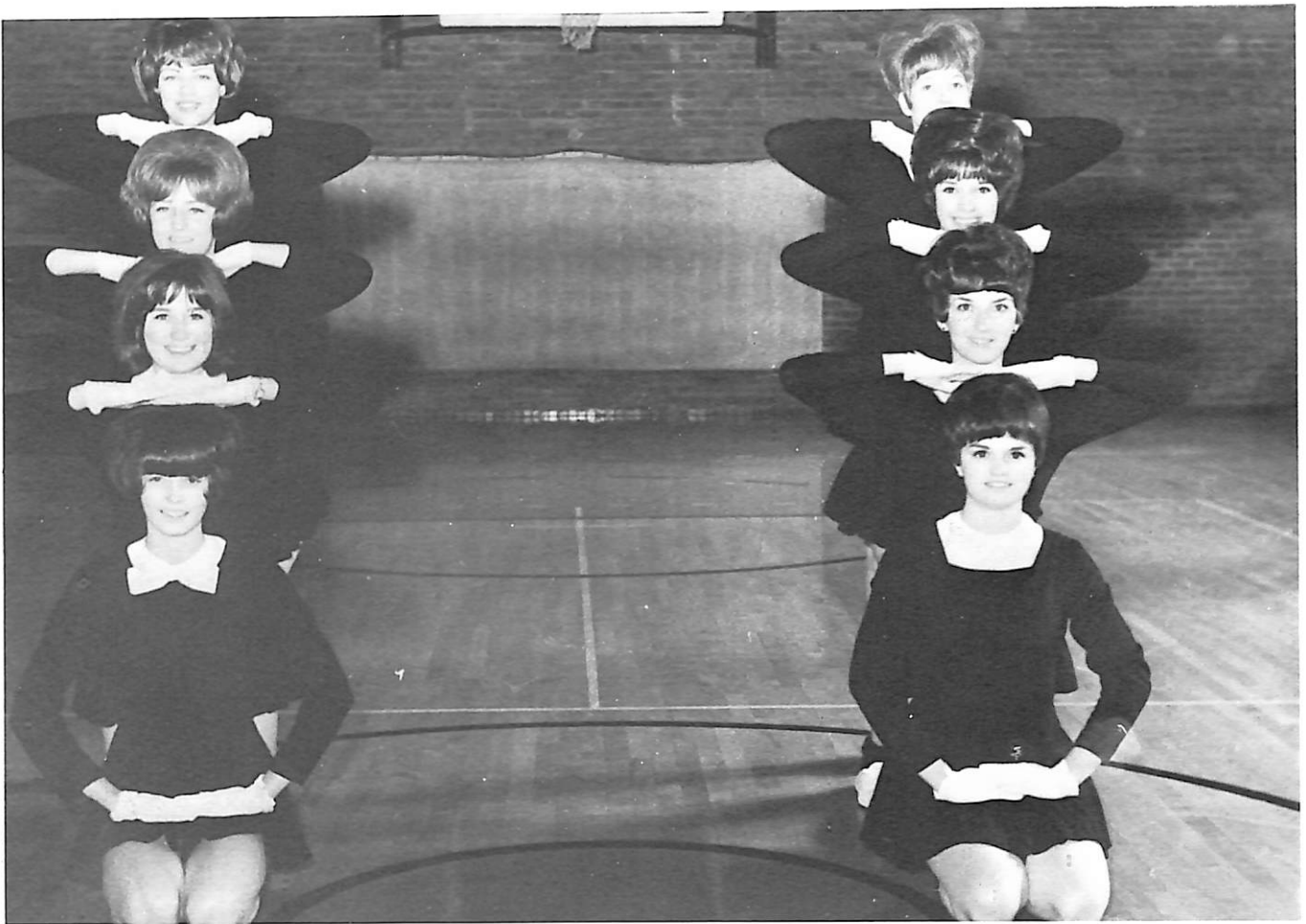
