


Administration Sets New Policies

Kumeroa Chournos lead the newly founded art department. The class's first project was the backdrop for "Fiddler." They also drew, painted, and built match houses.







PANTHERS TAKE STATE






Homecoming came to the tune of "Somethin' Special." a song the cheerleaders got at camp. The traditional parade. alumni program, and dance all were tremendously successful




The volleyball team had a fairly successful season. As the year progressed, the team showed several improvements including a 2nd place at District Tournament.







