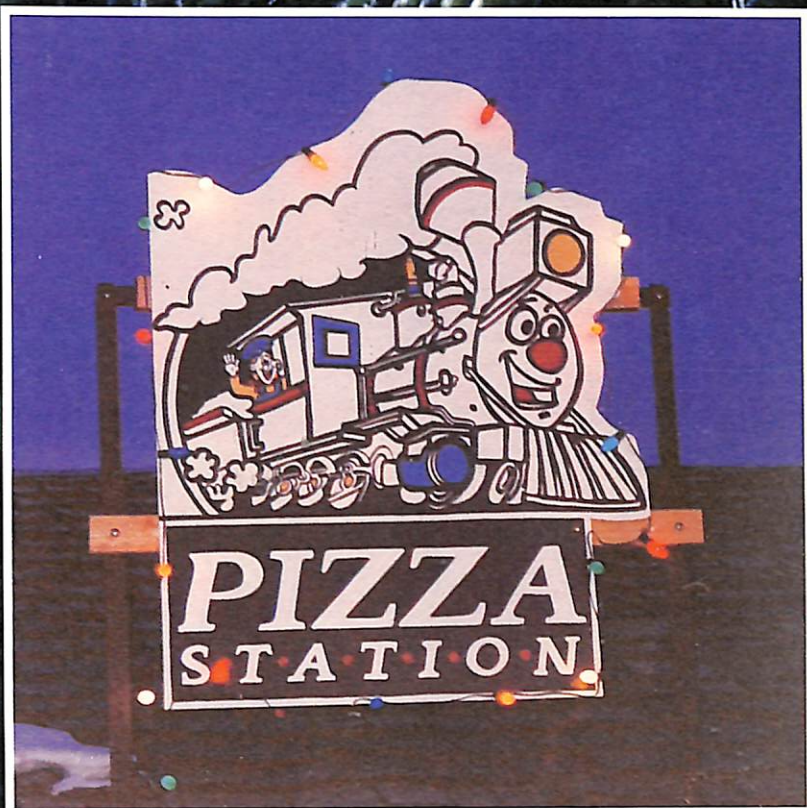

Hall passes are required whenever you are in the halls during class time. Many teachers have got into the spirit by having some quite creative hall passes, such as Miss Kunz who has

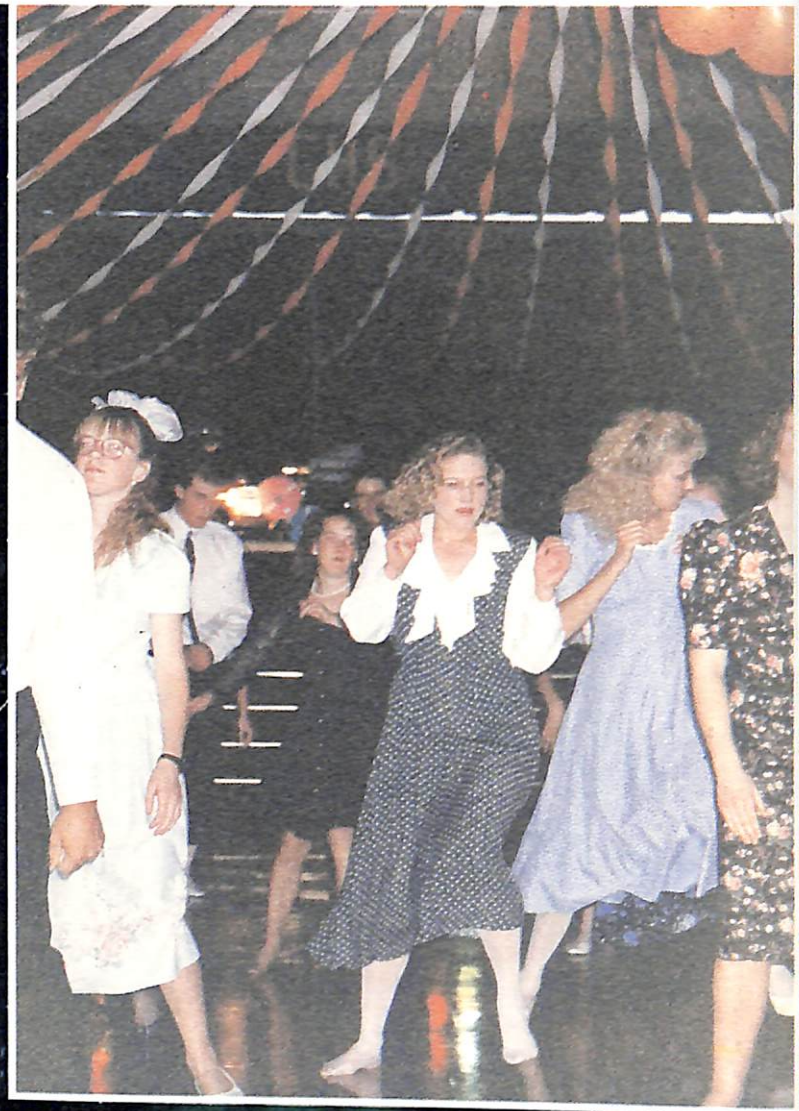
an ironing board, Mr. Forrest who has lab equipment welded together, Mr. Dana who has a bucket of iron, and Mr. Backman who has a drum stick.

State Champs Are on the Air

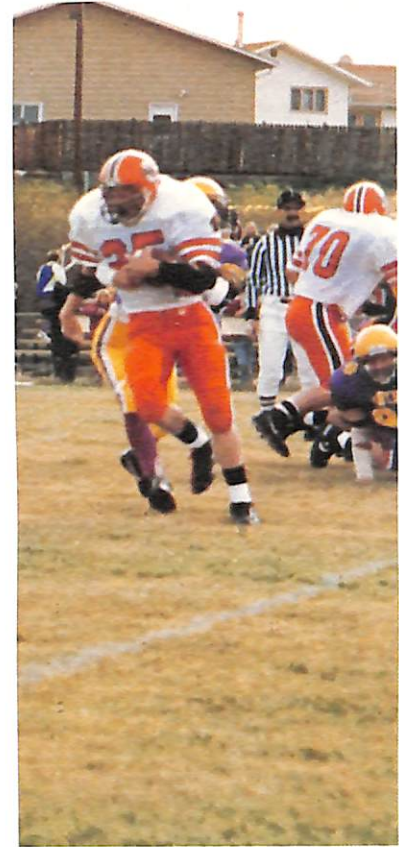

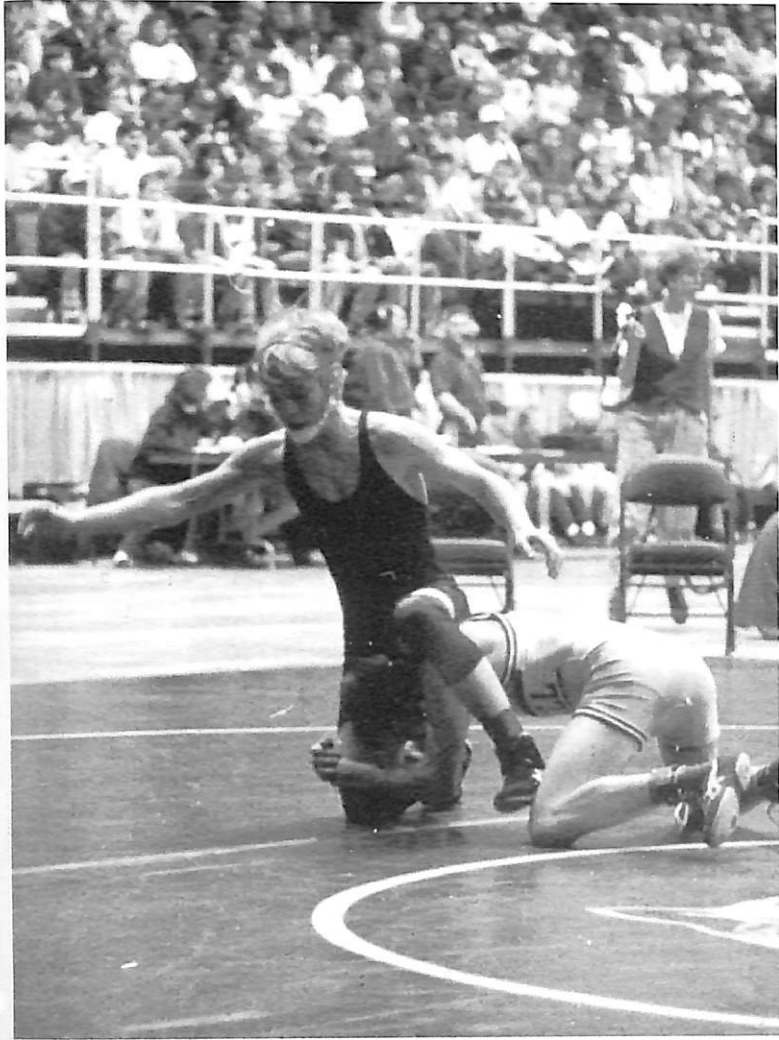

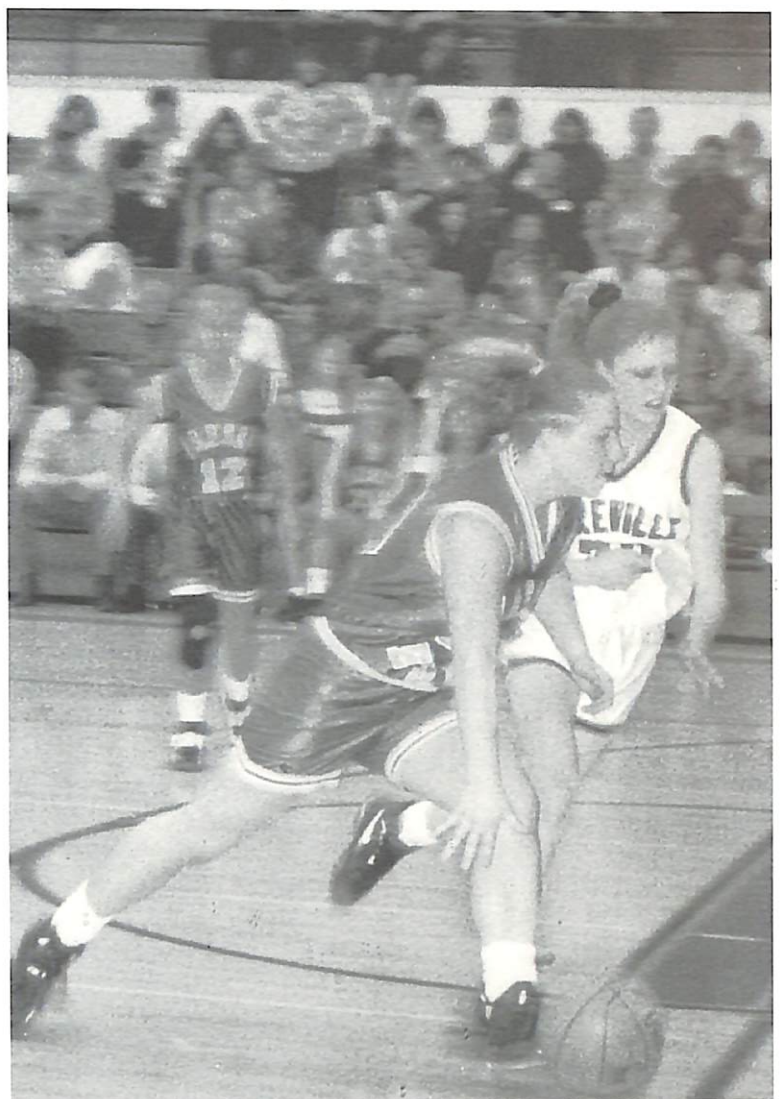

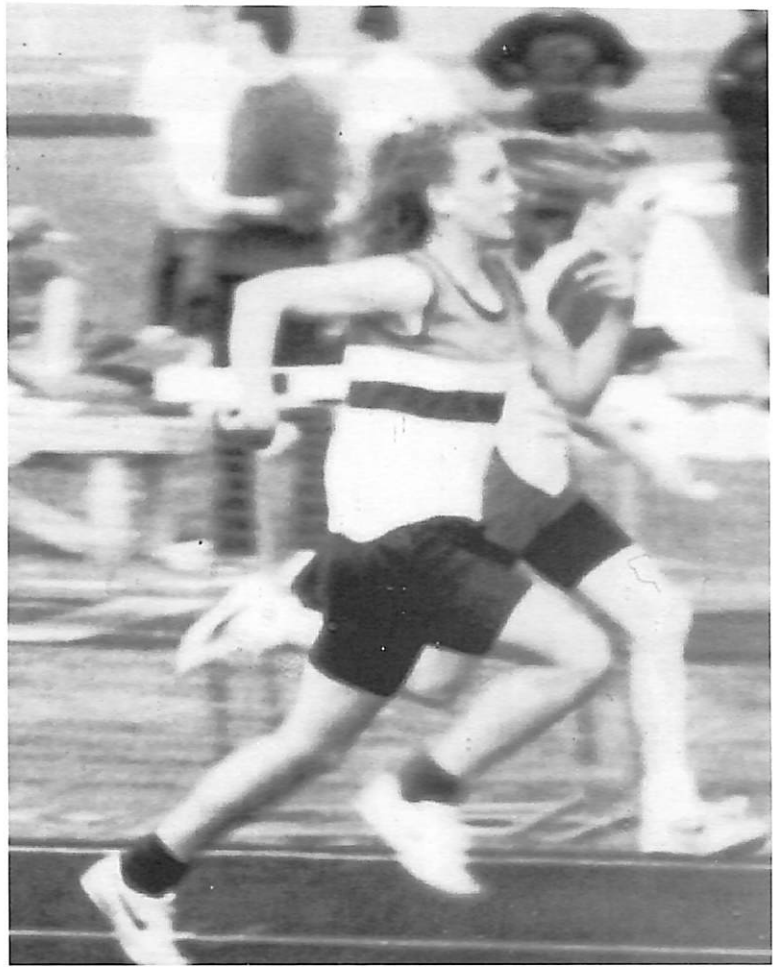

Ready Or Not, Here We Go

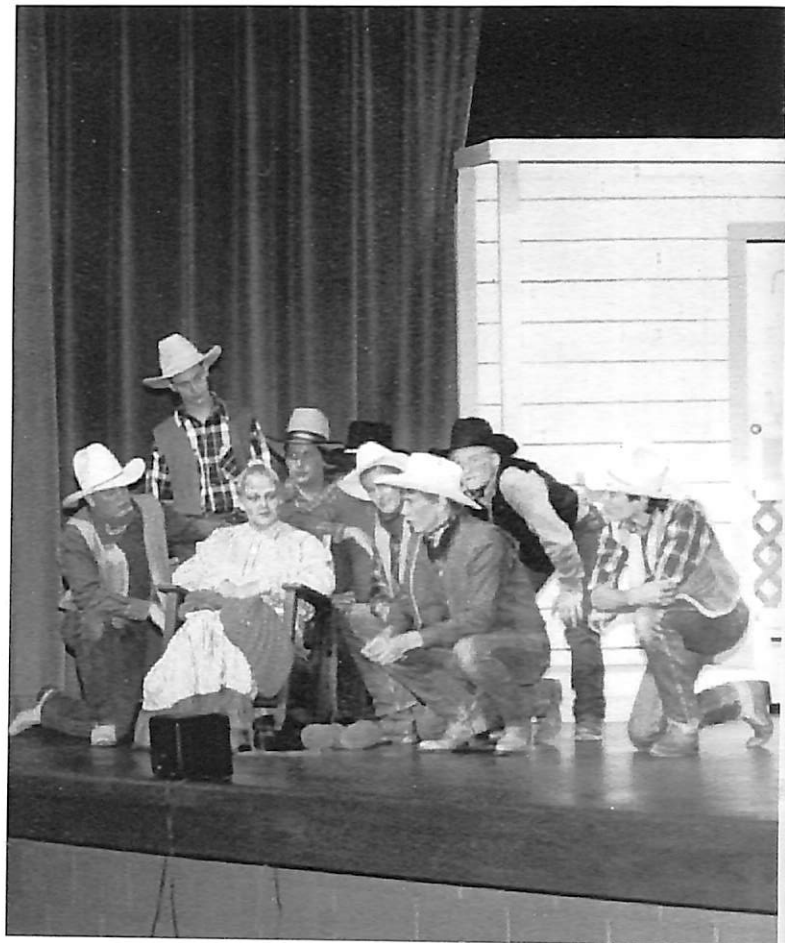

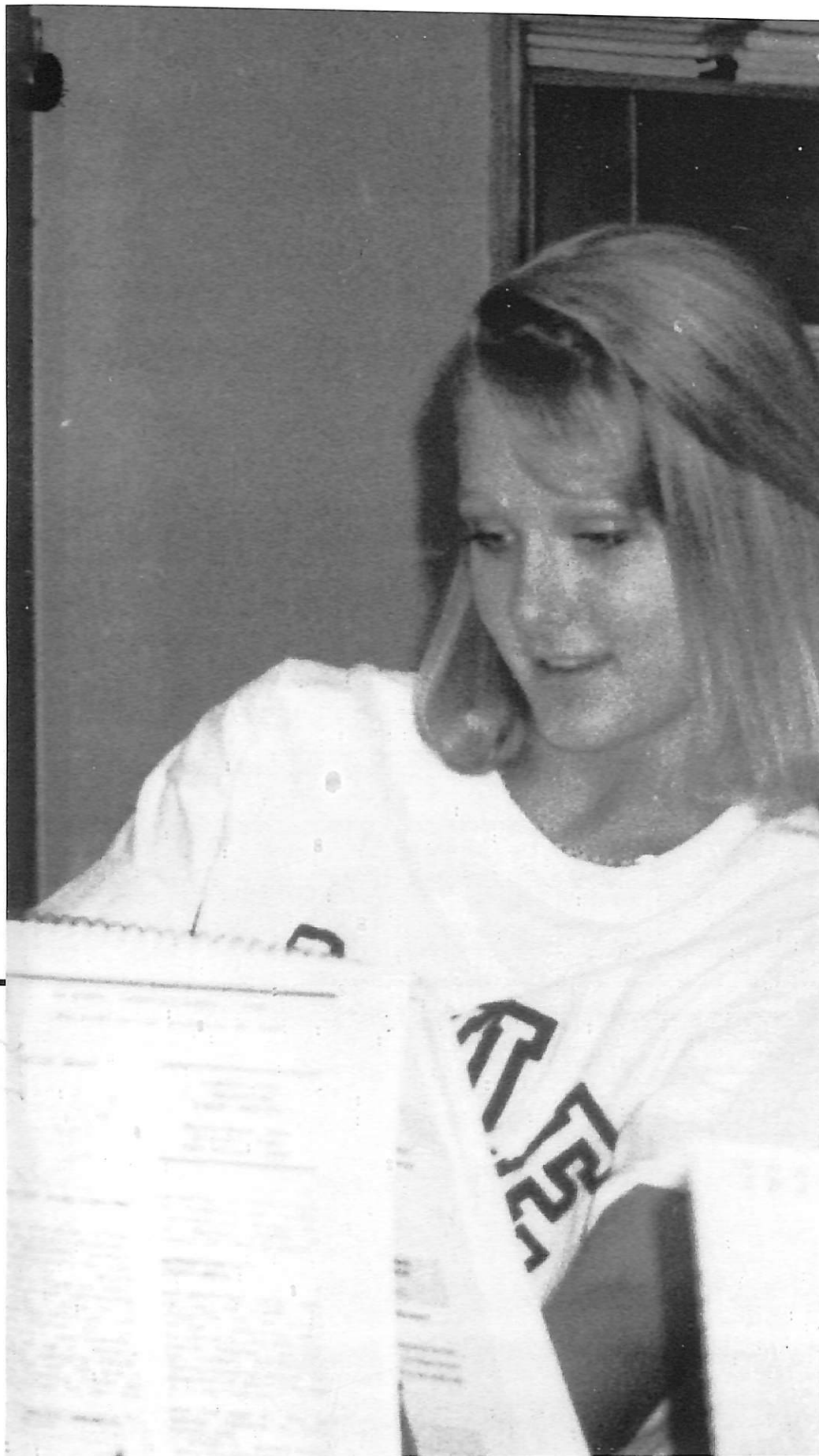

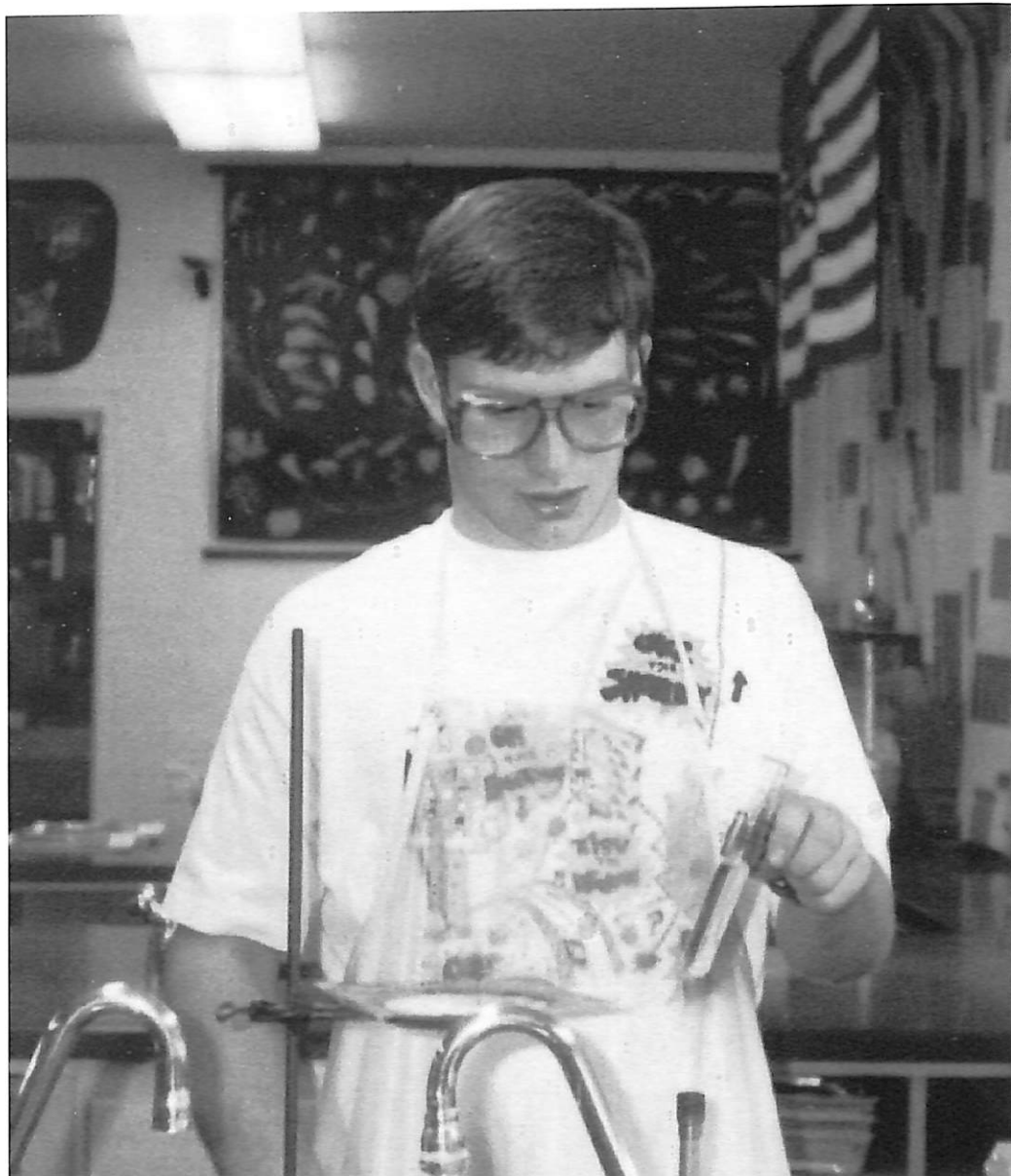

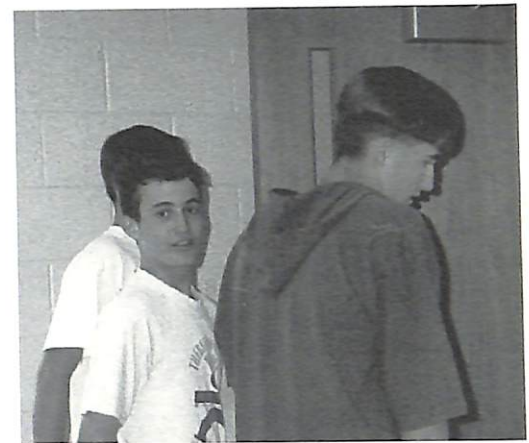
MATH
