


Good-bye To An Old Friend, Hello To An Exciting Future!



Dedication

In appreciation for his untiring and dedicated service at CHS, the Yearbook Staff dedicates this edition to Mr. Birch. Glenn L. Birch was born on June 21, 1946 in Montpelier, Idaho to Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Birch of Cokeville, Wyoming. He was the second son of four boys and was raised in Cokeville. He attended Cokeville Elementary and Jr./Sr. High School where he was active in basketball, track, music and student government. As a senior, he was elected student body president. Mr. Birch graduated from CHS in 1964, and then continued his education at Brigham Young University.

While attending BYU he was again active in music, performing with the Oratorio Choir. During his junior year, he married his high school sweetheart Mary Lue Thornock on September 1, 1967. He graduated from BYU in the spring of 1969 with a B.A. in Secondary Education with a Spanish

Language major and an English minor.

His first teaching job was in Rock Springs, Wyoming at Rock Springs High School where he taught Spanish and directed several plays and musicals. During the school year of 1971 the faculty staged a production of Man of La Mancha, and Mr. Birch played the lead role of Don Quixote.

In 1973 Mr. Birch began teaching English and Spanish at Cokeville High as well as coaching track, supervising the publication of the yearbook, and again directing plays.

In 1977 he took on the enormous project of doing the first ever musical production at CHS. <u>Oklahoma!</u> Was a great success and even went on the road to several surrounding communities. Mr. Birch directed 13 more musicals and was also the technical director of several more productions under the direction of Mr. John Miller and Mr. Royce Backman.

In 1979 and again in 1989 under Mr. Birch's supervision, the high school yearbook. <u>The Rambouillet</u>, won the state runner-up award in the 1-A division of the state yearbook competition. Mr. Birch continued to supervise the yearbook staff at CHS until 1998.

Mr. Birch has also come to be known as the voice of the panthers, announcing the Panther football games for many years.

Many of his students have often said how grateful they were for Mr. Birch's training them in writing, particularly in the writing of research papers. For many years he took his senior English classes to a large university library to experience first hand the research paper process that they would have to go through many times as college students.

Mr. Birch and his wife are the parents of six children and have six grandchildren. Mr. Birch has served the community of Cokeville as a member of the Pine Creek Ski Patrol, a member of the Bear River Fire Board of Control, teaching Western Wyoming College Outreach computer classes and in many other areas. He has always been willing to help people in the community by setting up sound systems for community events, helping with computer problems or any other need.

Mr. Birch continues to enjoy his hobbies of amateur radio, computers, skiing, genealogy, hunting and reading. His main joy however will always be seeing the students of Cokeville High School succeed.



We played against Shoshoni for football and Big Piney for volleyball and won both, making it a double victory. It was an





It was basically a pretty strange year with a lot of challenges, but hopefully it caused us to grow; If nothing else, at least it hade us appreciate having a real school building.










What Do You Mean Tempermental?


Smiles Were Our Only Sunshine!


