JUNIORS






























Yearbook Staff


TRAGEDY STRIKES JAPAN

Hurricane Irene hit many states along the East Coast in late summer and caused the closing of airports and subways, home evacuations, massive power outages and flooding.






HONORED HERO






ARAB SPRING


MISSION ACCOMPLISHED

Hawaii became the first state to include surfing as an official high school sport. The Aloha state is known as the birthplace of surfing and is home to many professional wave riders.






FACEBOOK MEMOLOGY


CRUISE SHIP TIPS

TURNING A NEW LEAF




TENNIS CHAMPS


X-TREME SPORTS




JUSTIN BIEBER WAY







