## Pepstars

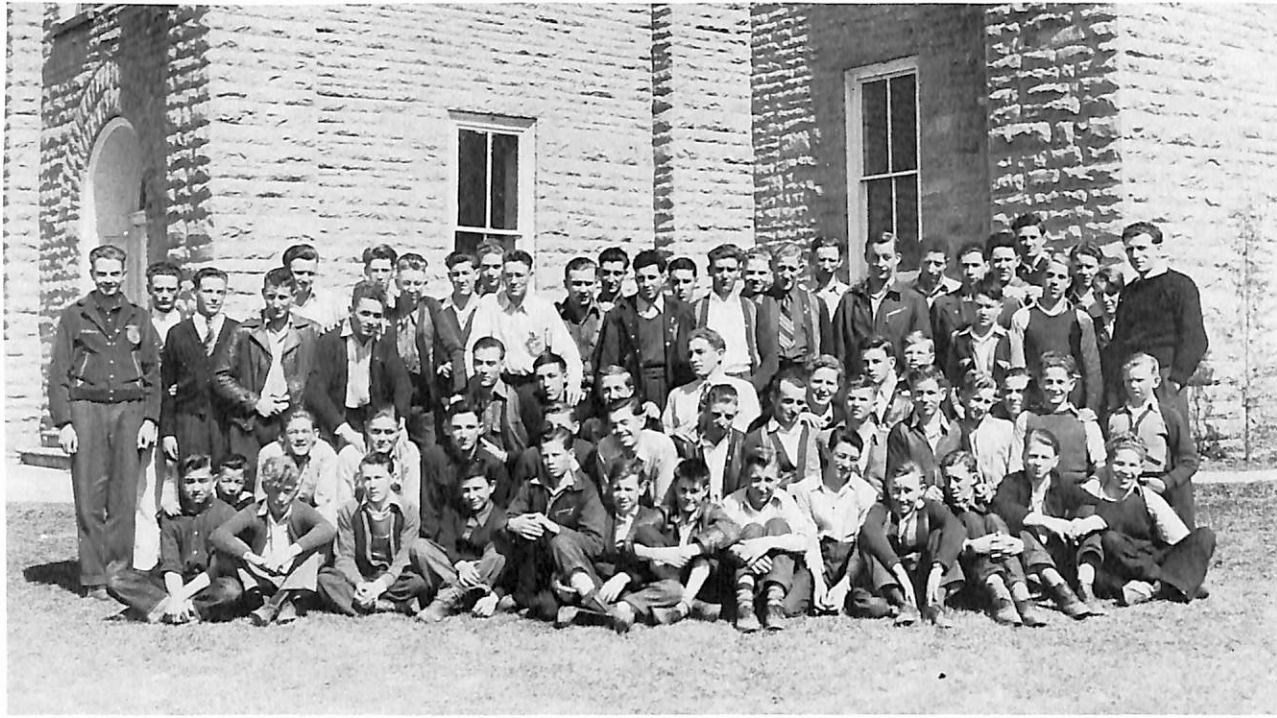

Not only does Star Valley Chapter of the F.F.A. rank high in the state in other contests, but also in public speaking, shop, poultry and agronomy.

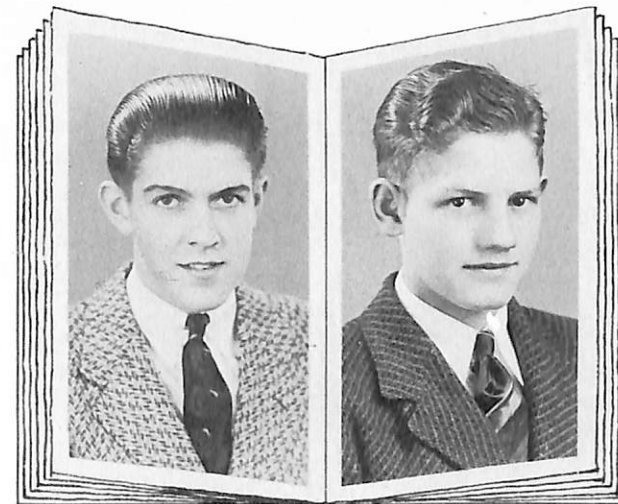

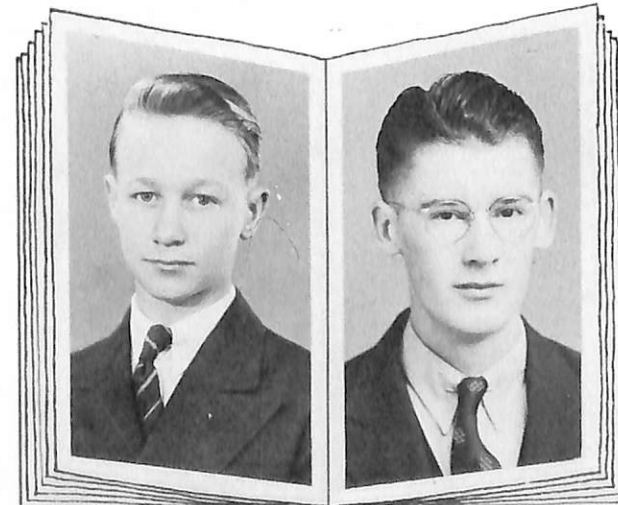

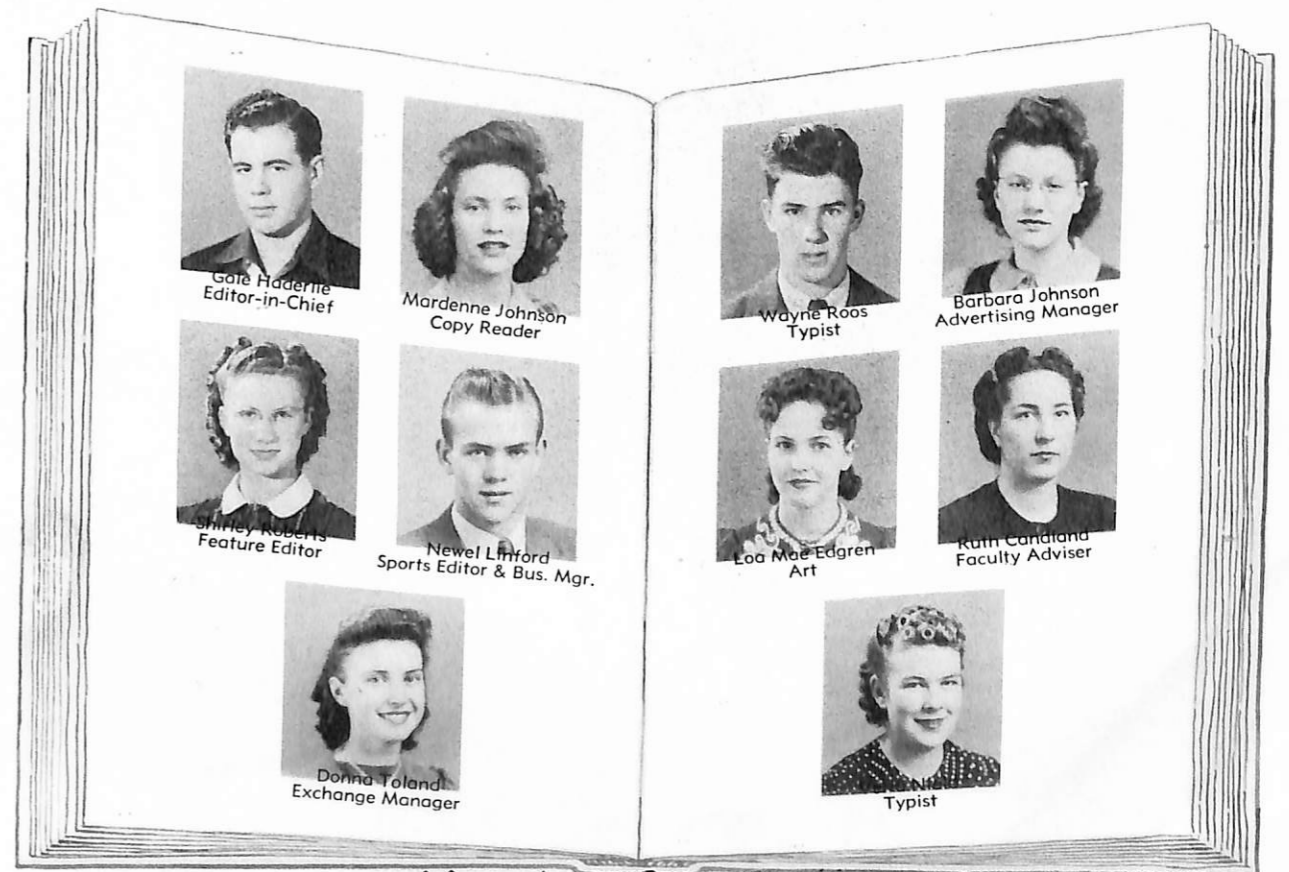
### Home Economics Club
