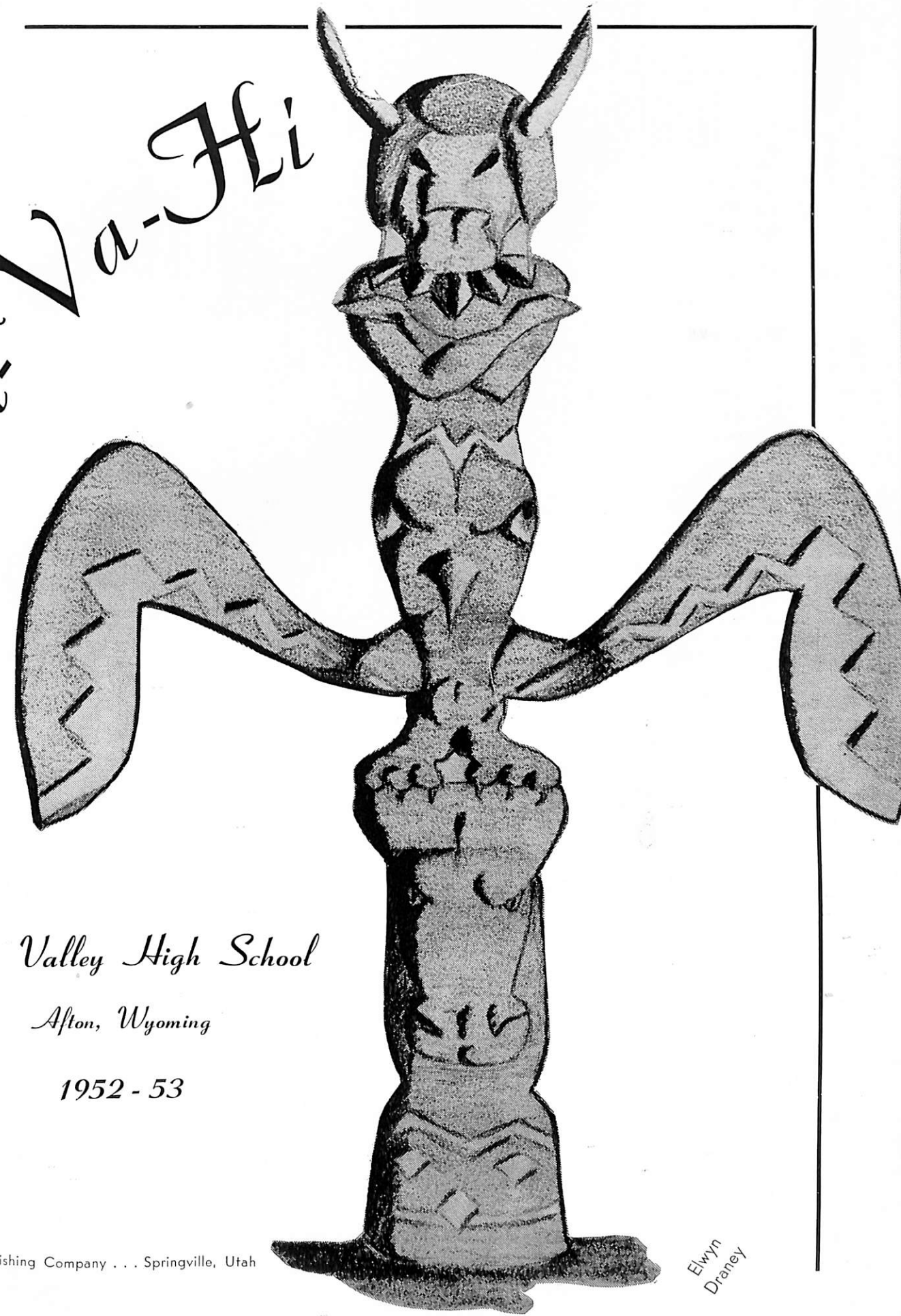

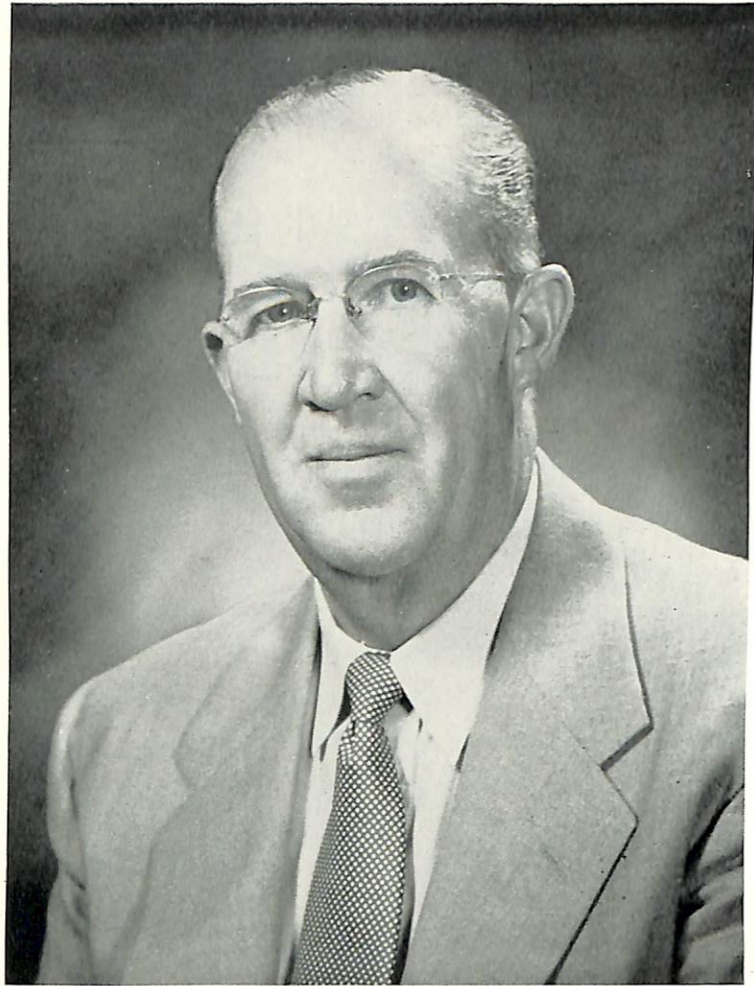

Speaking for myself and for the other teachers, may I say that it has been grand to work with you during this past school year.

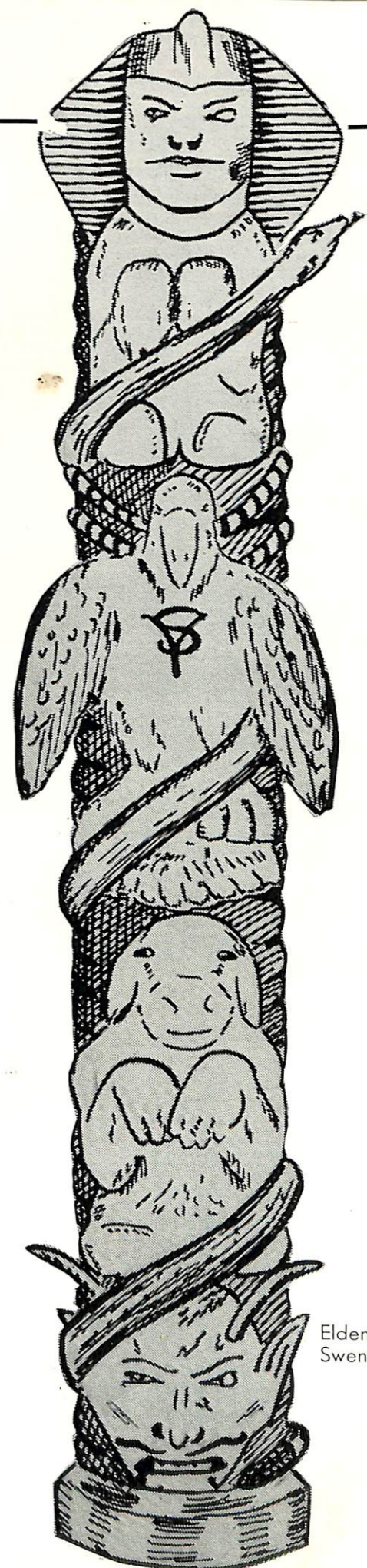

Mechanical drawing keeps us at an even keel with learning to read blueprints, make working drawings, and build furniture, etc.



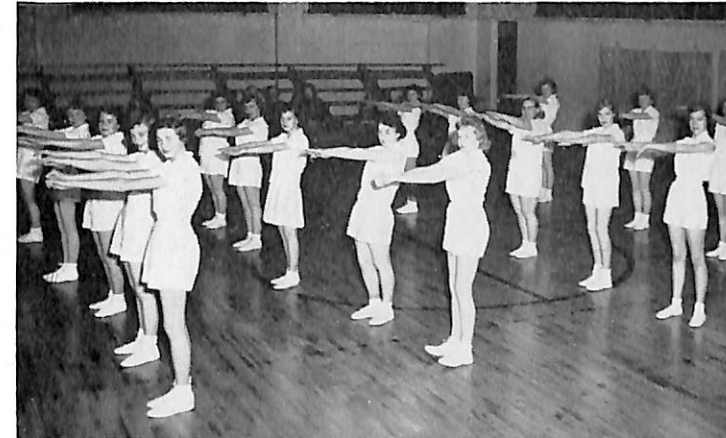
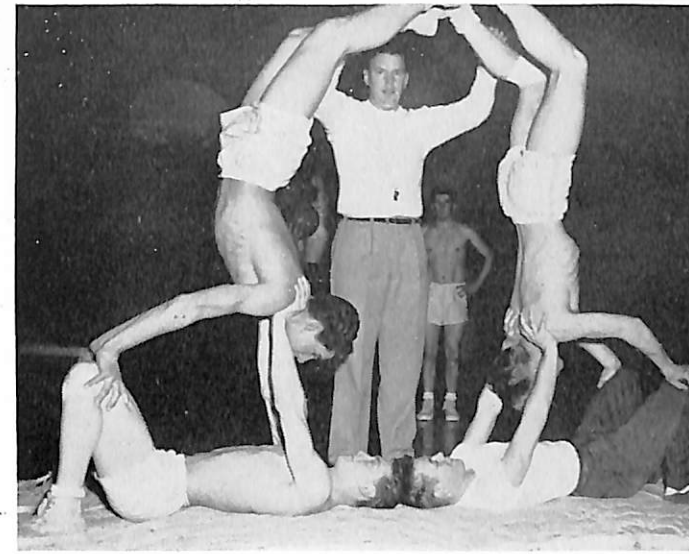
For self-expression, leading to a respect and a love of the beautiful, students take art—creative painting, design, and crafts.
