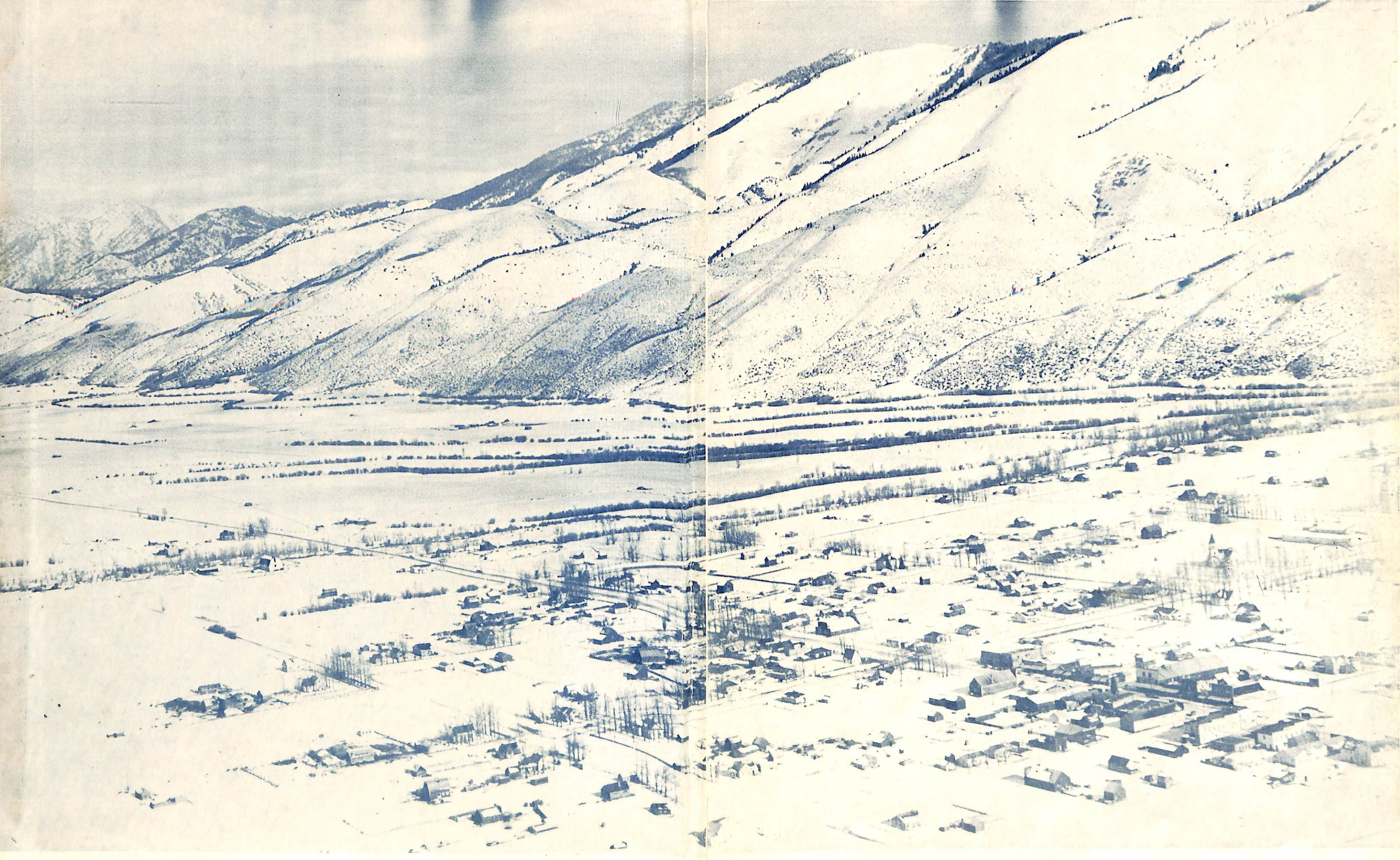

The seasons change—Autumn, Winter, Spring.

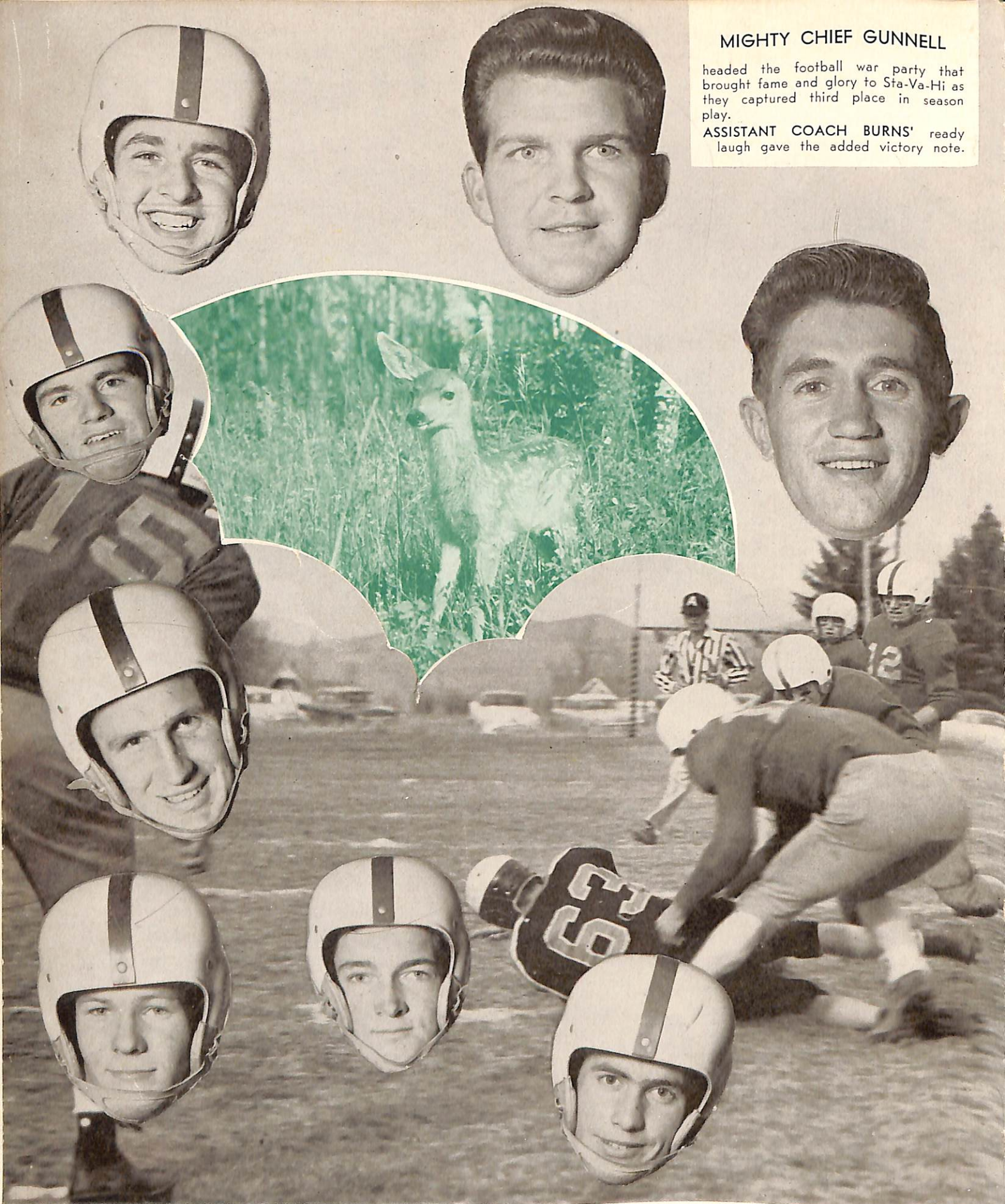

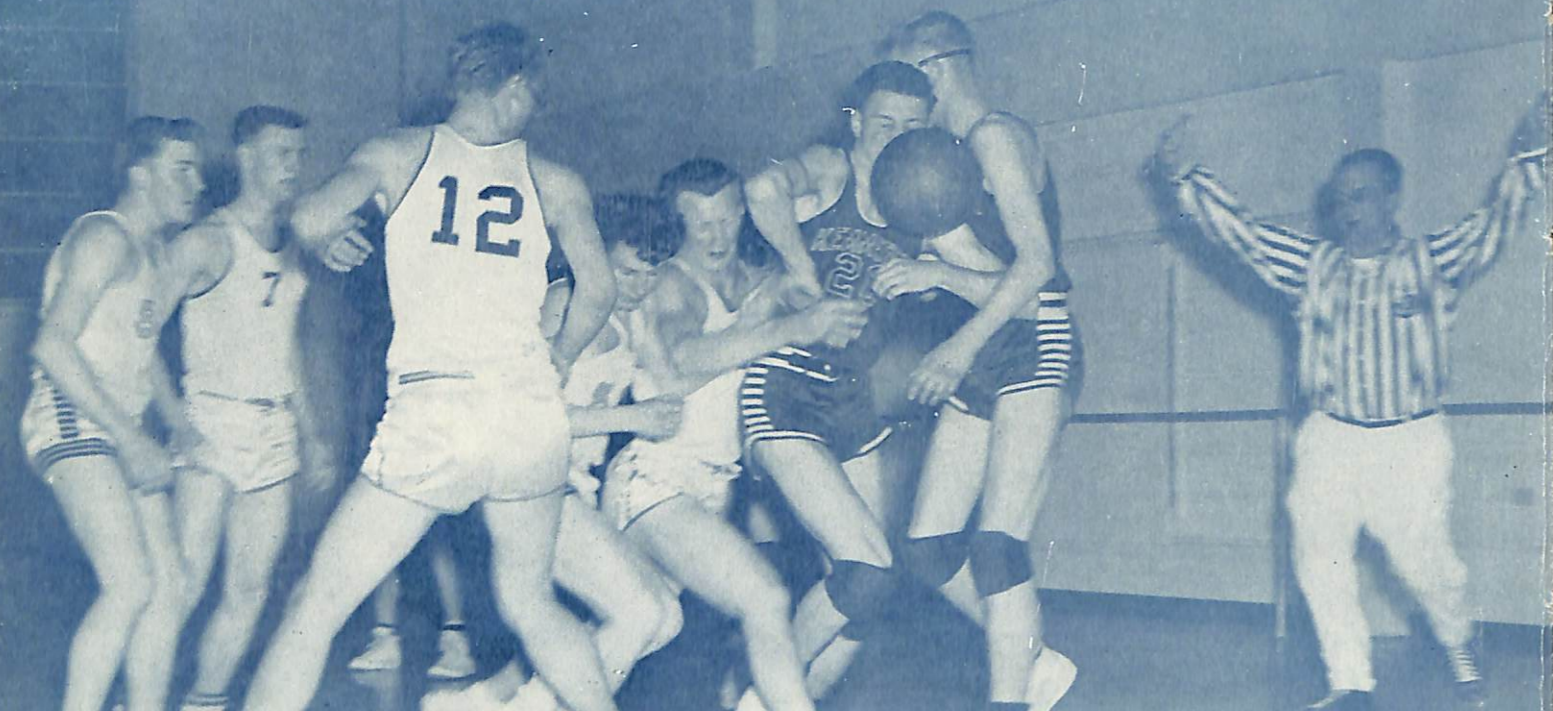

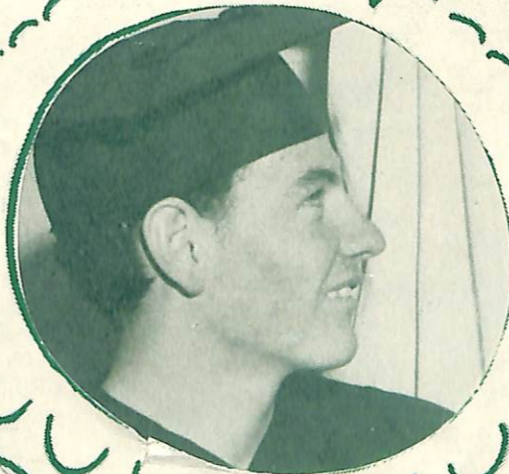
Having become oriented as Freshmen, our Papooses have confidently swung into the social and scholastic whirl of their first year at S. V. H. S.

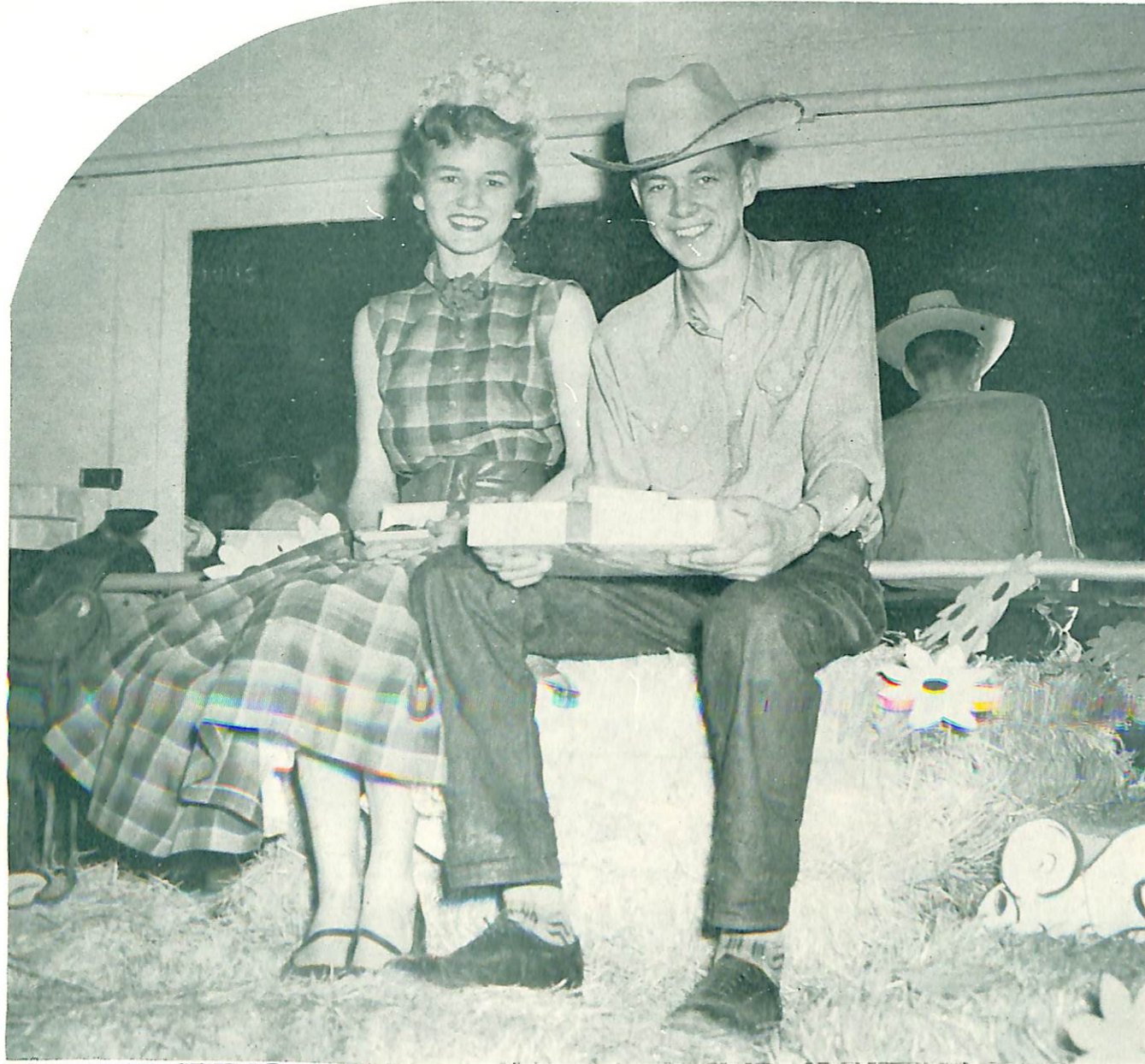
STORY OF THE PLAY
