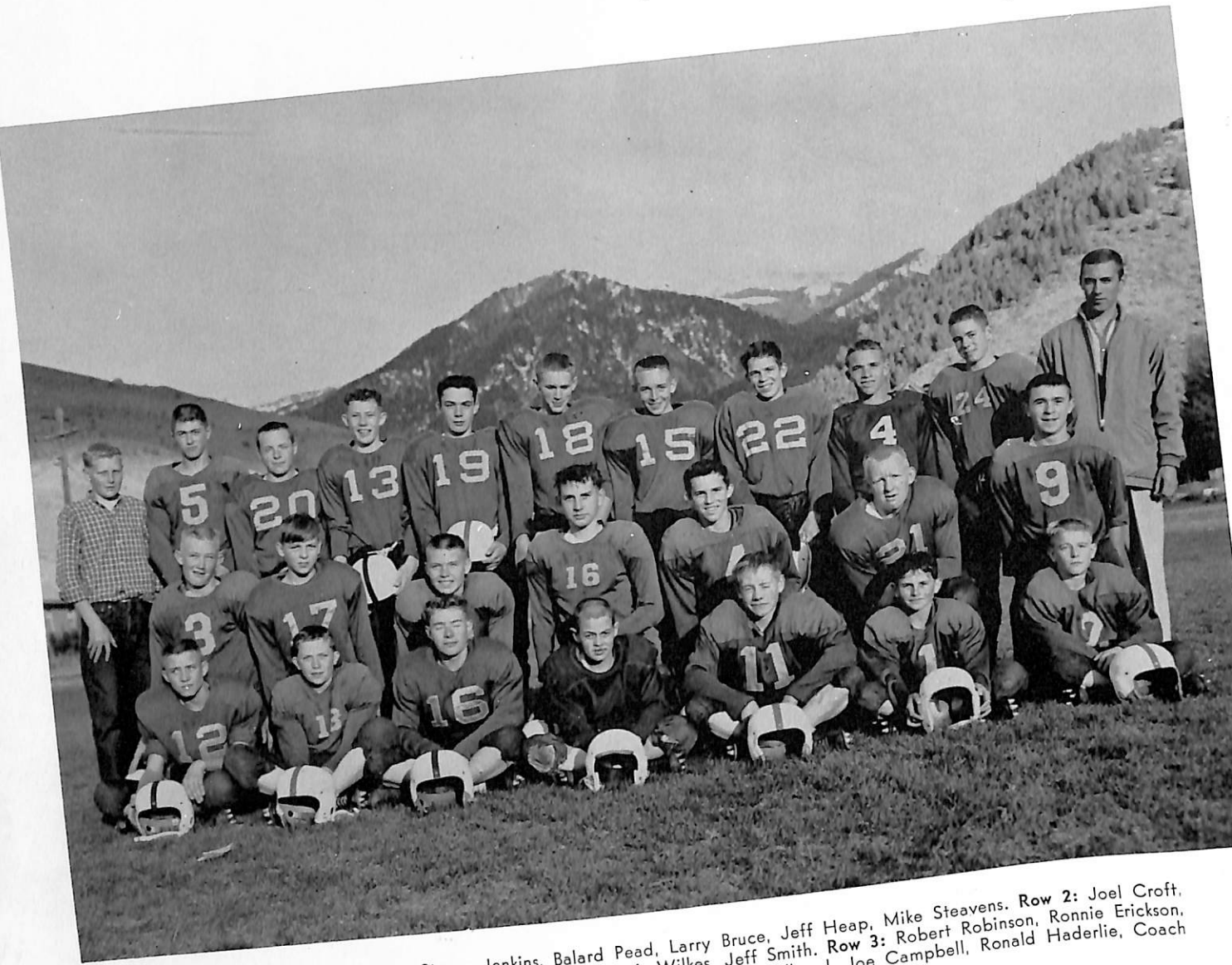

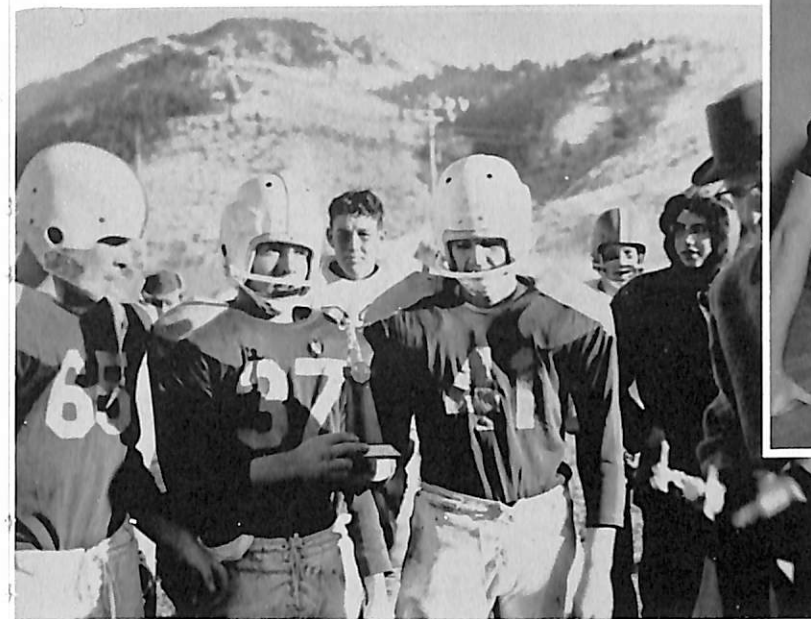

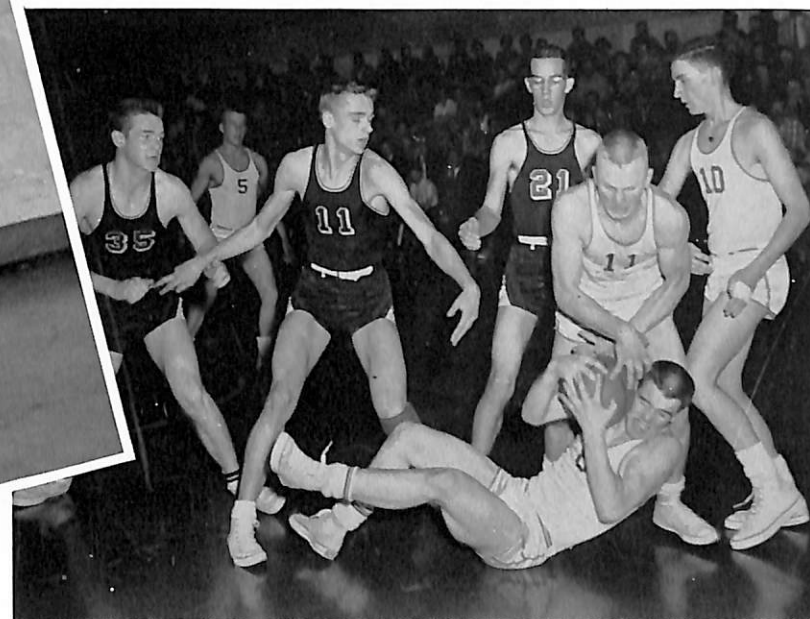

The tension increases as Mack goes up for a lay-up to raise Star Valley's score another 2 points during the Jackson-Wilson game.



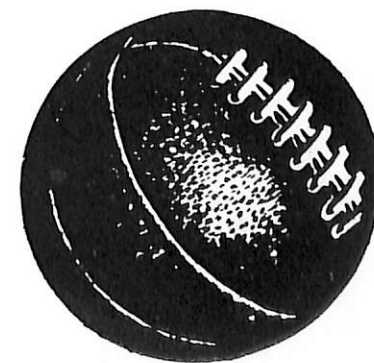
Excited confusion prevailed in the Kemmerer and Star Valley game.

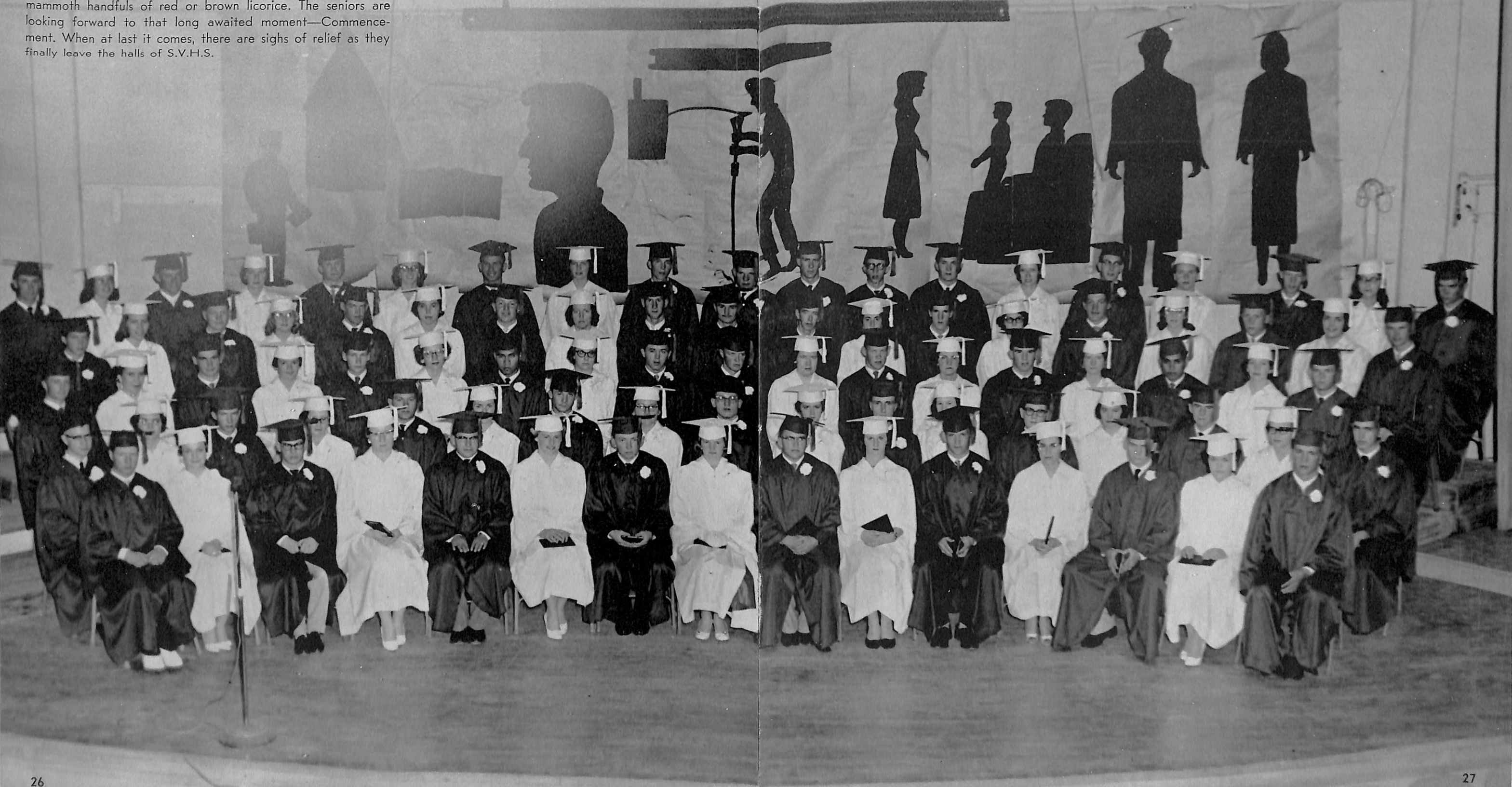

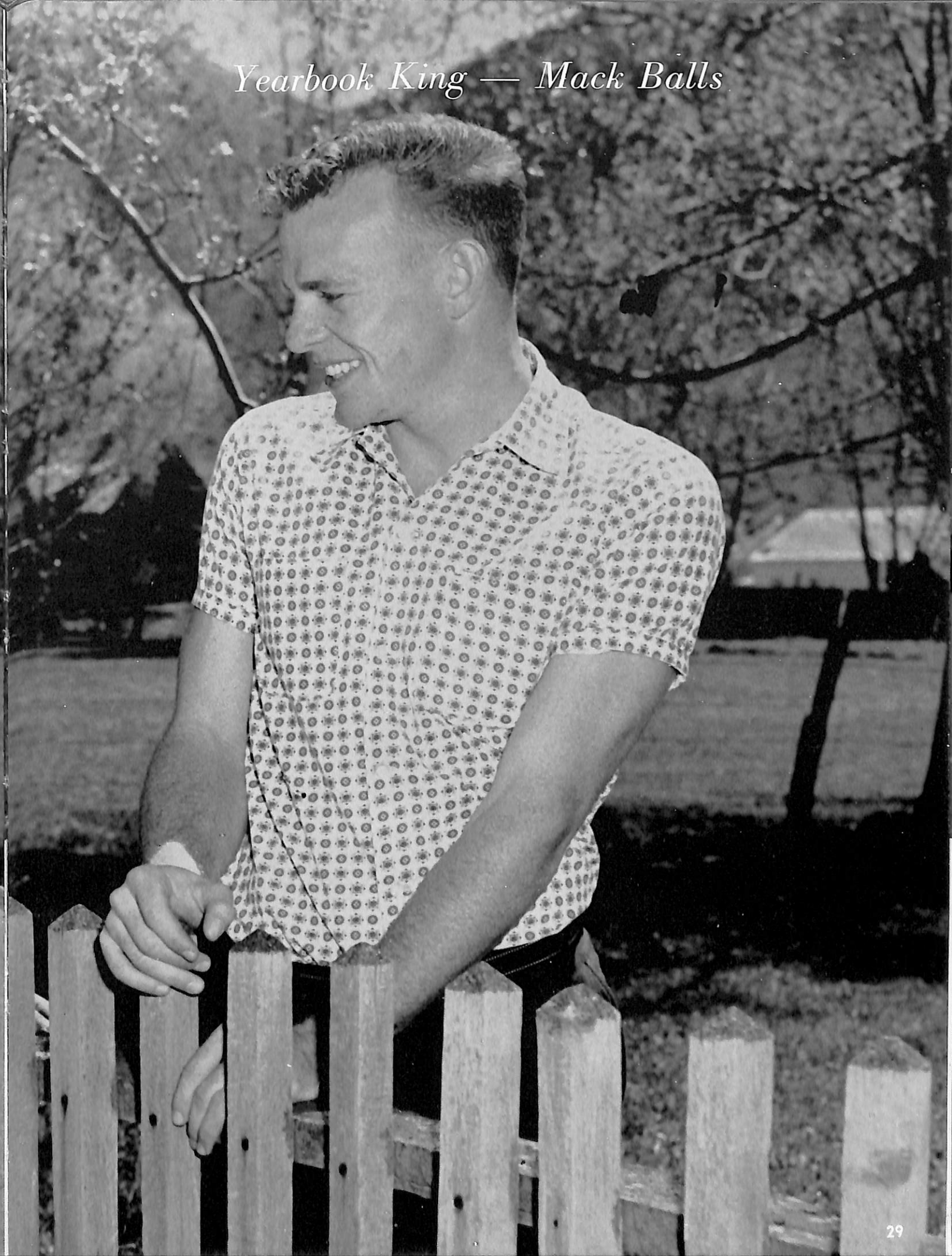

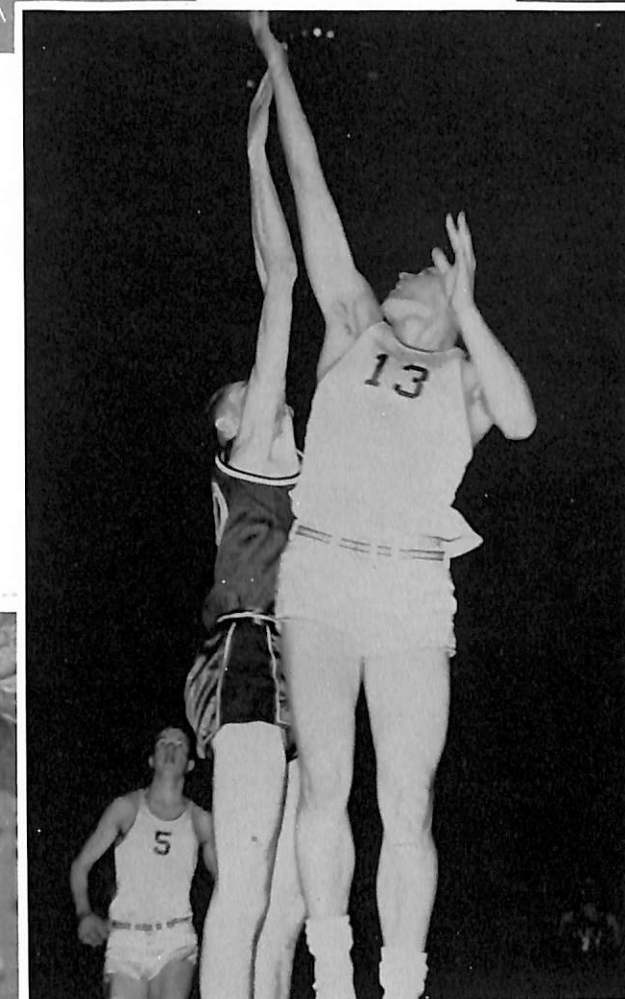

Our Moment to Remember

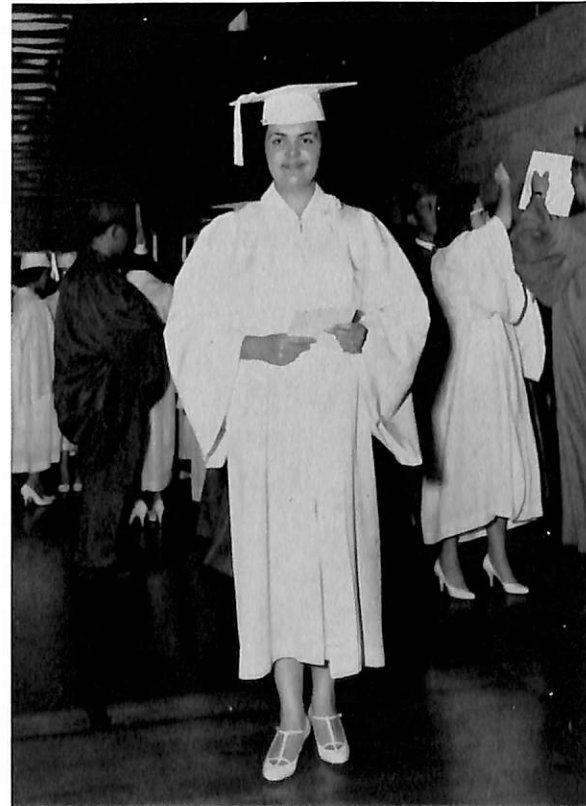
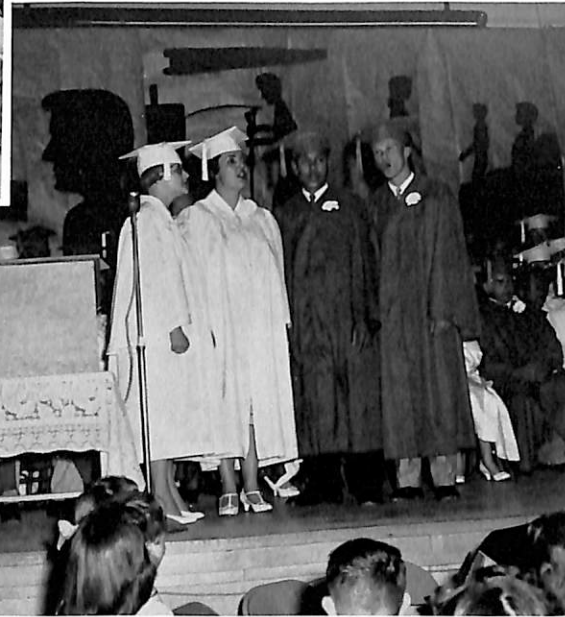


Yes, this is our special moment that we will remember for ever and ever.

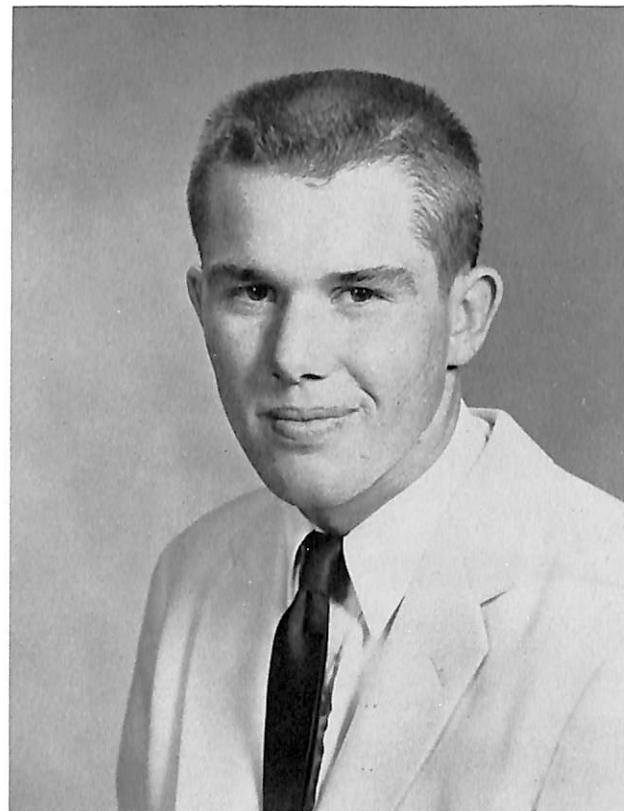

Both jazz and classical music are played equally well by our band. We are all eager to hear the wide variety of numbers our band presents at concerts.

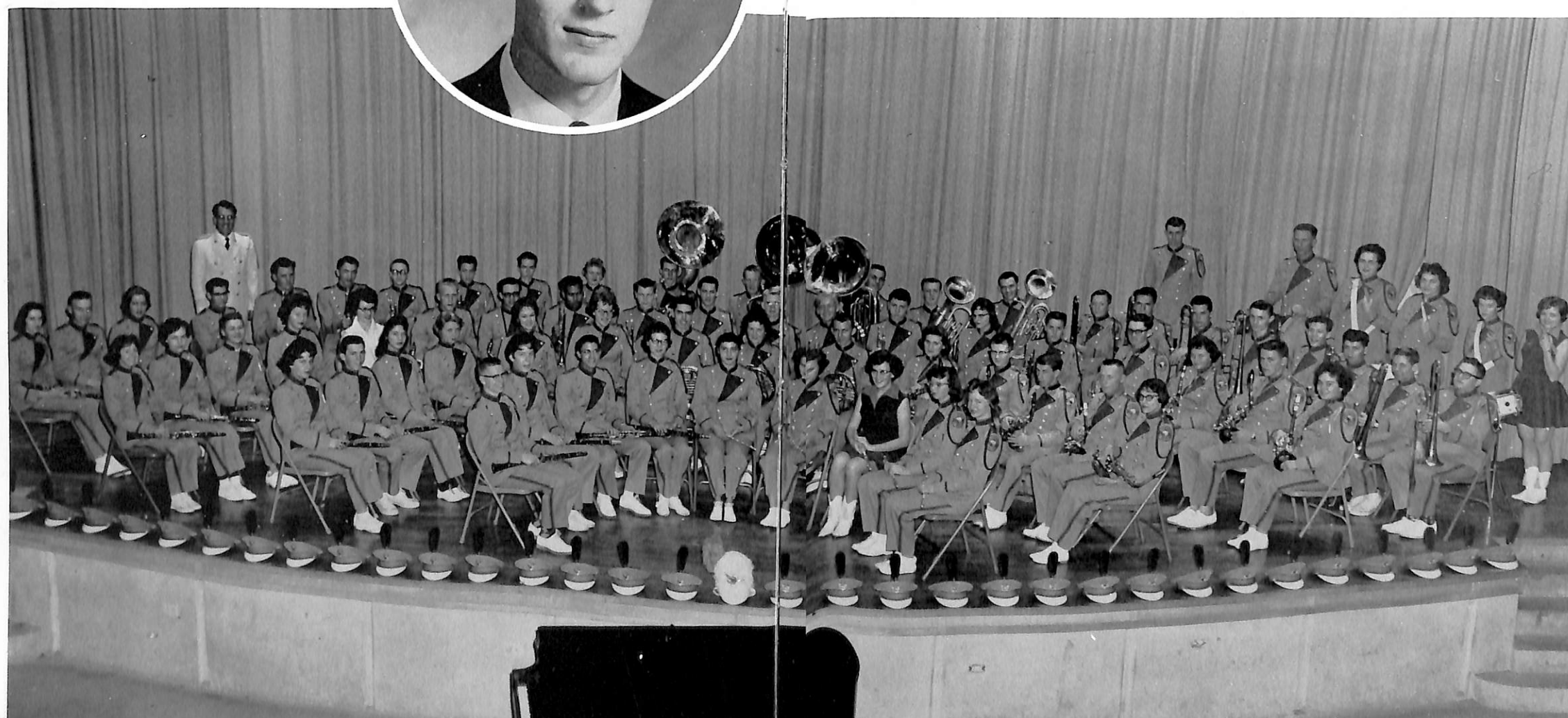
Not only does the band please our student body with concerts but they never fail to come up with original and entertaining halftime shows at our games.

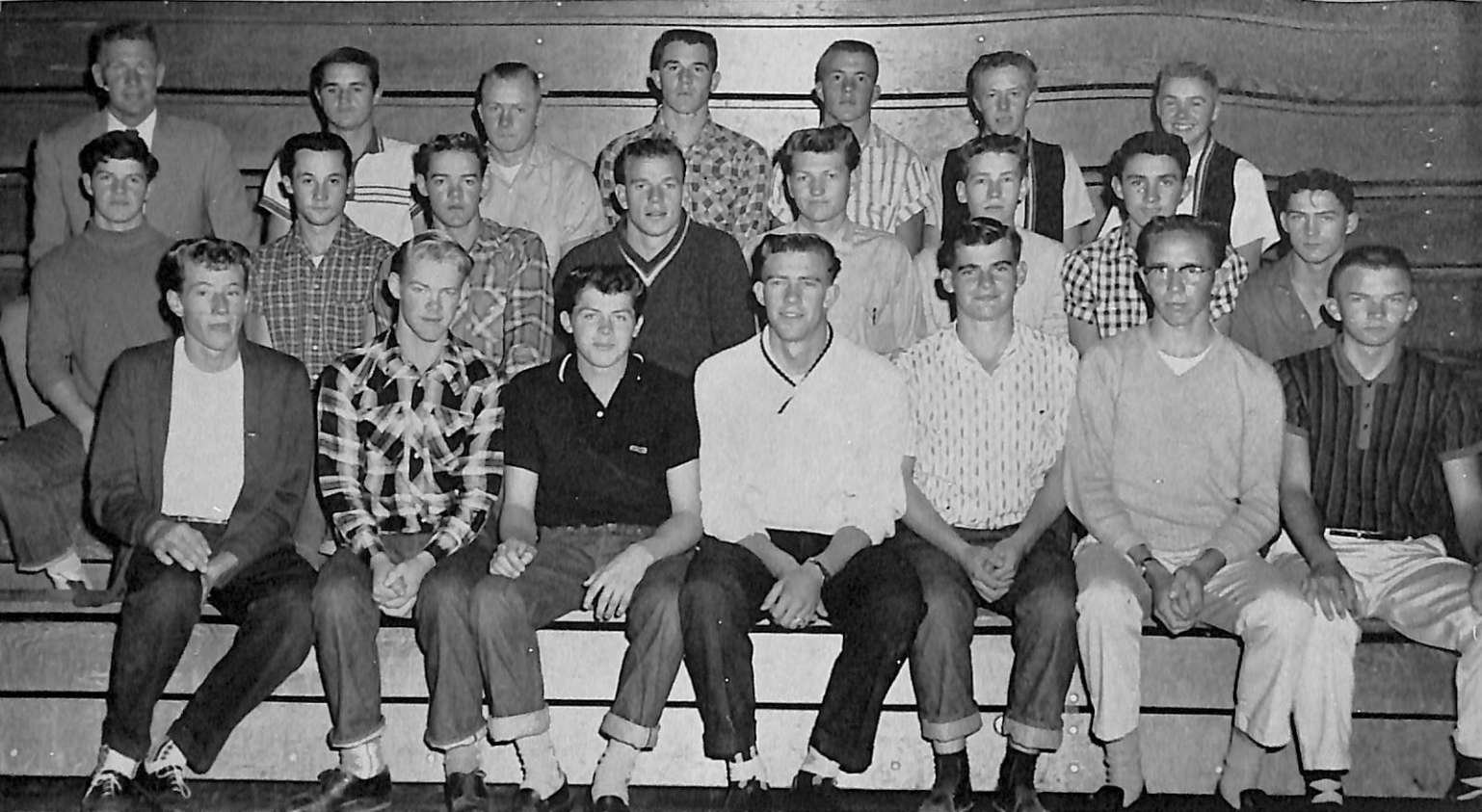
Hi, ho, it's off to work we go to sell yearbook ads to local business establishments. The proceeds from these ads help finance the yearbook.

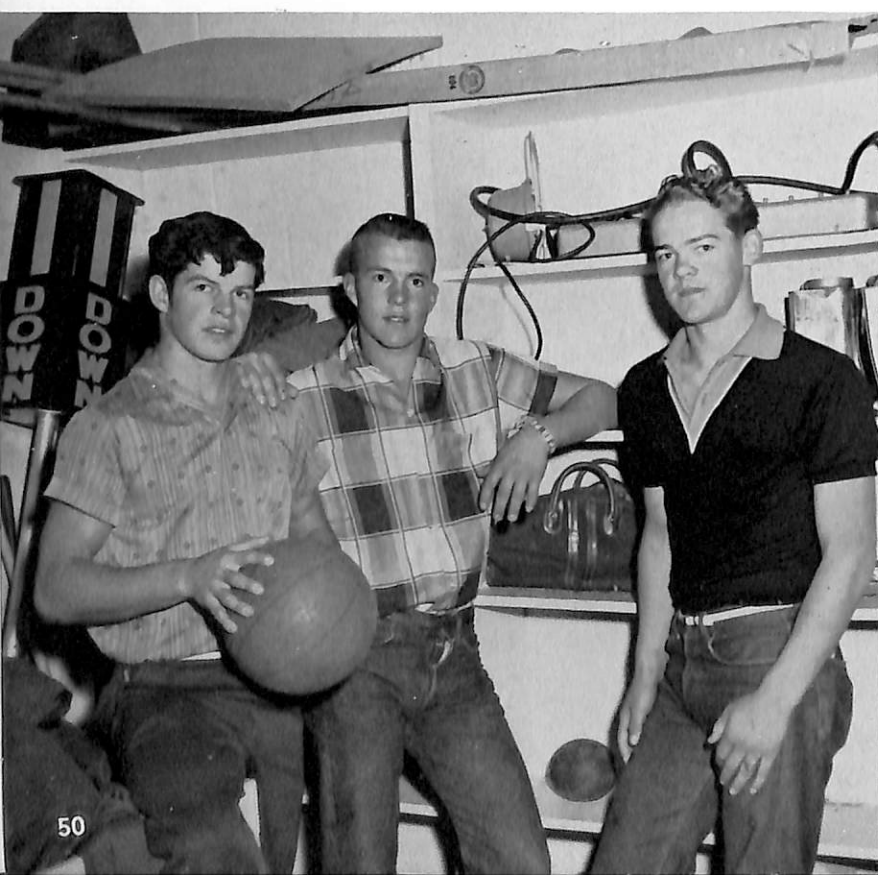

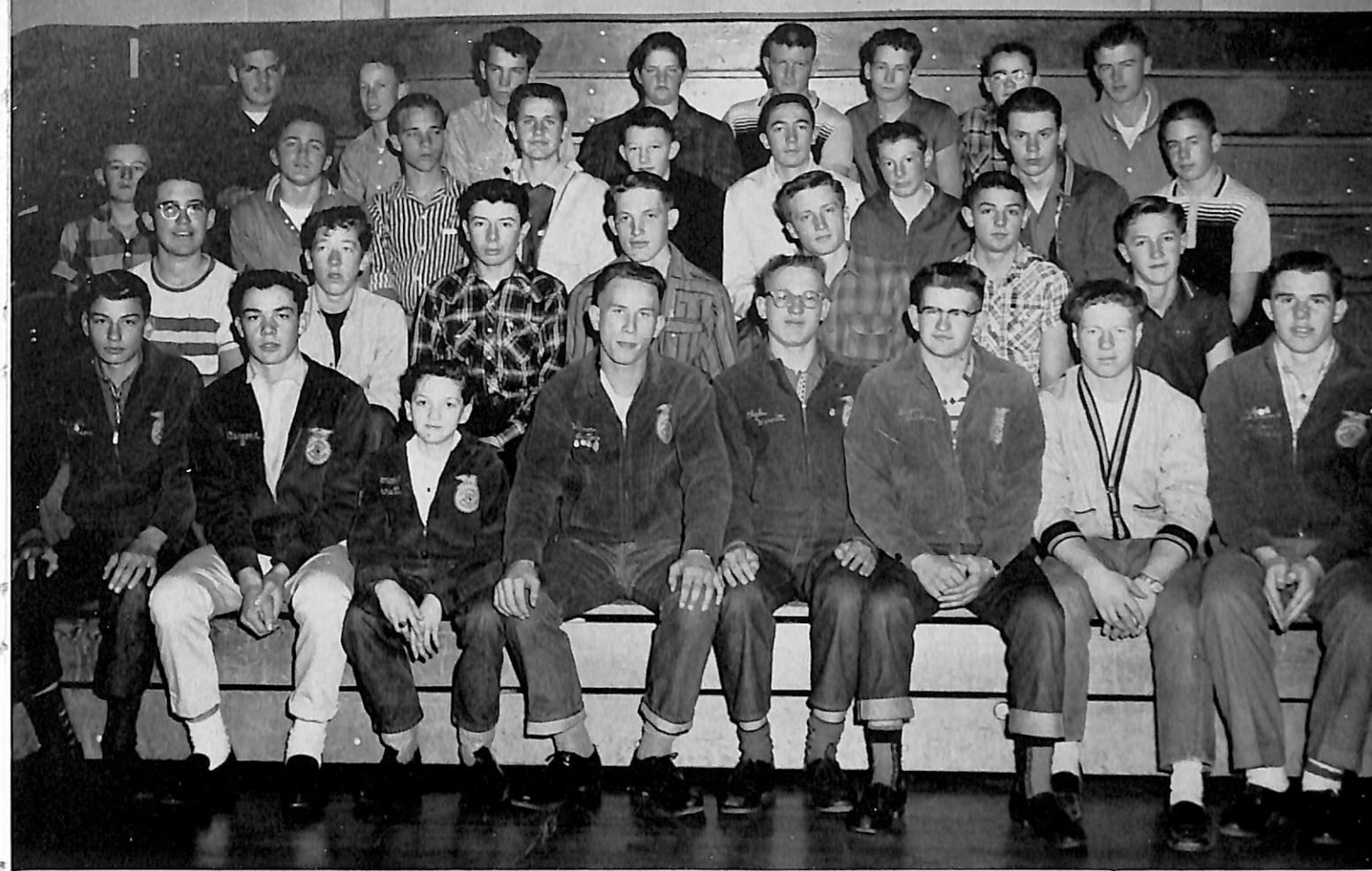

Mrs. Kathleen Burton, (Homemaking I and II), can testify that all things cooked are not always edible. However, the delicious smells coming from her room make our mouths water.

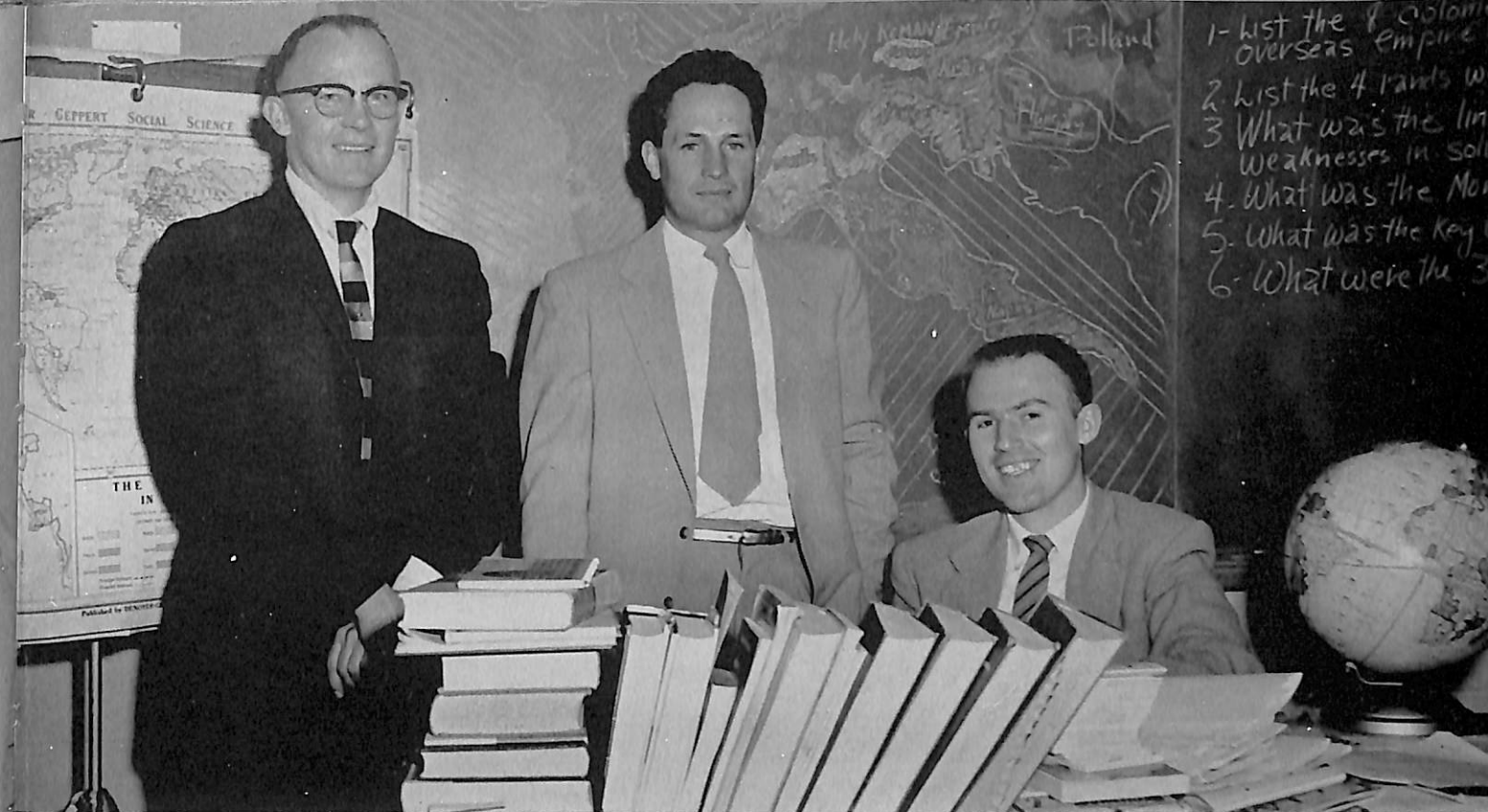

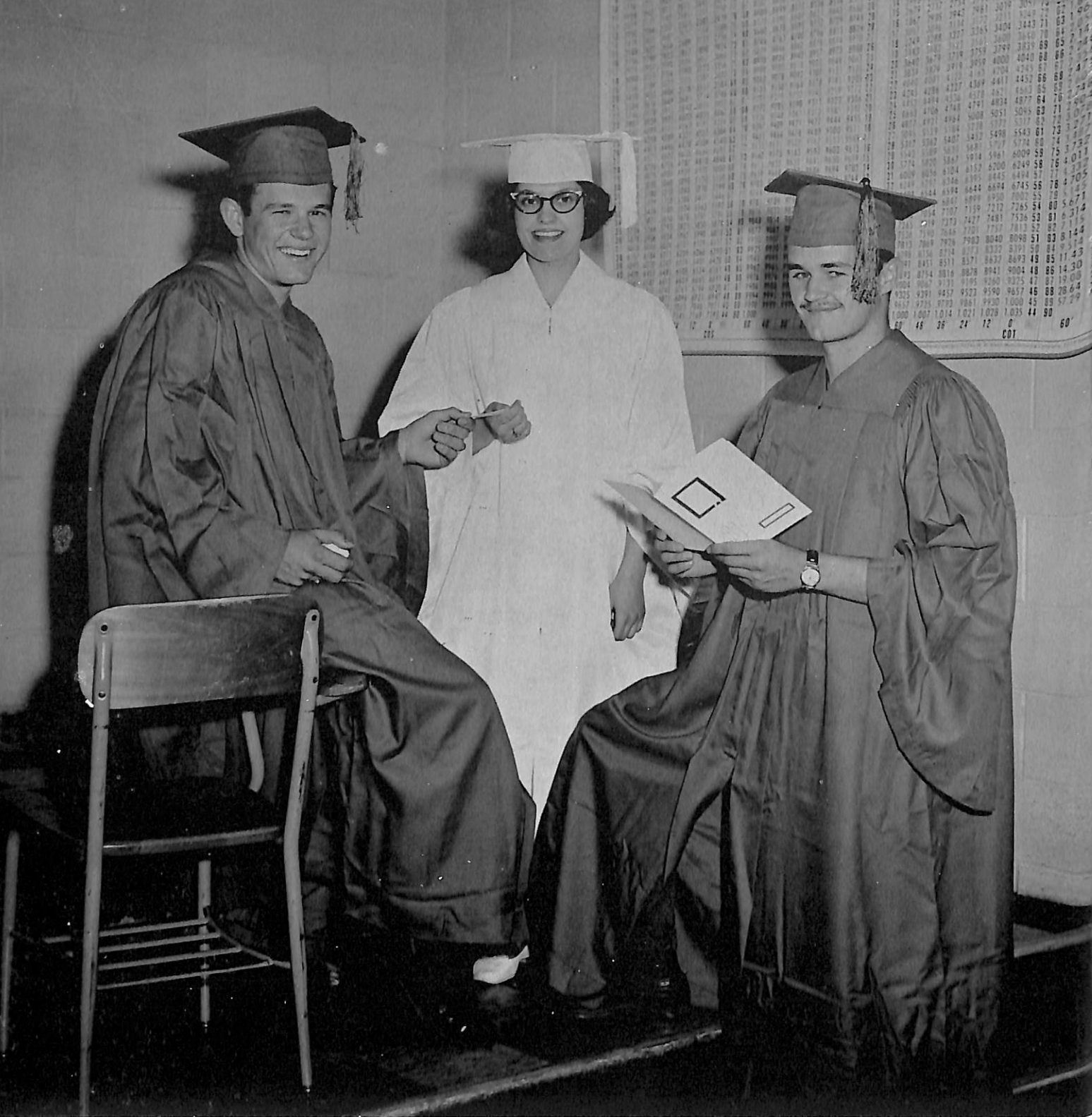

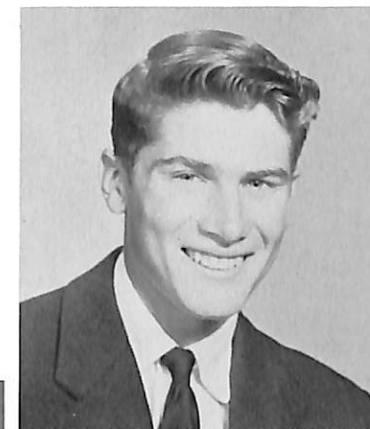
At Homecoming we spent many hours working on our float. Although it didn't receive a prize, we were proud of it. Louise Call was our Junior attendant.
