

# Homecoming Queen


Joan Haderlie











### Boy and Girl Staters






### Our Boys






Mr. Neil J. Tippets, band and chorus director, resigned his position here to take employment elsewhere.





Mrs. Kathleen Burton, (Homemaking I and II), can testify that all things cooked are not always edible. However, the delicious smells coming from her room make our mouths water.


