

Lyle Wagstaff began his teaching career in Cokeville in the fall of 1956. In addition to his duties of English teacher he was advisor for the Sage from 1957 until 1963 when he became advisor for the Yearbook staff. Under his direction, a photography project was begun, and from that time all activity pictures were taken by a student staff. In addition to teaching English, Mr. Wagstaff also taught Latin for several year, and supported all student activities.

Mr. Wagstaff was a graduate of the University of Utah, holding both a bachelor's and master's degrees. He taught for three years at the University of Utah before beginning his teaching career in Cokeville. As a teacher, Mr. Wagstaff's principal interest was the students and their accomplishments and problems. During the past few years, he had developed a special program for juniors and seniors who were not planning on college and who needed a different type of program from what the regular English Curriculum provided.

Because of health problems, his last year of teaching was quite difficult for him, but because of his interest in the students and in teaching, he remained on the job just as long as he could. He entered the hospital on October 16, 1972, and after a month-long battle, passed away on November 15, 1972.

# Pantherettes Get It All Together




The Panther sweeps gave power and zip to the offensive attack. Here the triple option is materializing into what turned out to be a fine gain.

Honorable-mention All-American Briant Teichert starts off-tackle behind the potent Panther blockers.





## Panthers Win Conference Play



# Wrestlers Achieve Higher Levels Of Success


This year's Panther wrestling team was made up of mostly underclassmen. The team is only losing one Senior and they are looking forward to a very successful season next year.

The team posted a record of 6 wins and 4 losses. Out of the past several seasons this has been the wrestlers only winning season as a team. Four Panther wrestlers qualified at the Regional meet in Saratogo to go to the state meet in Casper. Elbert Harmon, by placing 4th at the state wrestling tournament, was the first Cokeville wrestler to place at the state meet since the start of the regional tournaments.

Wayne Larson, top at right, wrestled J.V. in the 95 lb. class. Wayne, a Junior, posted a 5-5-0 record and scored 30 points.

Jeff Thornock, middle at right, a Freshman, wrestled J.V. at 119. His record was 3-2-0. Jeff scored a total of 16 points. Jeff came on strong towards the end of the year and was able to wrestle three varsity matches.

Cody Feuz, bottom right, a Freshman, moved to Cokeville during the wrestling season. Cody wrestled J.V. in the 95 lb. classification. His record was 3-1-0. Cody scored 18 points.

Freshman Dennis Larson wrestled varsity at 95. His record was 11-6-0. Dennis scored 51 points. Dennis will be of value to the team in years to come.





Freshman Chuck Mackey wrestled varsity at 145. His record was 6-10-0. Chuck scored 36 points.



# Panthers Excel In Track And Field




## Football Players Attain Honors

The Junior's advisor, Mr. Lyle Forrest, was very helpful and fun throughout the year.


