















### Home Ec. class makes field trip to Salt Lake


# TRACK TEAM PLACES FIRST AT DISTRICT



#### Seniors actually sneak







In February they had a Sadie Hawkins Dance and fed two meals to the wrestlers that participated in the Cokeville Invitational Wrestling meet.


