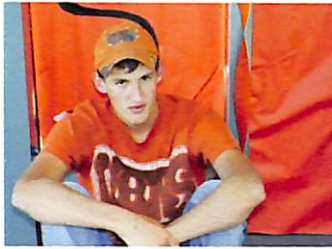

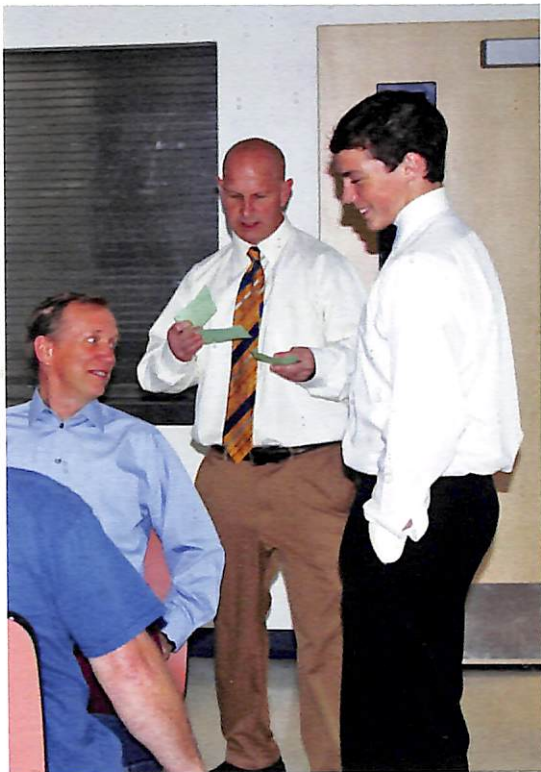

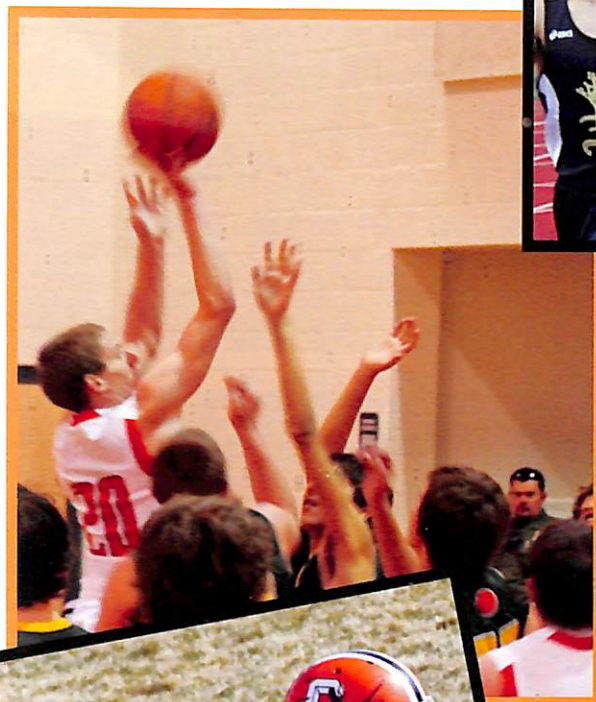

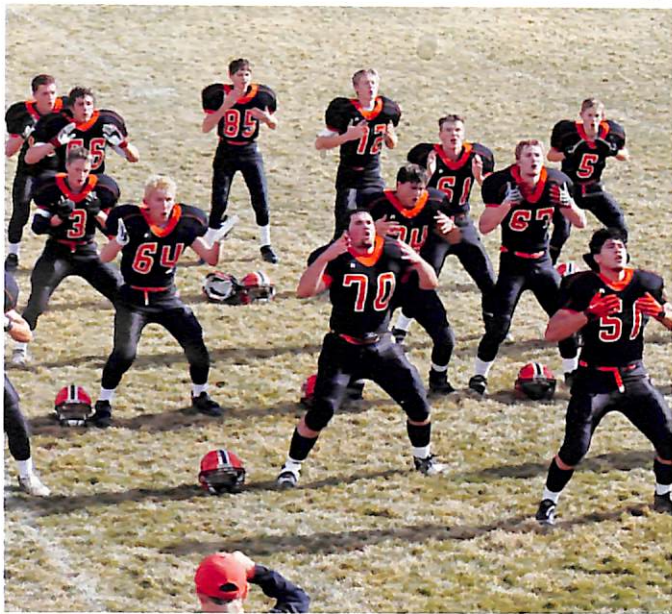

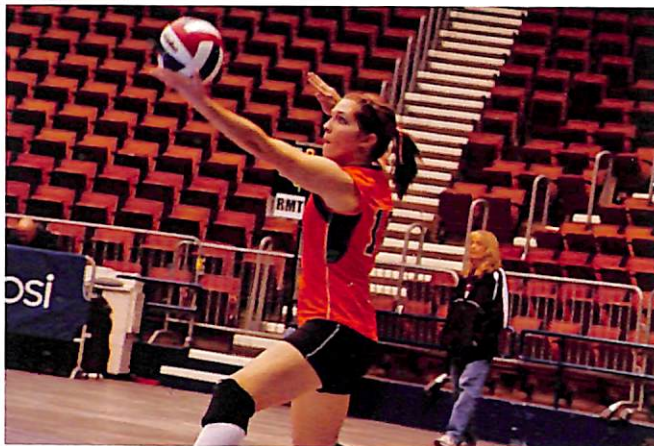

The girls had a well dominating season with a most impressive winning record having wins over Bear Lake and Rich County, they ended the season as runner-up state champions.



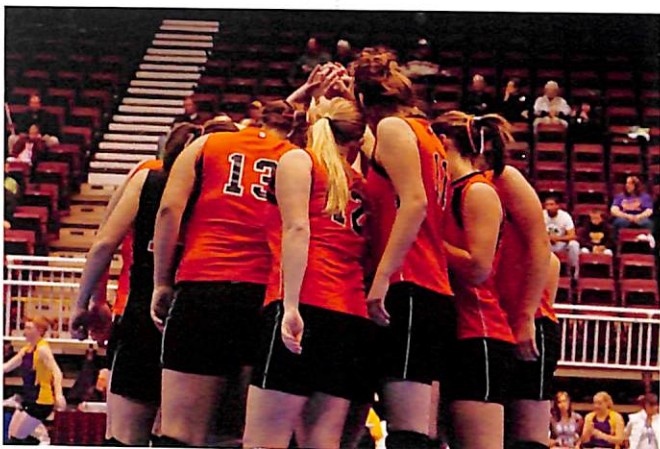

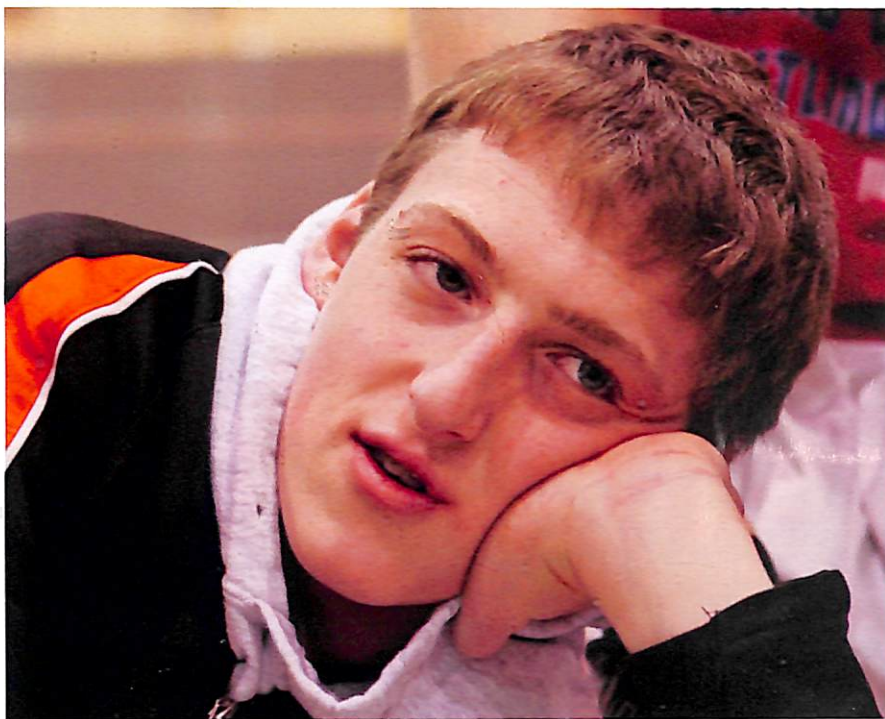

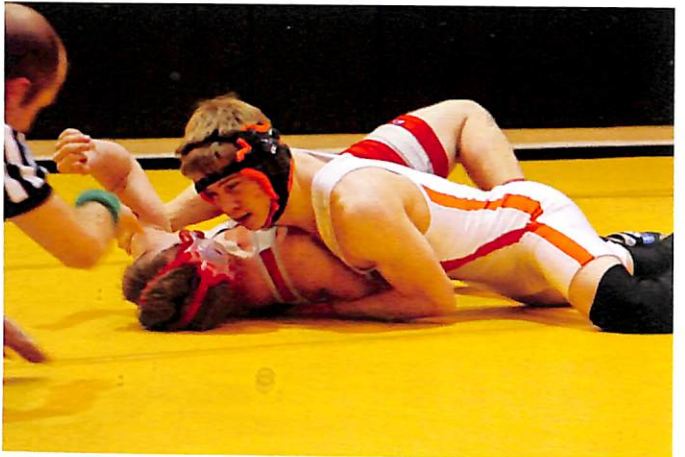

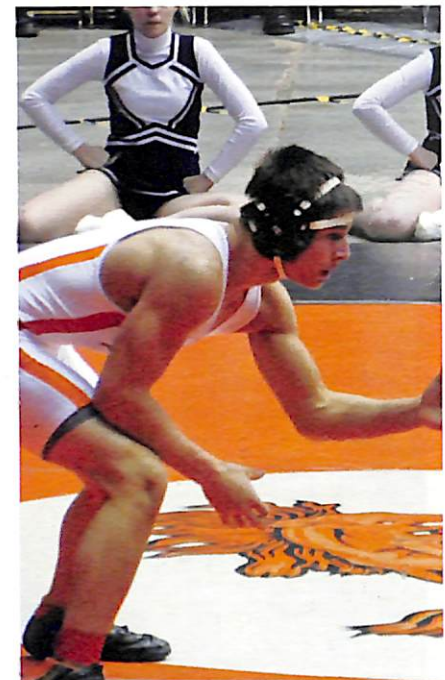

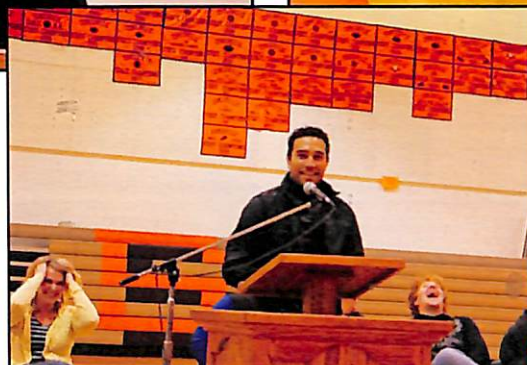

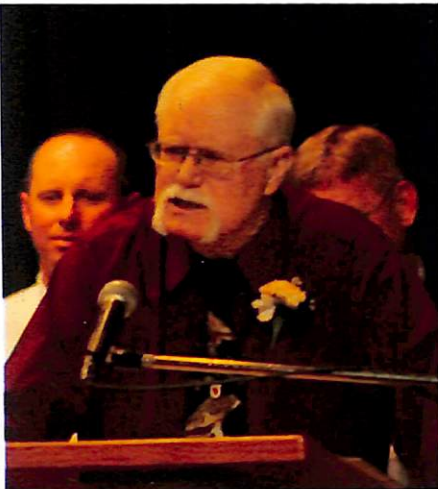

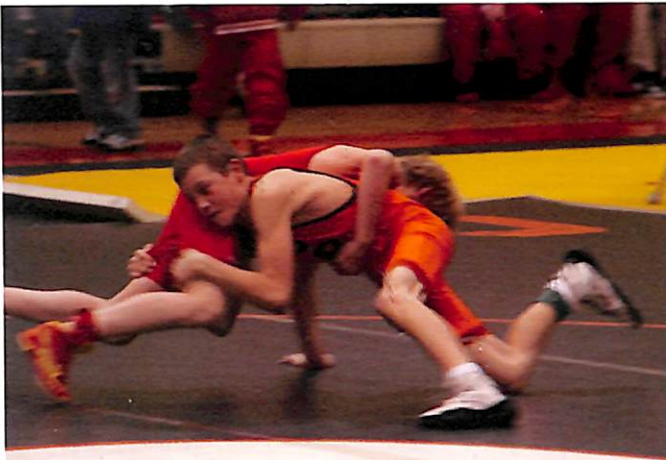

ENGULFED IN OIL

An oil rig in the Gulf of Mexico exploded, causing the largest oil spill in U.S. history. Nearly 200 million gallons of oil gushed into the Gulf for almost 3 months before a cement cap placed over the well stopped the leak. Over 600 miles of shoreline and more than 44,000 square miles of the Gulf were impacted including nature preserves and animal habitats.

SWISS MARVEL

After 14 years of construction and a \$10 billion price tag, the world's longest rail tunnel was completed in the Swiss Alps. At 35.4 miles long, the record-breaking Gotthard Base rail tunnel will reduce passenger travel time and protect the Alps from erosion caused by roadway freight traffic.



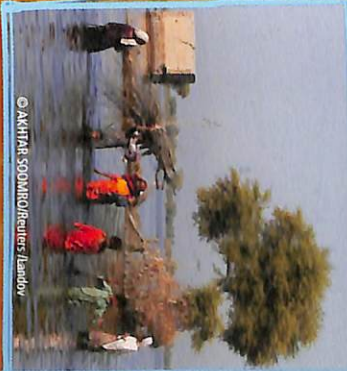

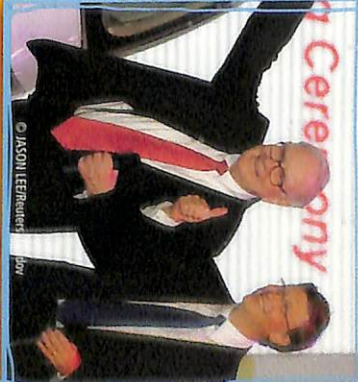

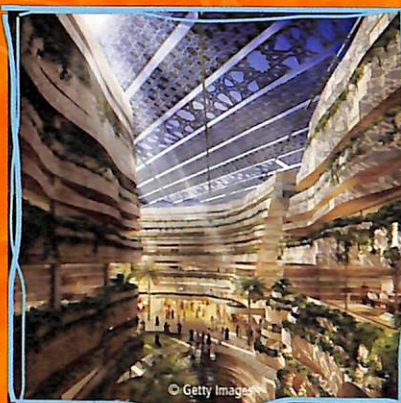
BIG WHOOP

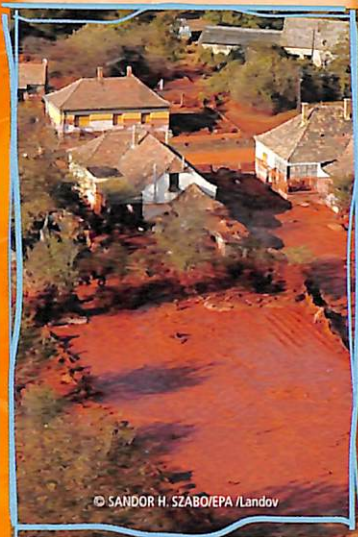


REFORM SPARKS FURY

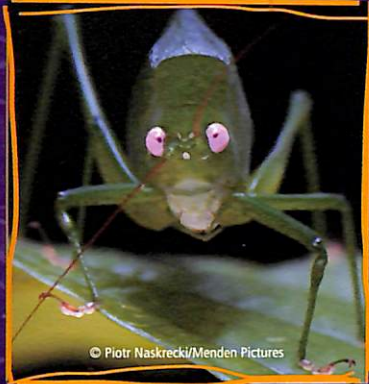

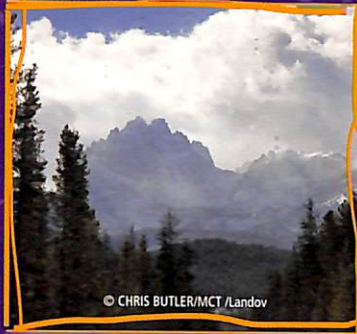

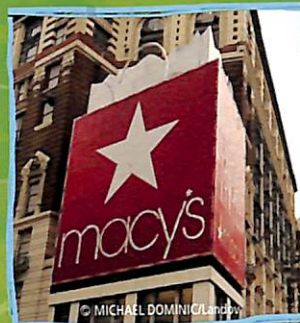
GAGGLE OF GOOGLE

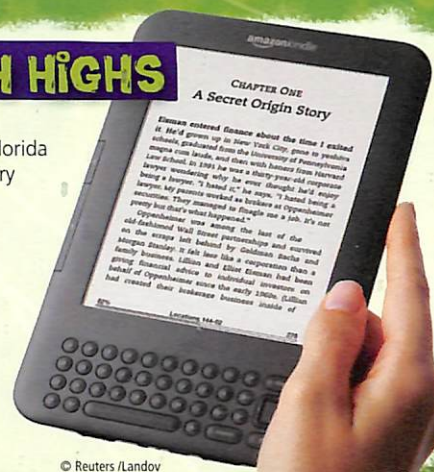


SUPER SPENDER

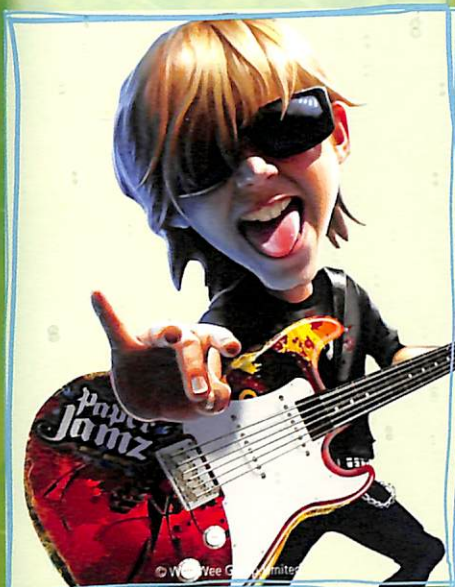

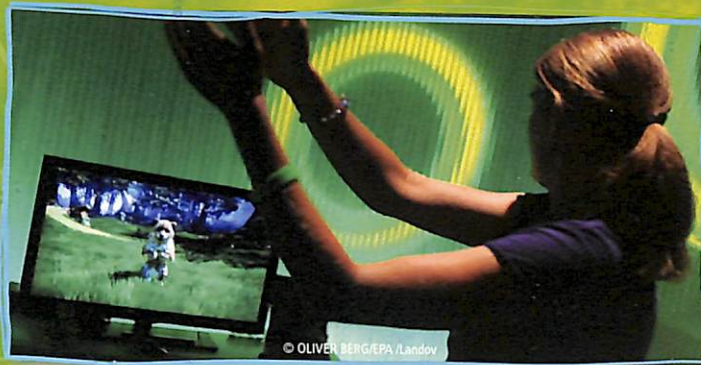
TECHY TOYLAND

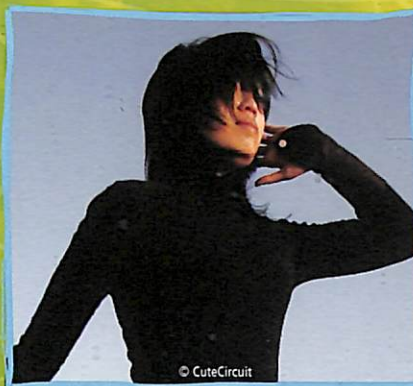
iPAD TOPS WISH LISTS

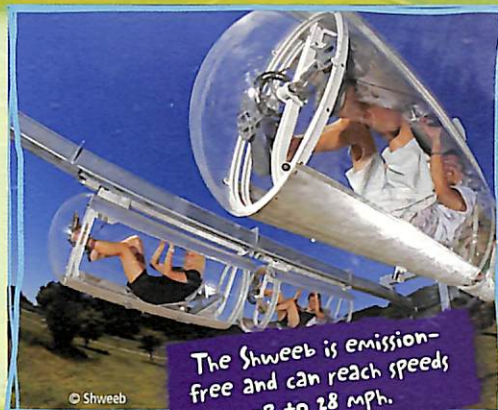

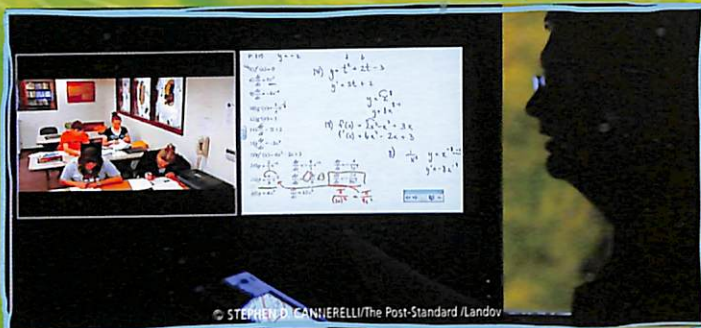

The Shweeb is emission-free and can reach speeds up to 28 mph.

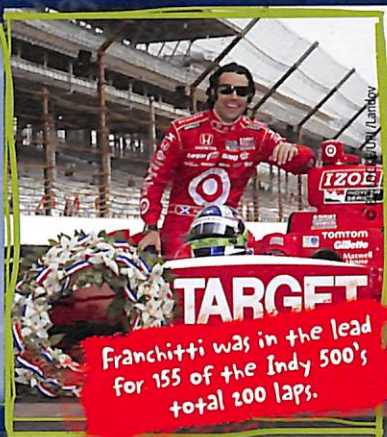


VIDEO CHIT CHAT

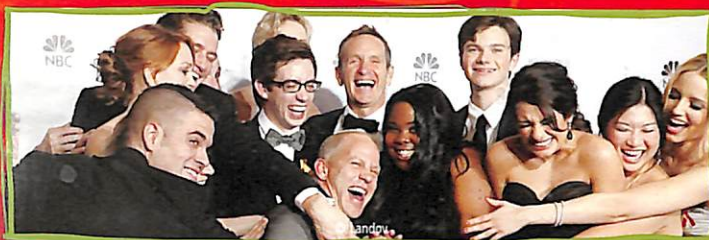
OSCAR SPOTLIGHT

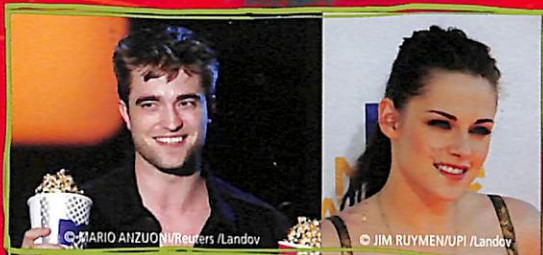

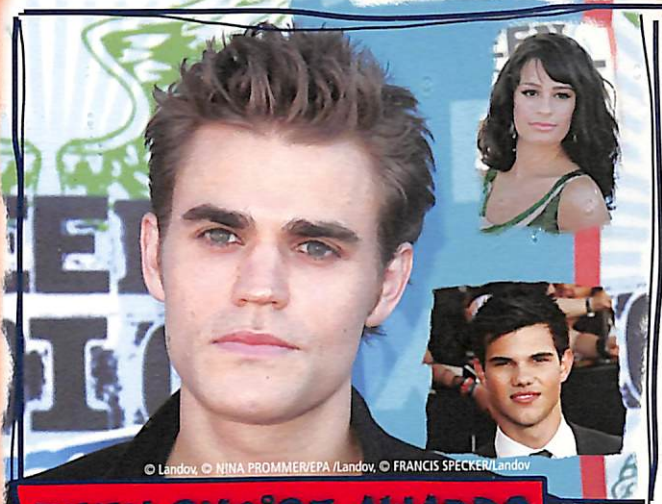


CELEBRATING NOW & THEN

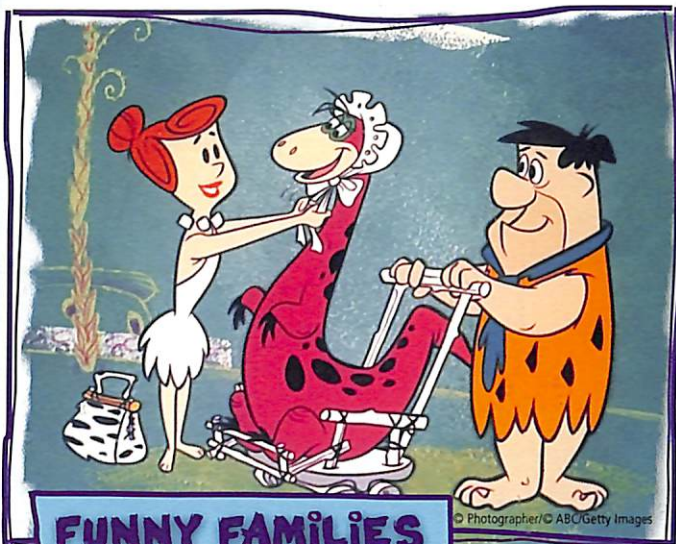
LATÍN GRAMMYS

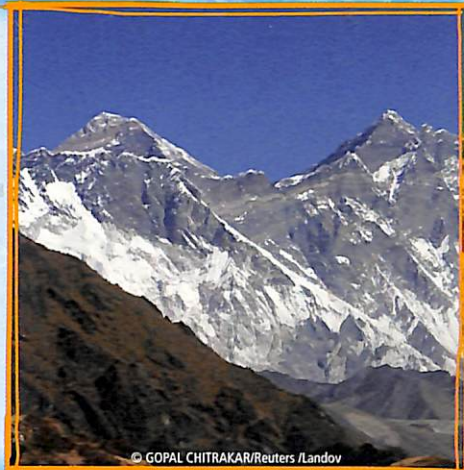
FUNNY FAMILIES

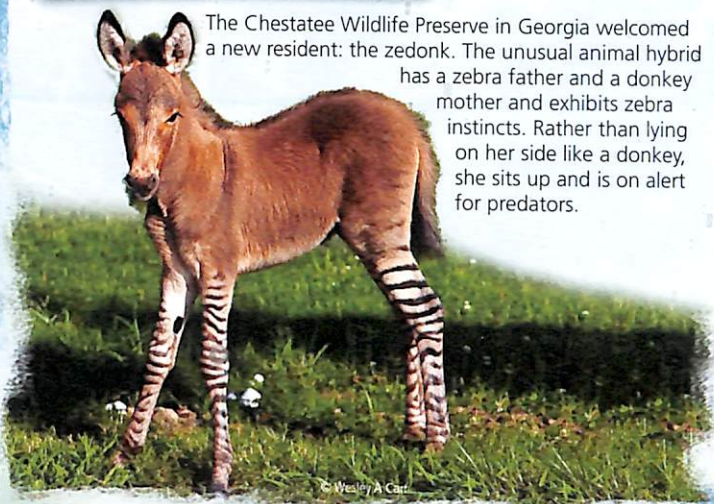

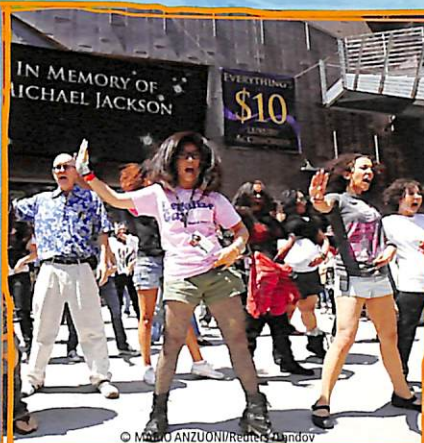

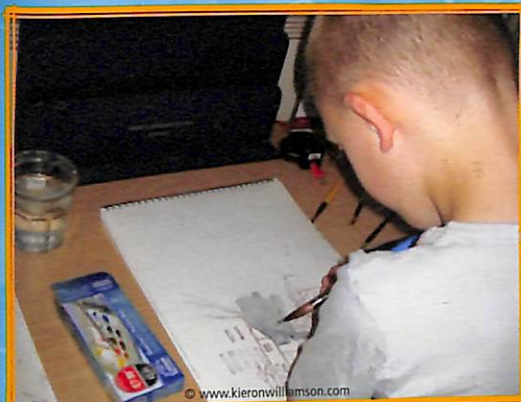
