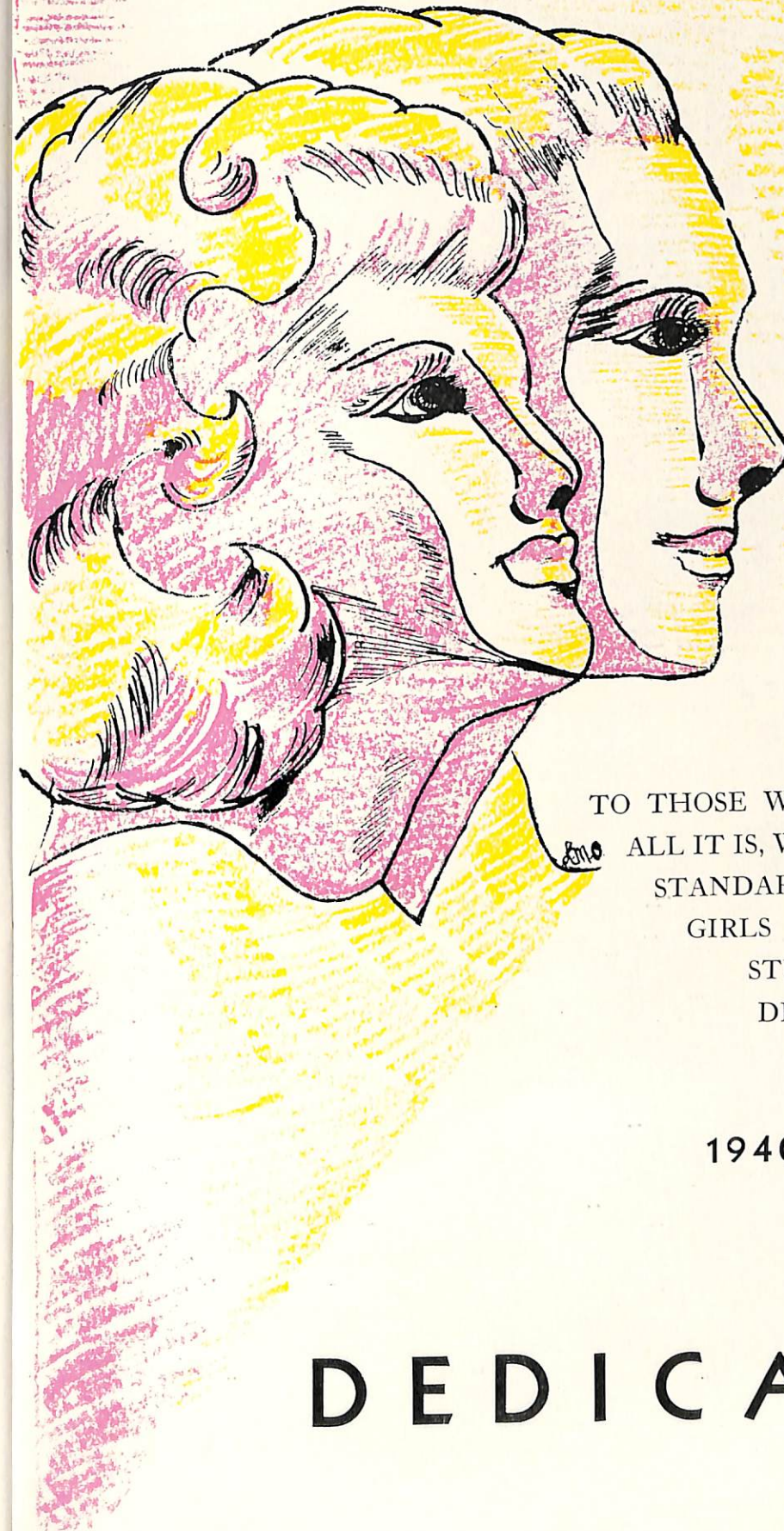


CODE OF ETHICS

12. Be honest.

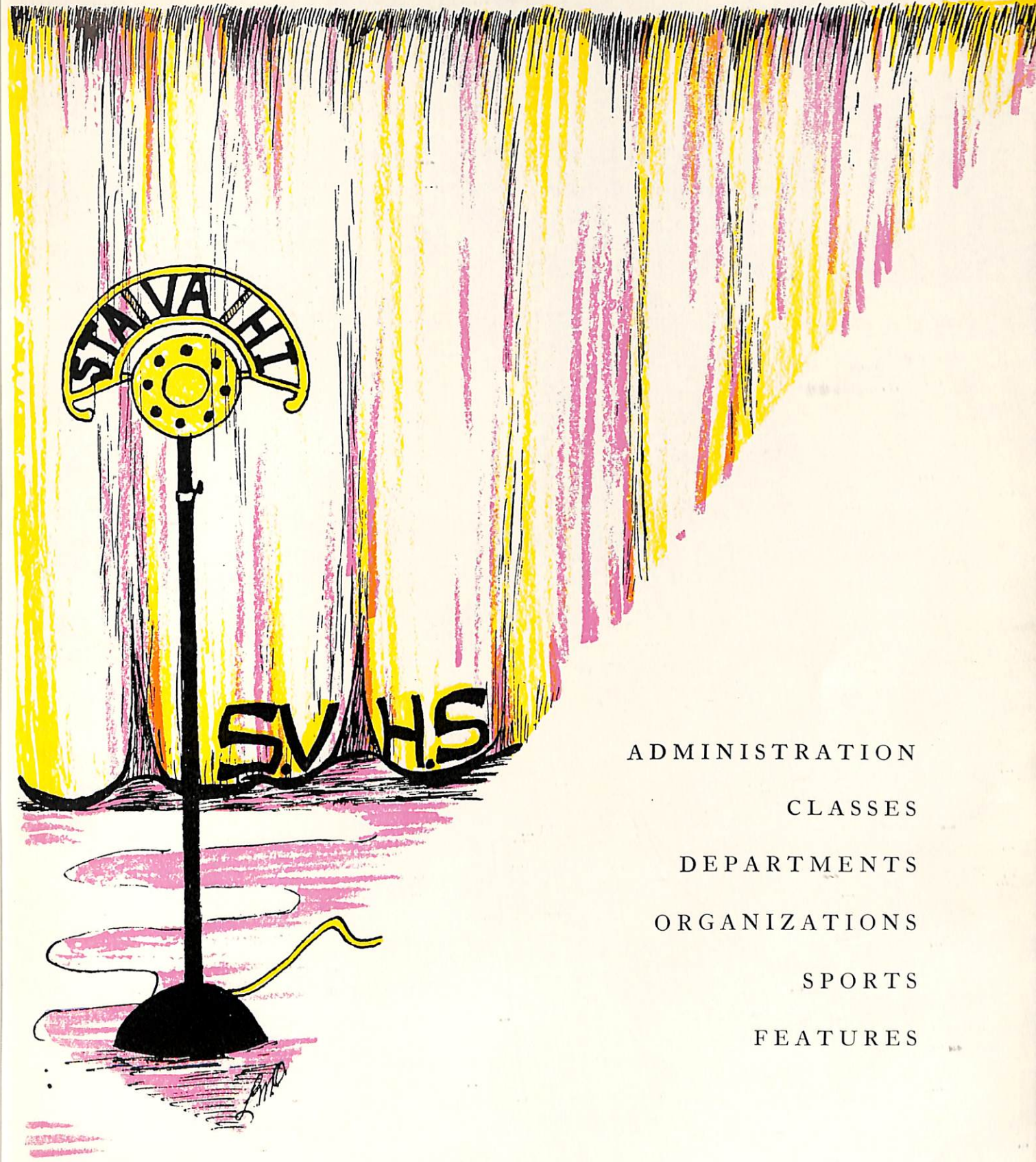

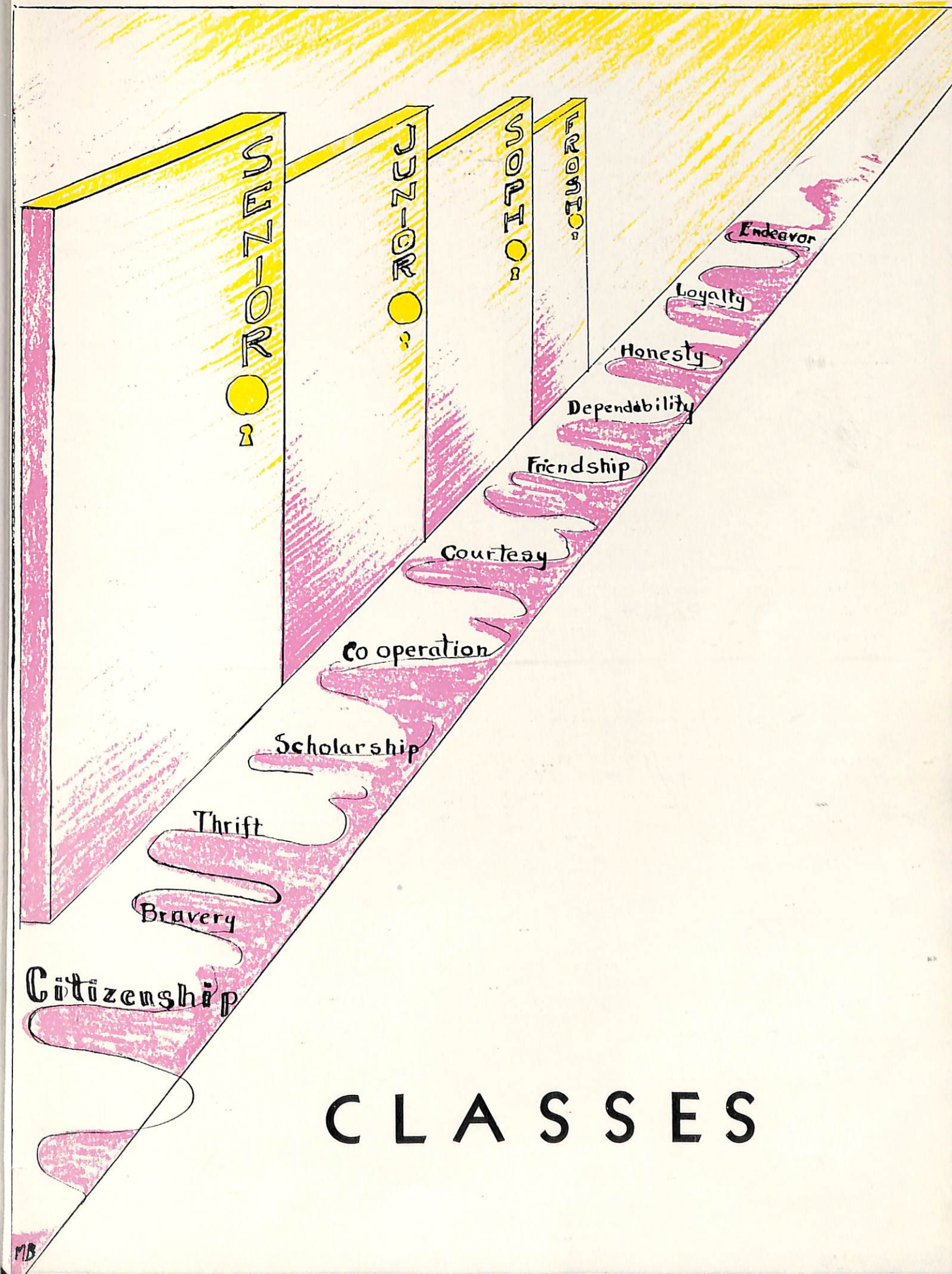
STUDENT COUNCIL
