



Decorating the Christmas Tree is one of the highlights of the Student Council year. This is done every year to promote Christmas spirit in the halls of S.V.H.S.






The yearbook staff sponsored several dances, sold pens and ads in order to make money. They worked hard to make this book a success and to make it something "We'll Always Remember."




The Future Homemakers of America are displaying the metal letters that are to be placed on the front of the High School Building. It is under the direction of Kathleen Burton, the adviser.


