


This year we were very fortunate to have the beautiful Miss Betty Wirthlin as our Majorette.

## Alpha Eta Mu





Our goal is to become State Farmers.









Our 1958 basketball team showed their strength by winning the district championship. Seven members of their strong squad, including the five starters, graduated at the end of the 1958 season. Even our most ardent boosters predicted a winless 1959 season.

In our first game of the season we were pleasantly surprised when our team beat Montpelier 56 to 29. What we lacked in height and experience we made up in speed and fight. We're certainly proud of our squad. At the end of the regular season's play we were second in the district with a record of seven wins and five losses.

In the district play-off we were upset by a scrapping Kemmerer team but won the consolation to place third in the district.

Mack Balls and Farrel Johns were picked for the all-district team.



A large number of major athletic letters were awarded this year for achievement in basketball or football. Shown above are some of the recipients.








# Honor Students





# Student Council


We are the Student Council, the governing body of the school. We represent the various departments in school. We sponsored many activities this year which include Homecoming activities, shows, and a matinee dance.
