The Green River Wolves made an all-out effort to beat the mighty Braves, but failed. The Braves have been very successful throughout the season.

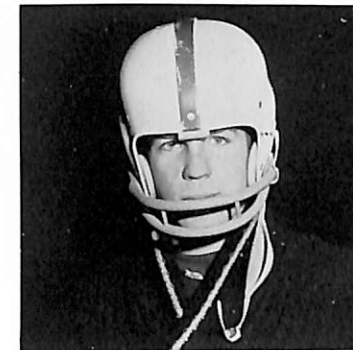

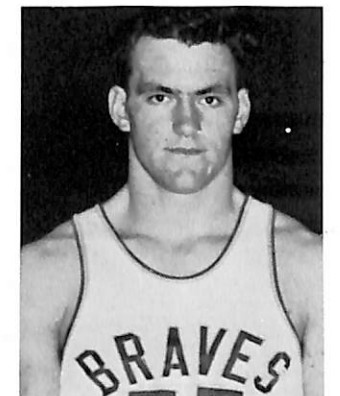
ALL-DISTRICT+ALL-STATE BASKETBALL

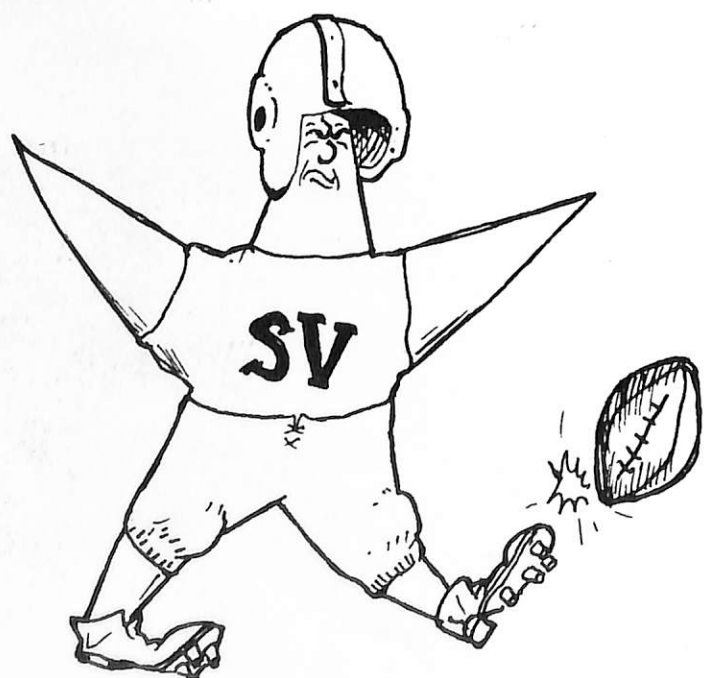

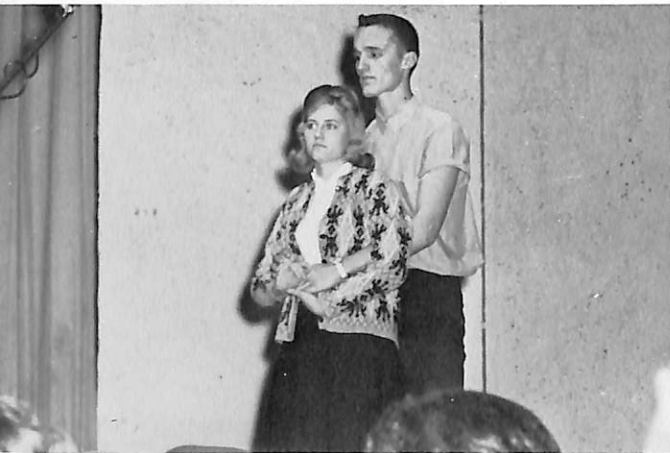




# SWINGIN' AND SINGIN'

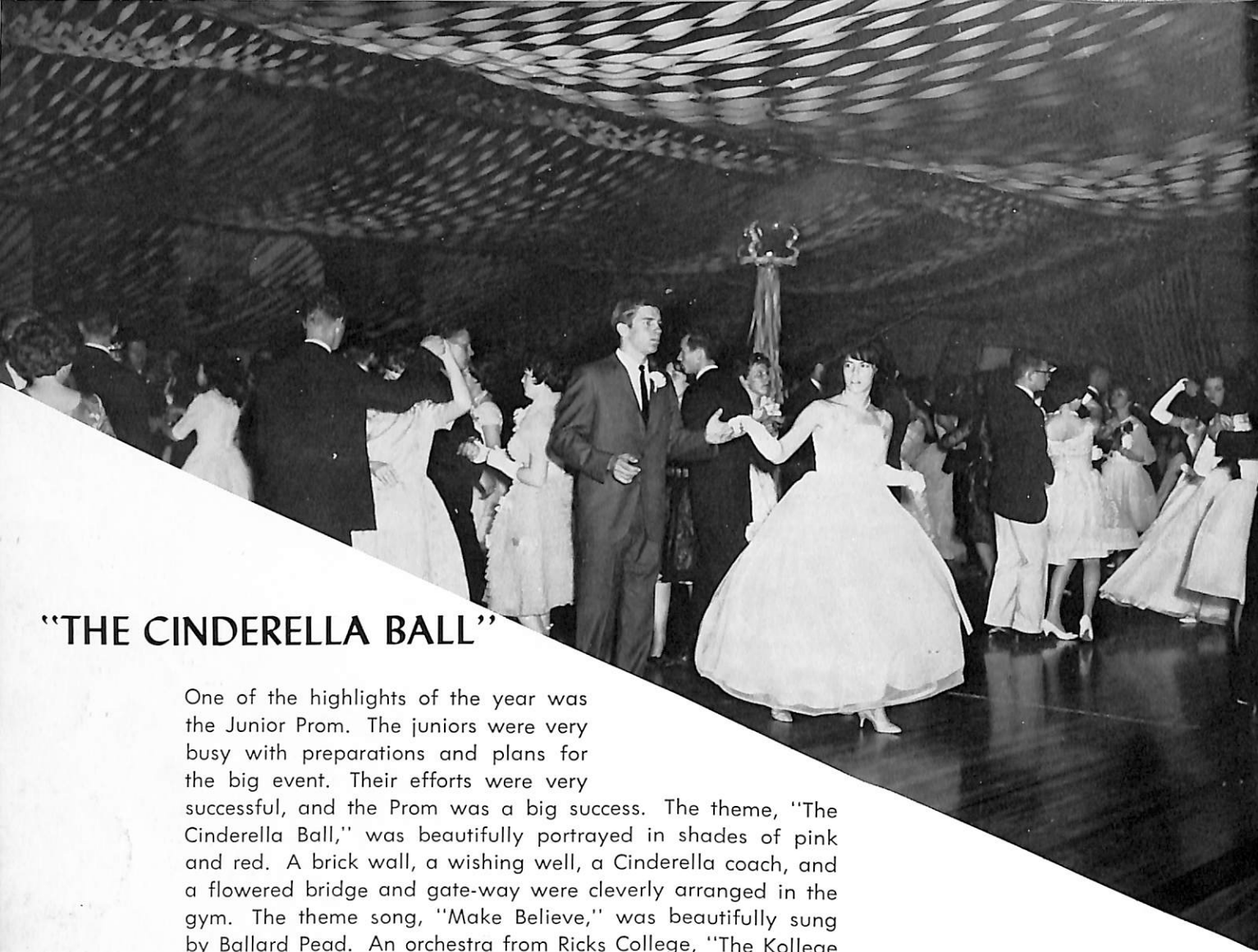

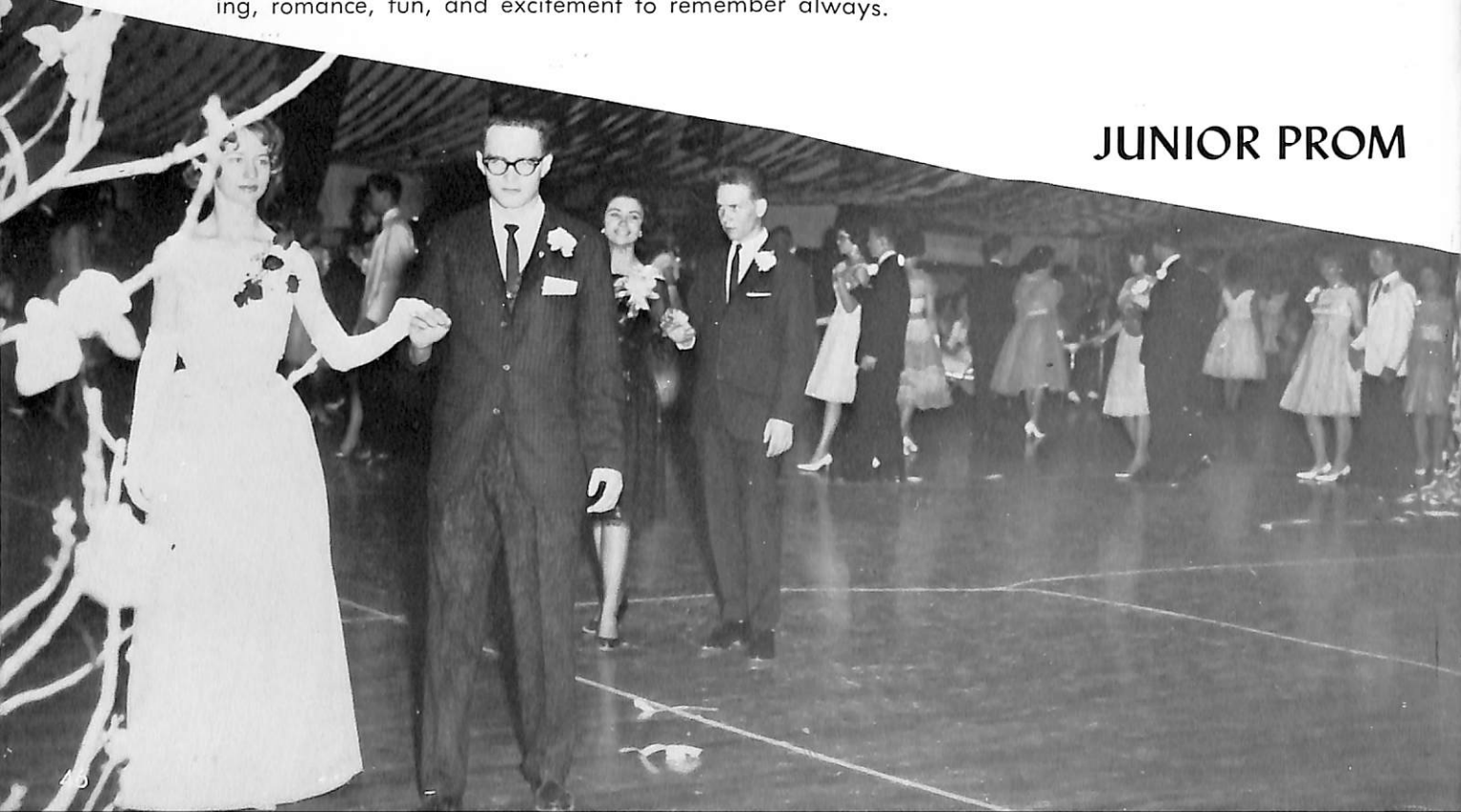




## "THE CINDERELLA BALL"

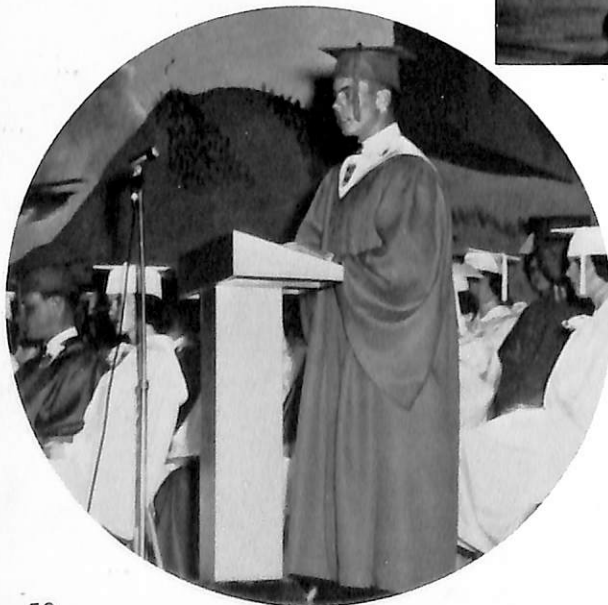

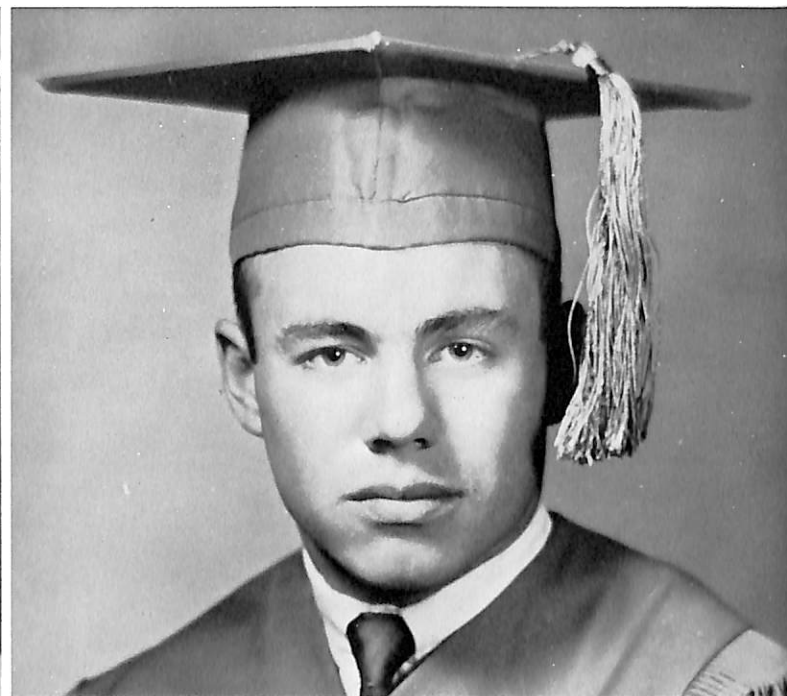
# HONOR STUDENTS

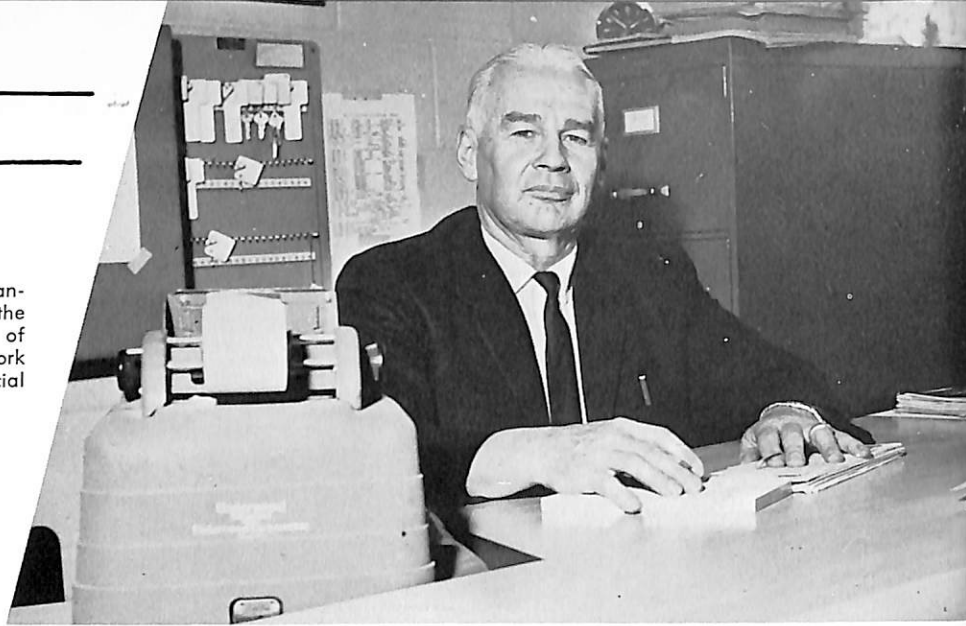
