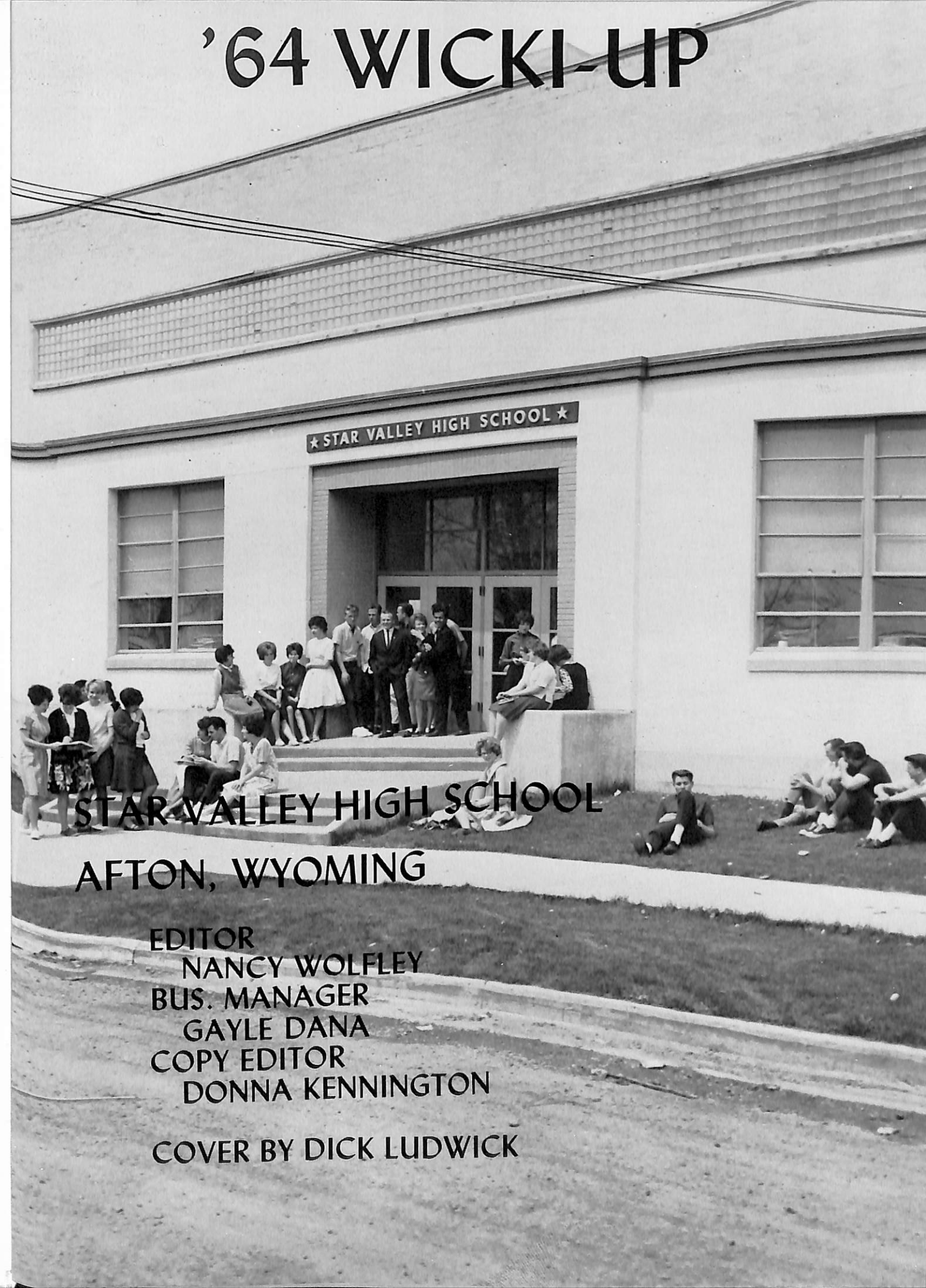

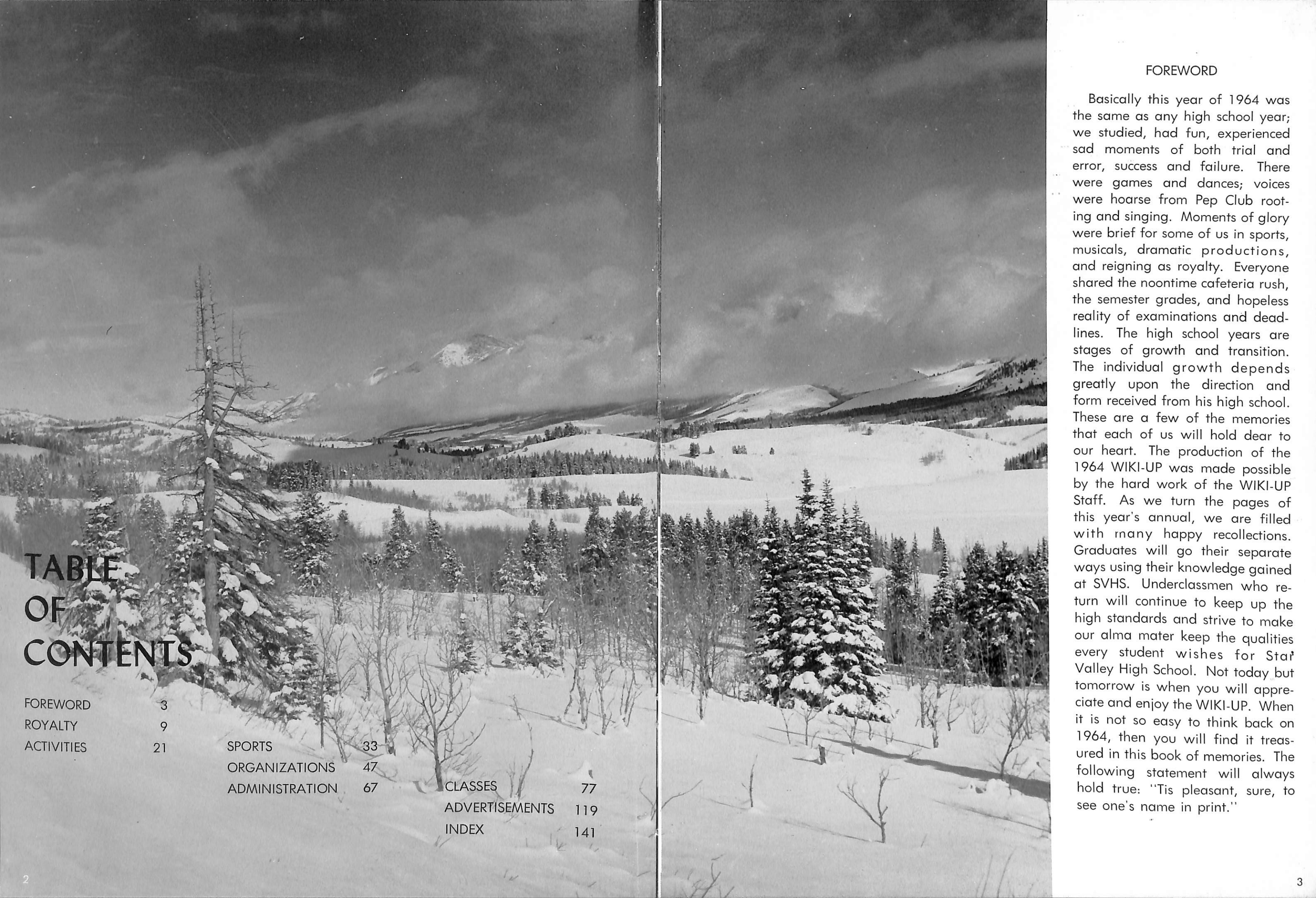


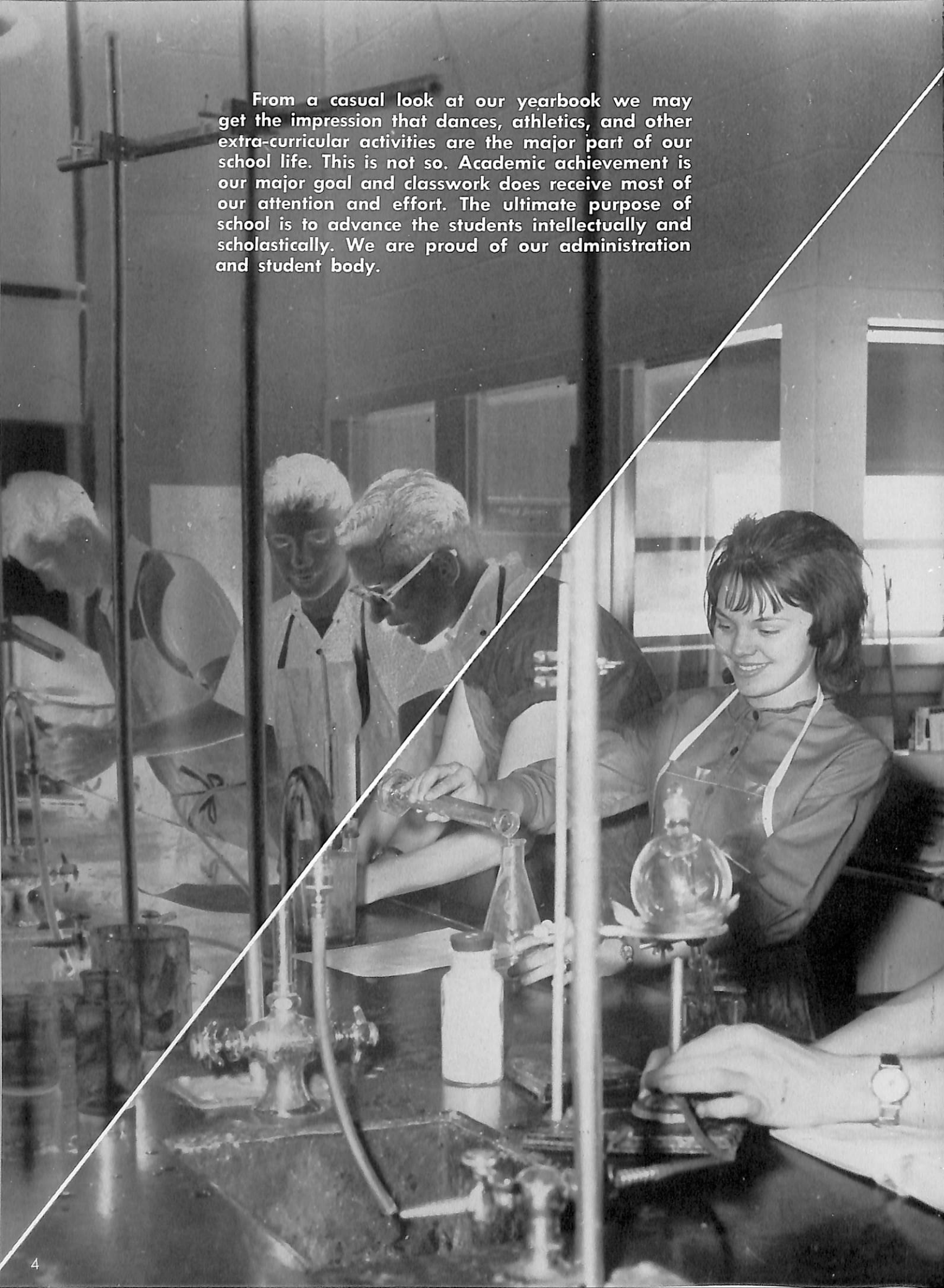
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FOREWORD

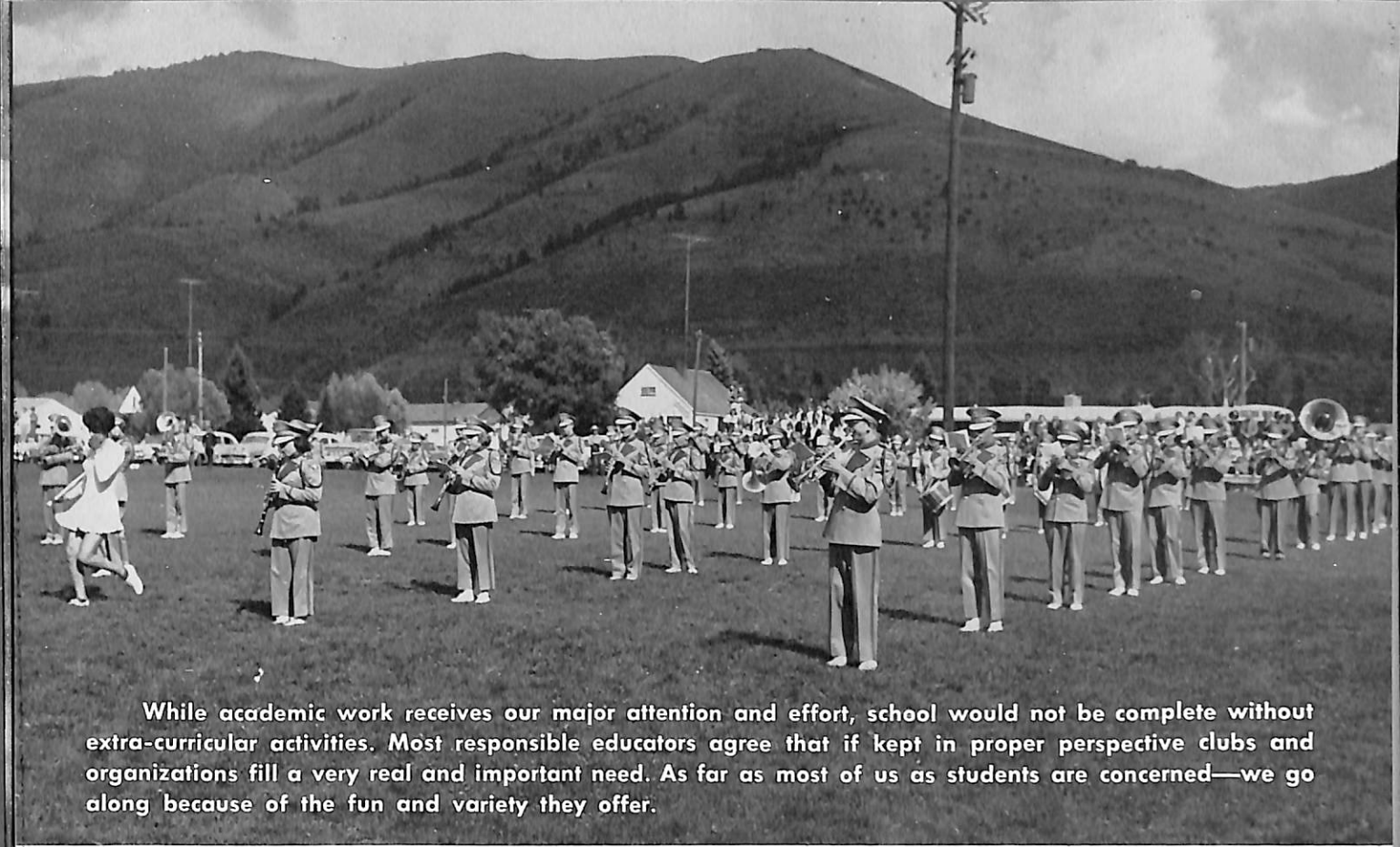

MISS WOLFLEY HOMECOMING QUEEN



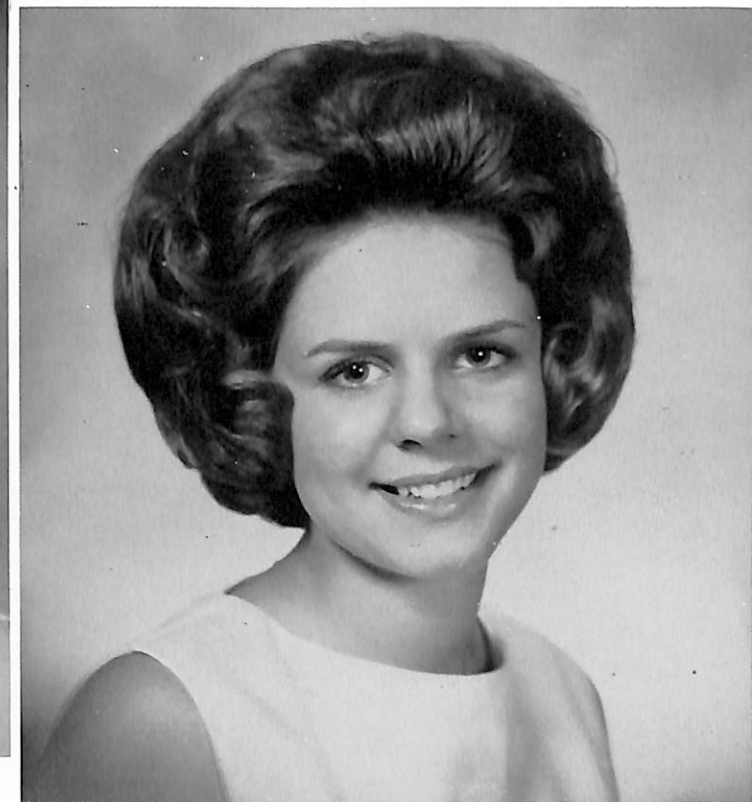

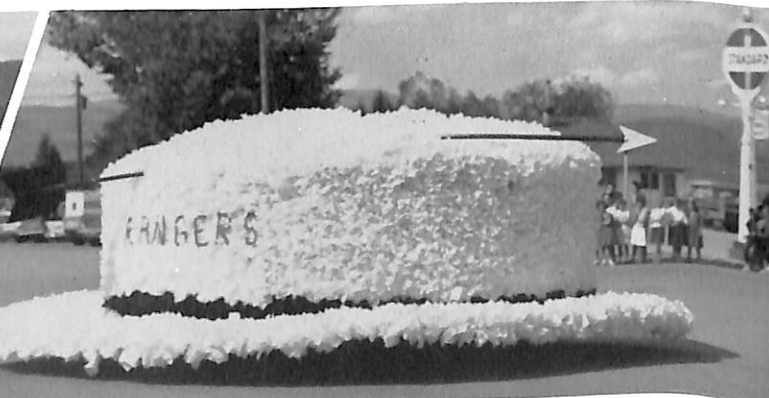

This year under the new coaching staff, Ted Nichols and Skip McCrary, we took second in the district.

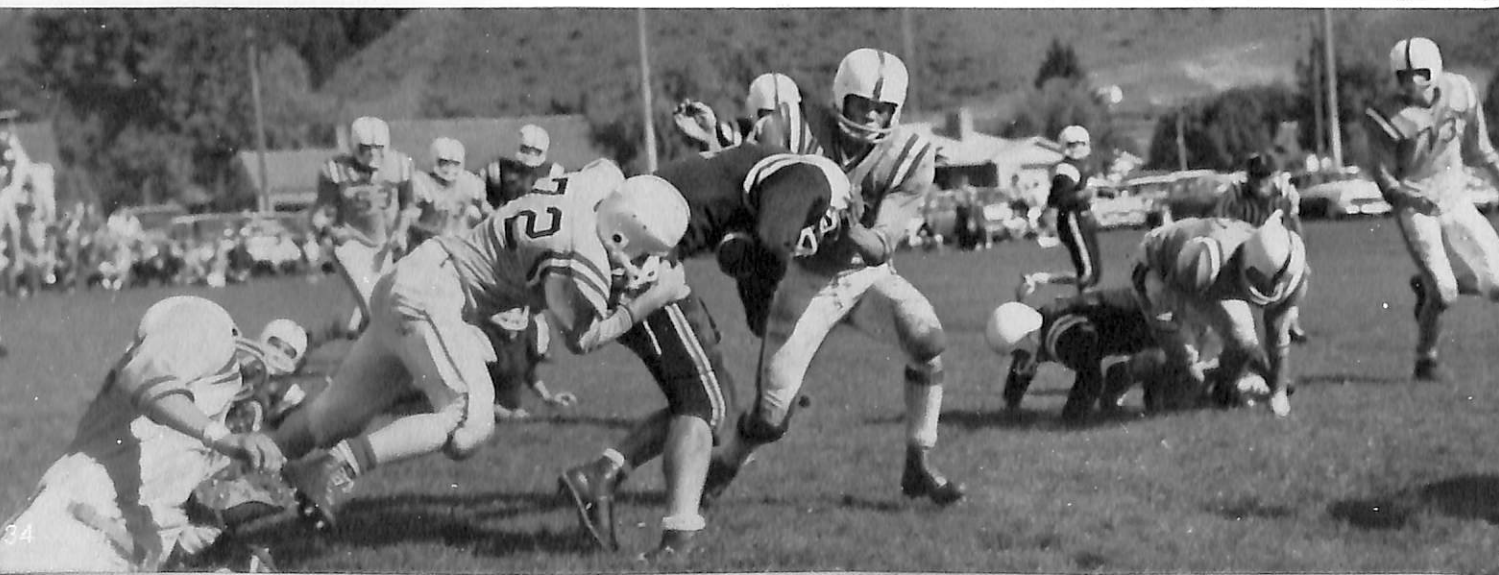

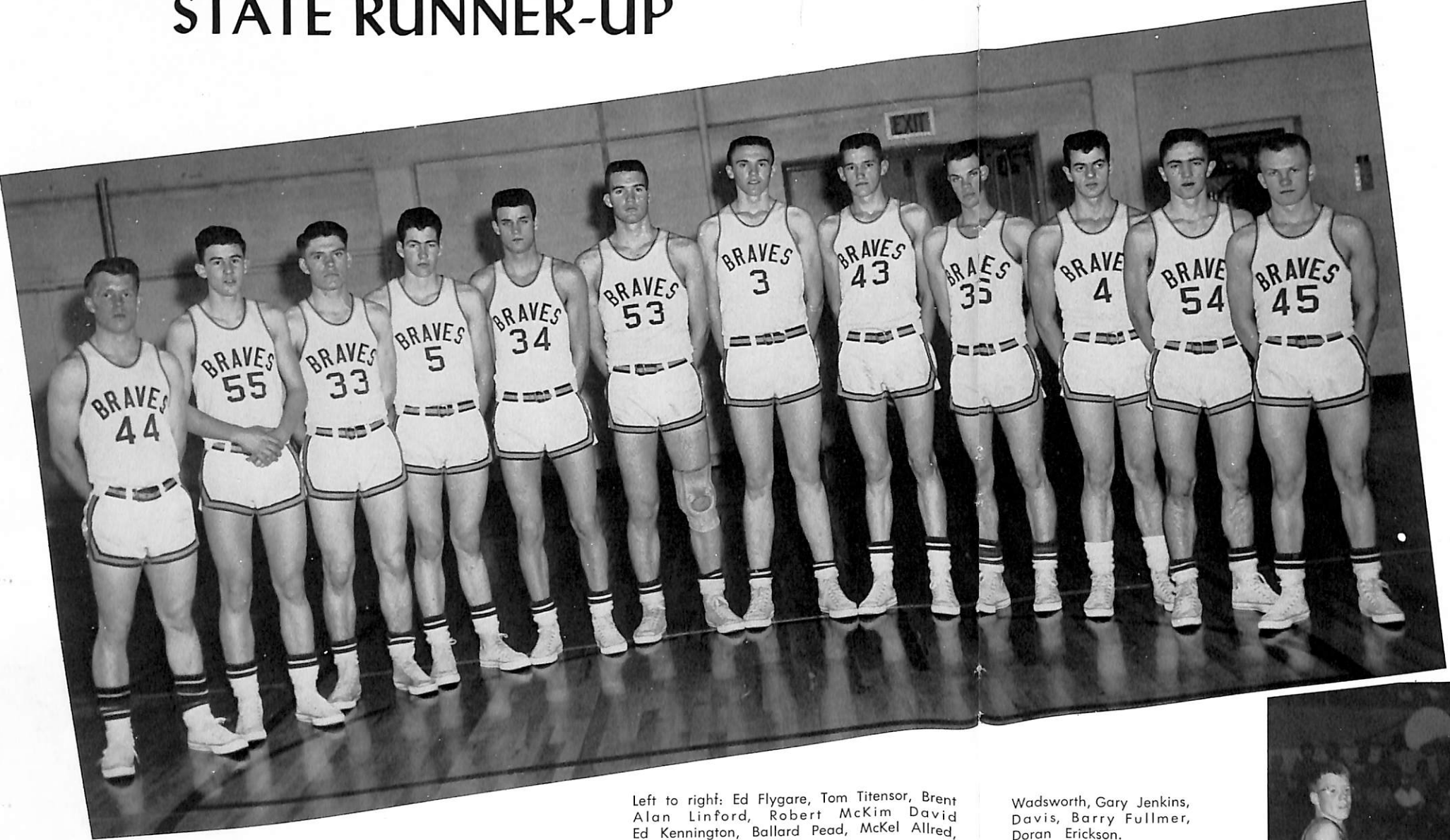
Their games showed fire and determination even though their scores were low. Given time they will make a good varsity for they showed a lot of potential.

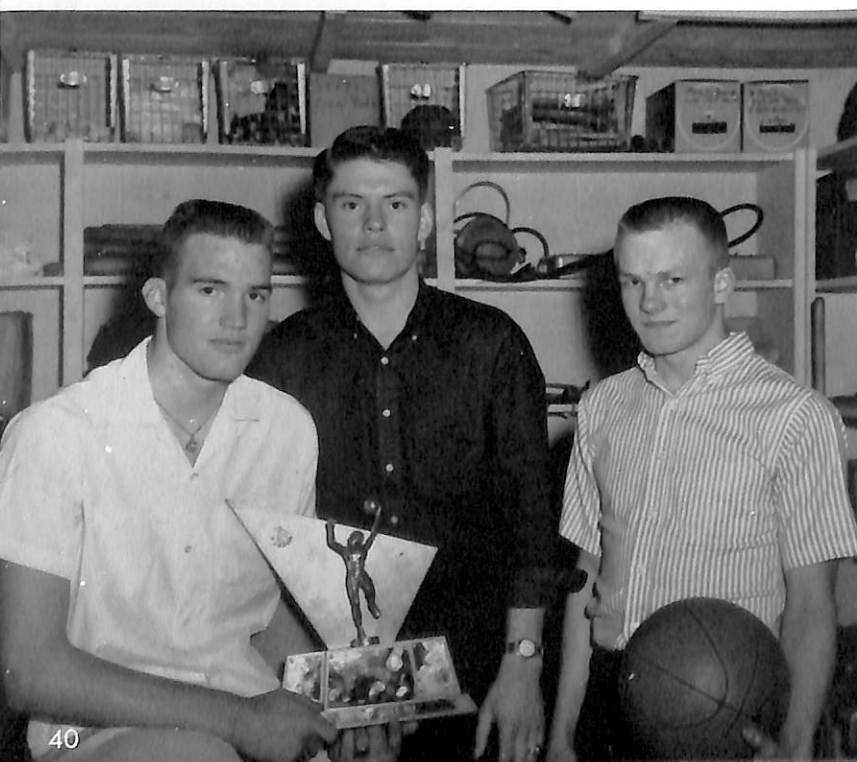

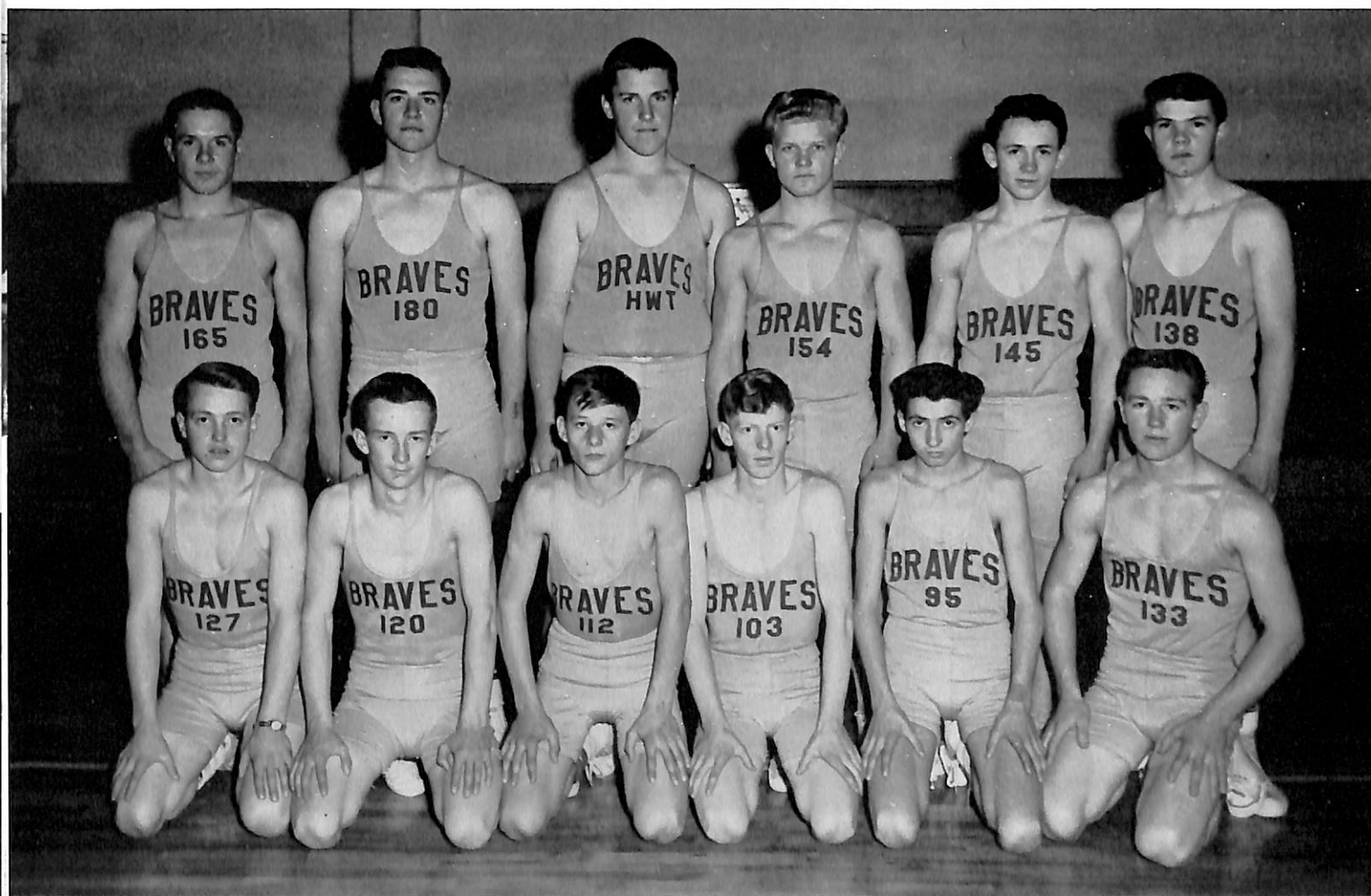

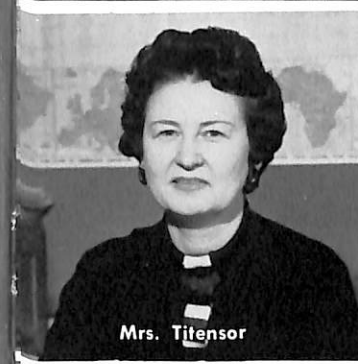

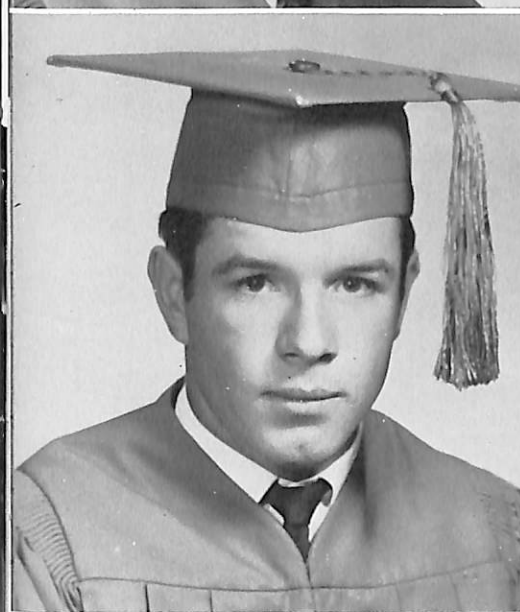
SENIOR CLASS OFFICERS
