



# MISS WOLFLEY HOMECOMING QUEEN








Burning the Kemmerer dummy on Homecoming eve.



Coach Nichols is head football and basketball coach and has fielded formidable squads in both sports this season.


Coach McCrary is assistant football coach and is our wrestling coach. Under his expert handling, our wrestling team promises to be one of the strongest in the state.




Their games showed fire and determination even though their scores were low. Given time they will make a good varsity for they showed a lot of potential.


