


Brave Perceptions

This year it was hard to say if the guys enjoyed their dates more



After a funfilled day, everyone headed for the dance, where they spent time with







They may look stiff and proffesional in their black dresses and tuxedos, but orchestra kids are really fun.





Whatever makes your game, high school sports will always hold a place in the back of our minds. The falls, the triumphs, the heartaches, and the joys of being a part of the sport.











Braves Ruled In Varsity Boys Basketball!


However, they all felt the low point of the season was their 0-4 start. Derek Astle commented on what he learned saying, "How to play better defense."

The junior varsity Braves also experienced success this season turning in a final record of 15-5. The boys felt that their




With the awakening of spring, many activities come along with it. Prom, track, elections week, festival, symposium, and so much more.


Gone with the Wind
