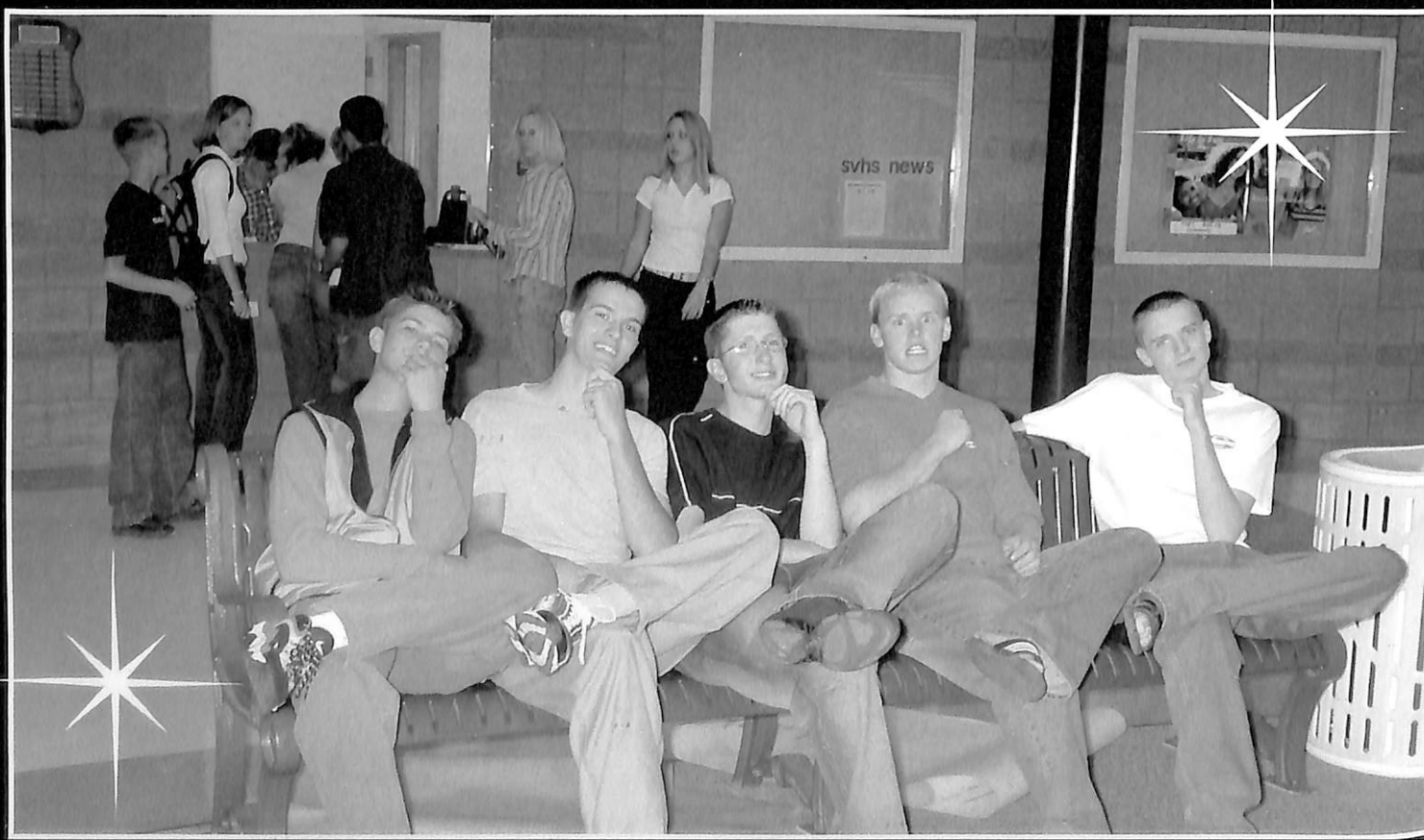
Student Life

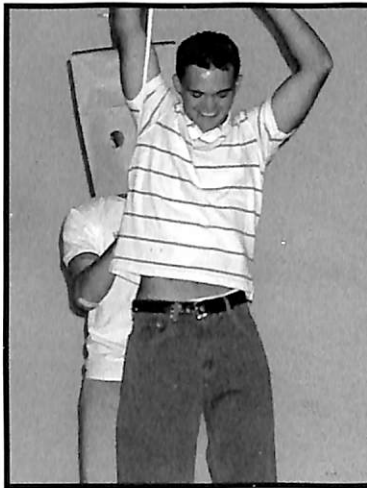

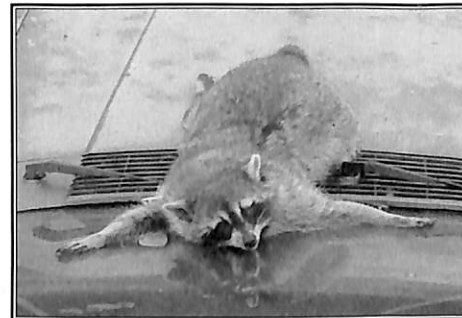

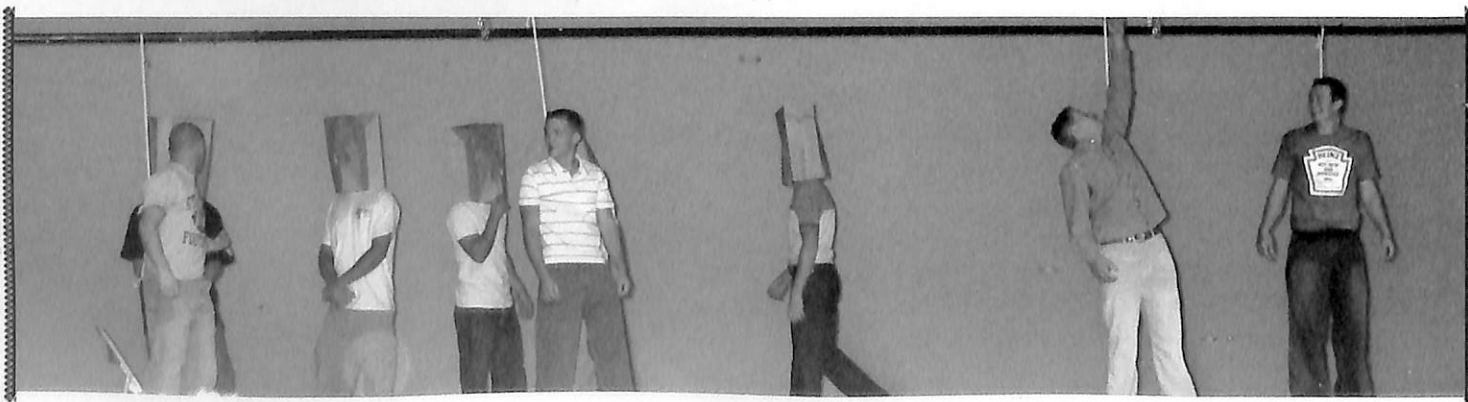


CHECK IT OUT... Our First Day of School !!

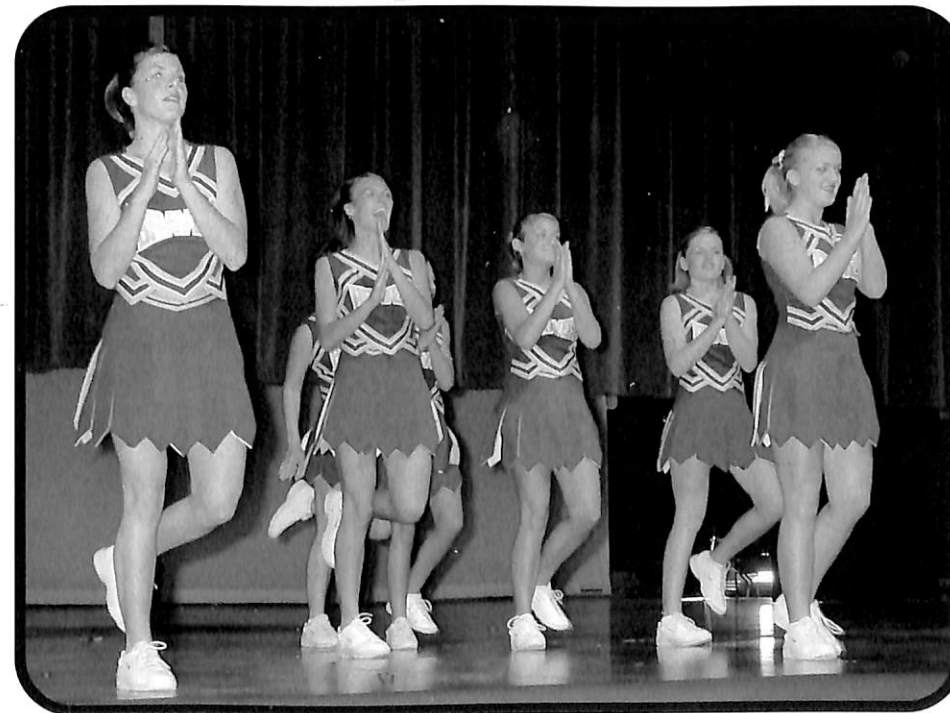

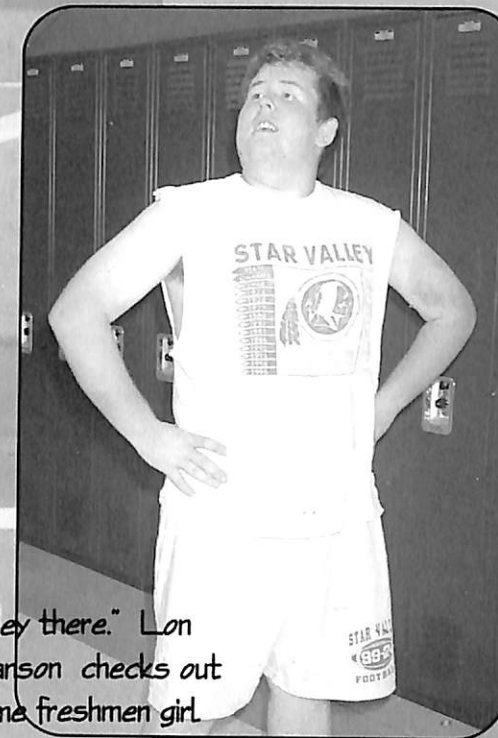

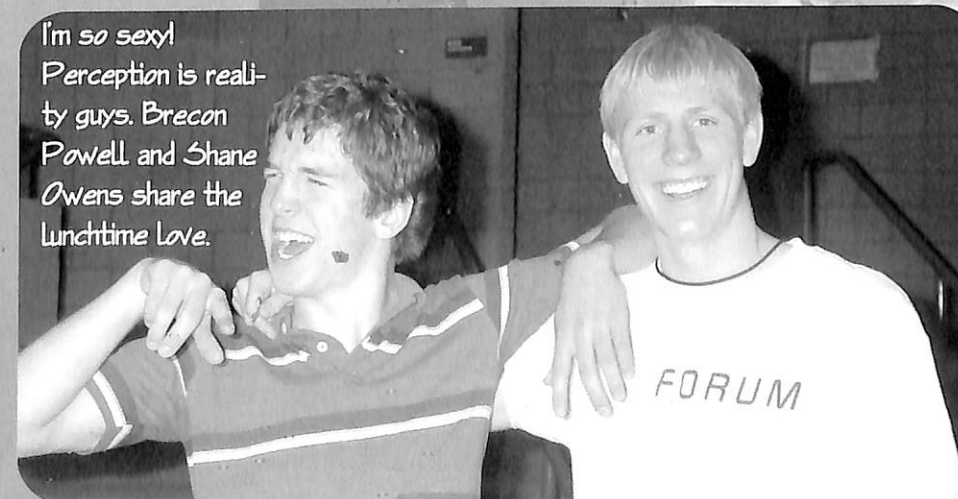

“Today, our fellow citizens, our way of life, our very freedom, came under attack in a series of deliberate and deadly terrorist acts.” (George W. Bush *U.S. News & World Report* September 24, 2001) September 11, 2001, is a day America will never forget. Star Valley citizens went about that morning believing it to be a normal day. Little did we know that while going about our morning business, thousands of our fellow American citizens died

due to brutal terrorist acts. At 8:45 Eastern Standard Time, American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City carrying 81 passengers and 11 crew members on board. At 9:03 United Airlines Flight 175, which held 56 passengers and 9 crew members, deliberately hit the south tower of the World Trade Center. 9:43 was the time that American Airlines Flight 77 crashed into the Pentagon, killing 8 passengers and

6 crew members. Later on, both of the World Trade Center Towers collapsed killing thousands. United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Somerset County, Pennsylvania, Southeast Pittsburgh at 10:10 a.m. en route to what experts believe was Washington D.C. This devastation, the greatest since Pearl Harbor, saw many heroic fire fighters and policeman lose their lives trying to save others in this mass destruction. We are all very proud of our American Heritage.

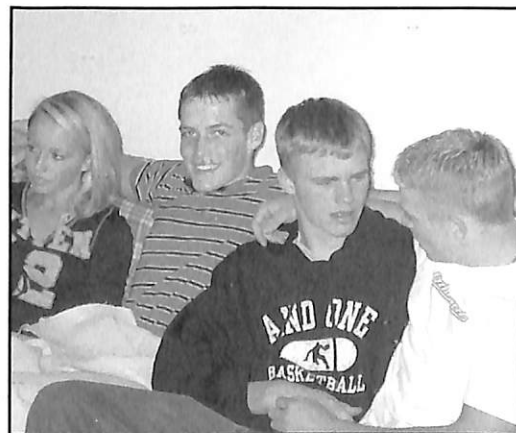

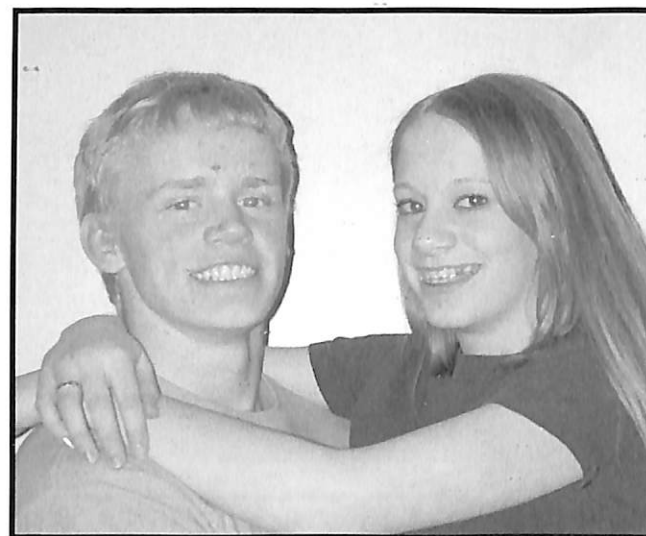

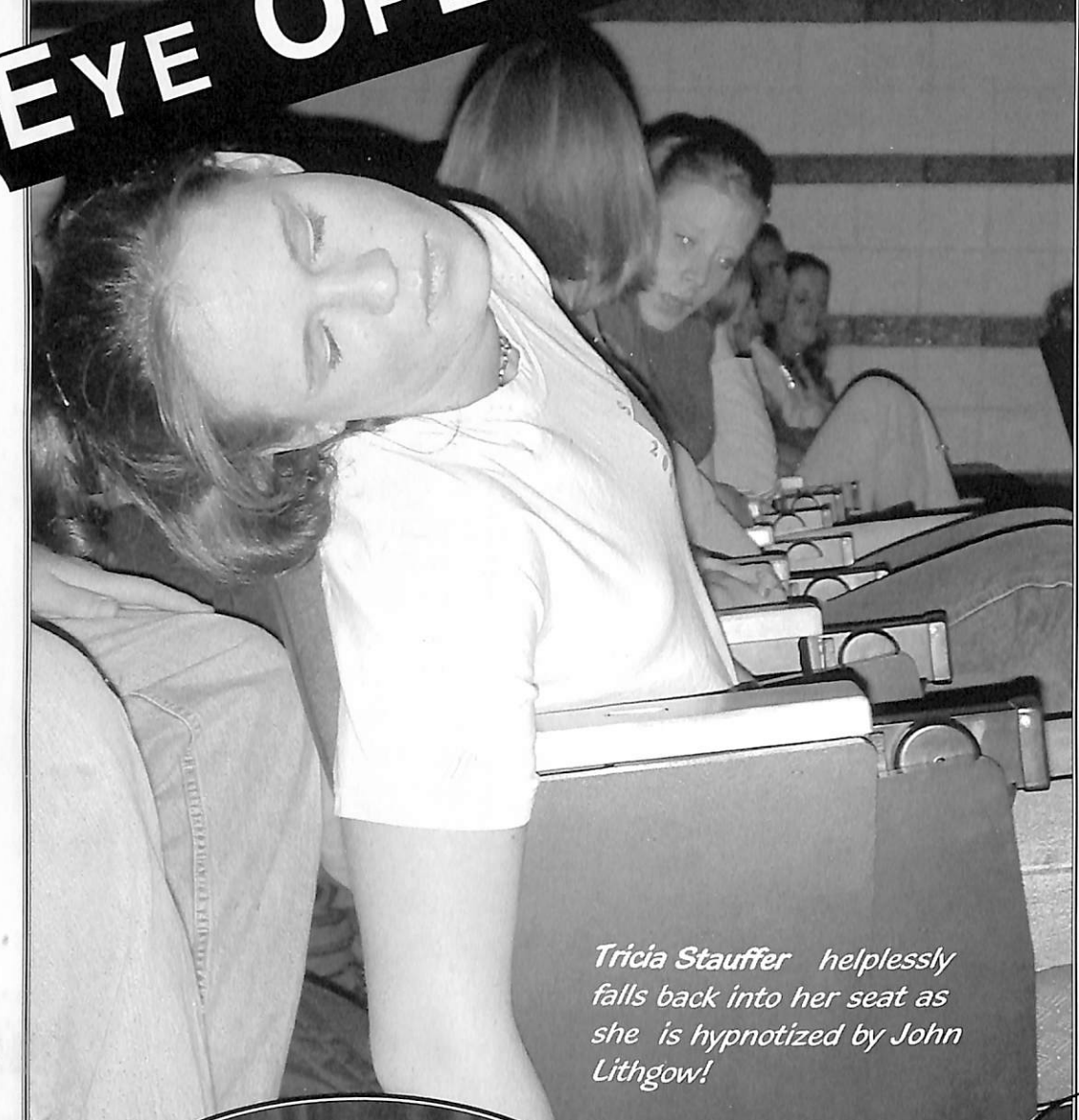
than the shiny, new, kick-your-butt snowmachine everyone got to pose on for pictures.

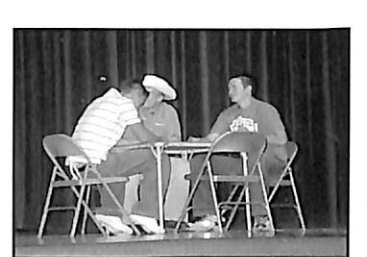

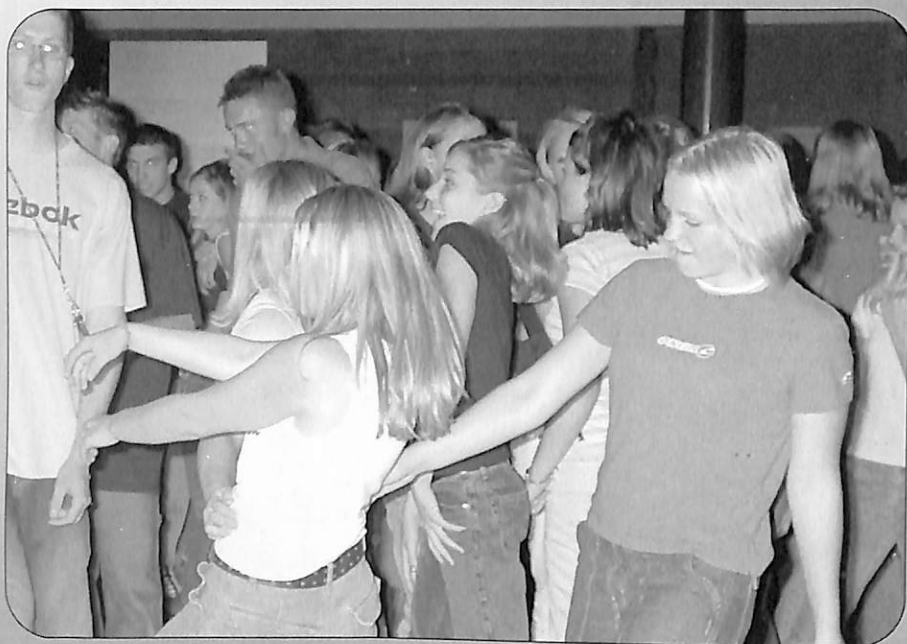

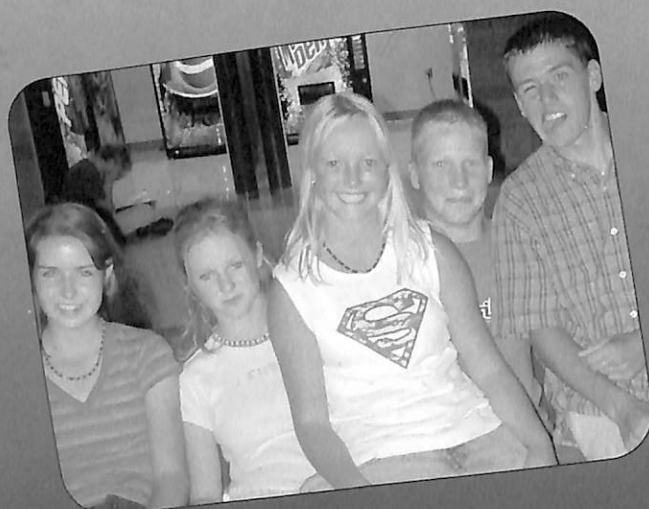


You Know You Want To...

Tricia Stauffer commented, "ALL the WORKSHOPS taught US HOW to respect OURSELVES and be MORE CONFIDENT."

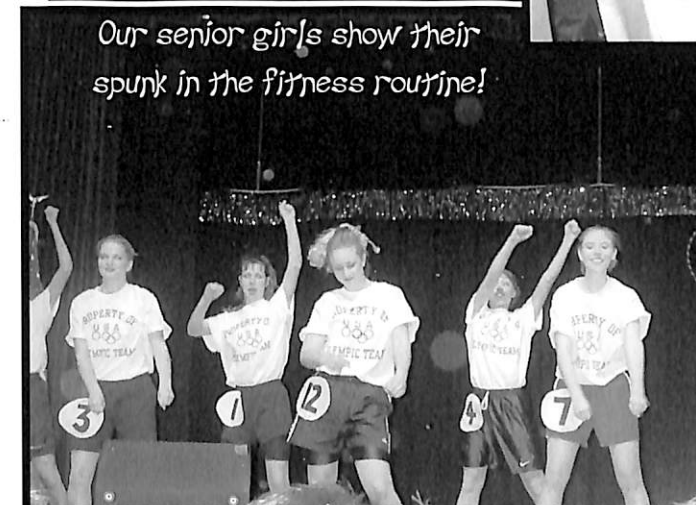

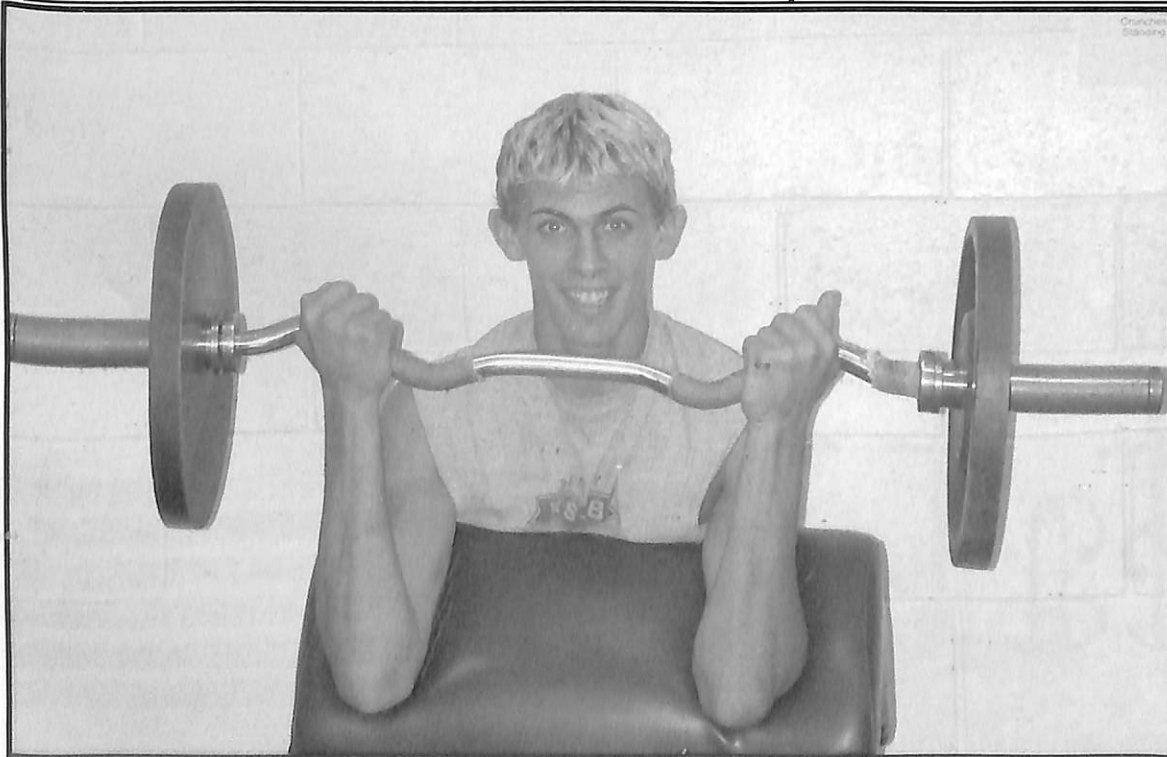
Taking a step toward Health and Beauty

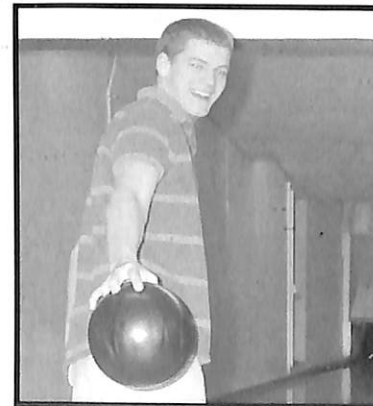
Those who didn't get into P.E. liked to express themselves in other ways. Art is another exciting class that

Whether building the biceps or painting a mountain, art and P.E. gave students a break from the academic rigors of SVHS.

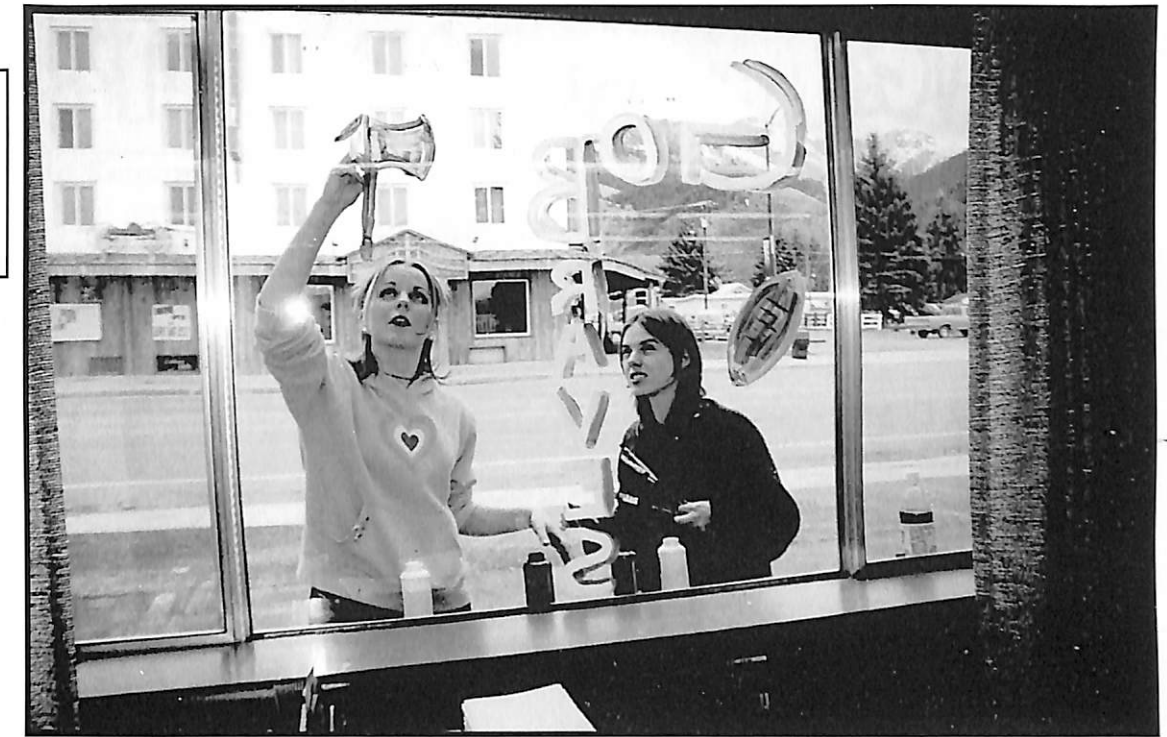

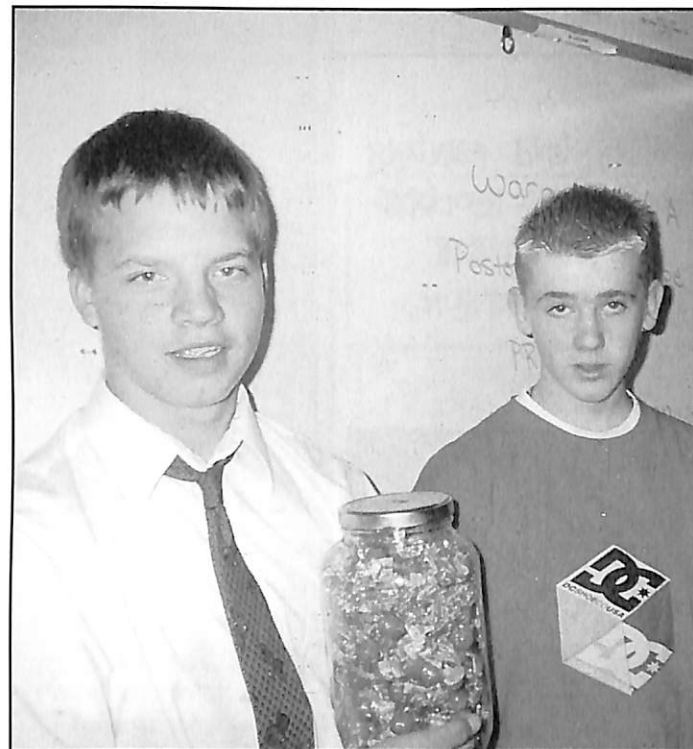

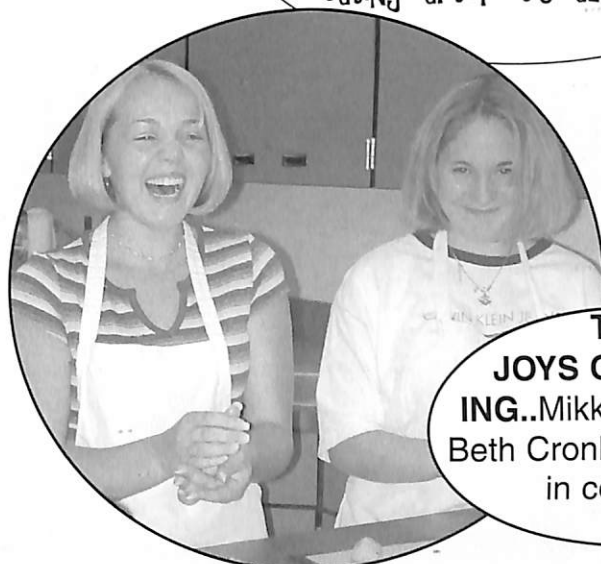

Orchestra: *Hard Work and Unity...*

Orchestral instruments have been around since the Baroque Period. Violins, violas, cellos, and stand-up basses are all instruments that are complicated, full of culture, and just plain elegant. 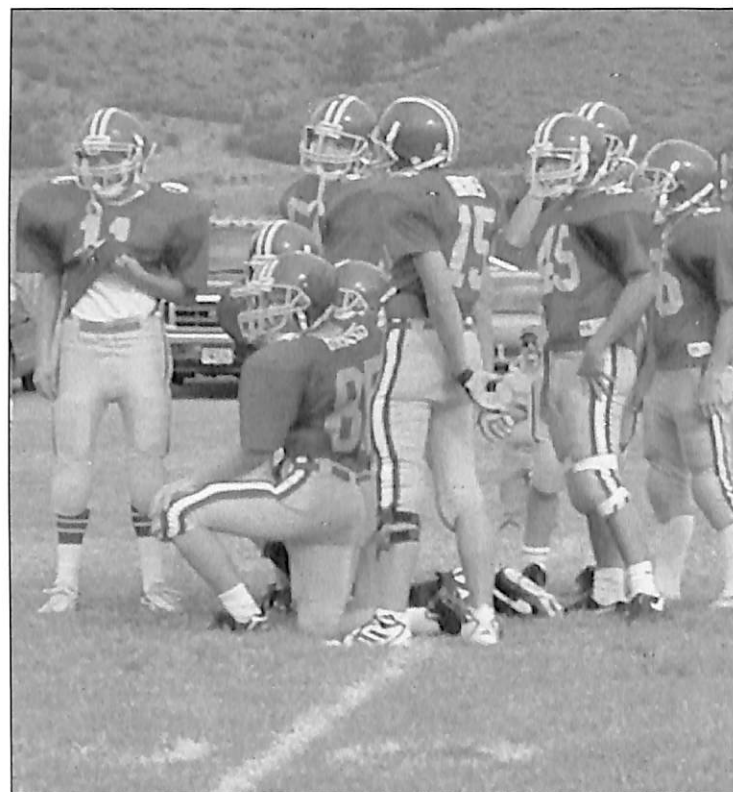
Freshmen and junior varsity players work their way up to varsity level

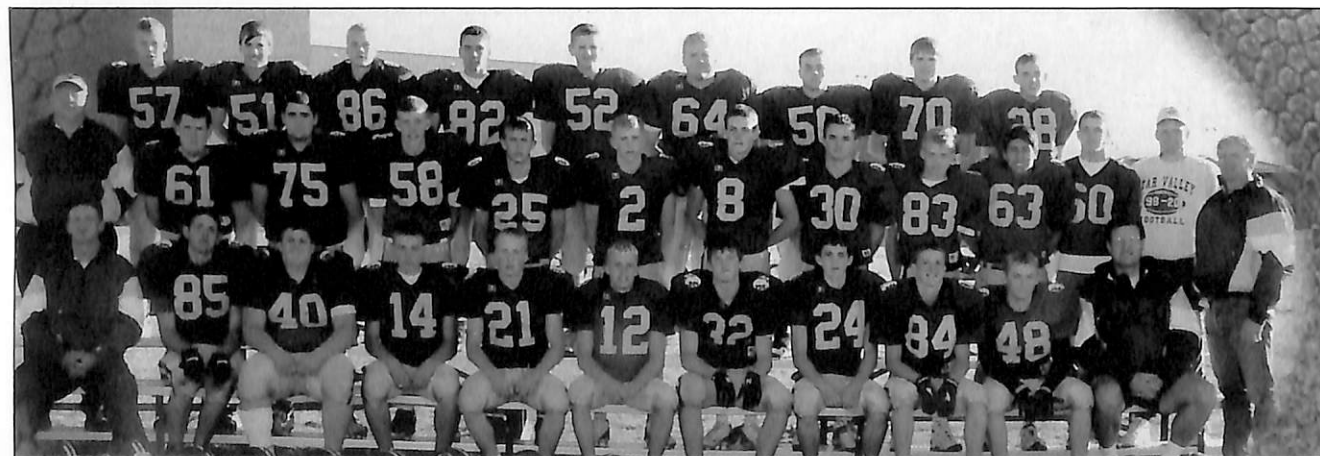

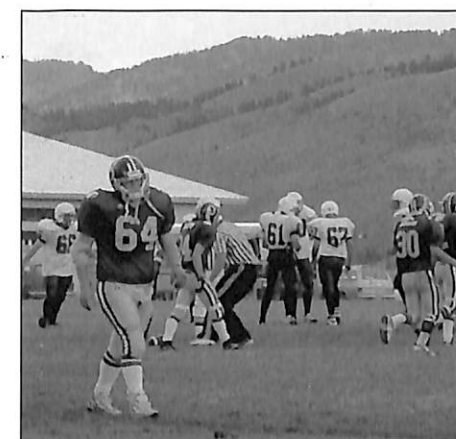

The junior varsity Braves also experienced success this season turning in a final record of 15-5. The boys felt that their

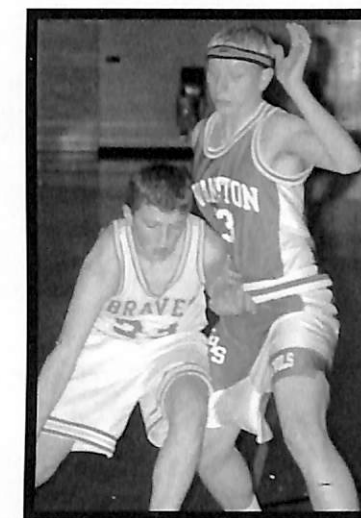

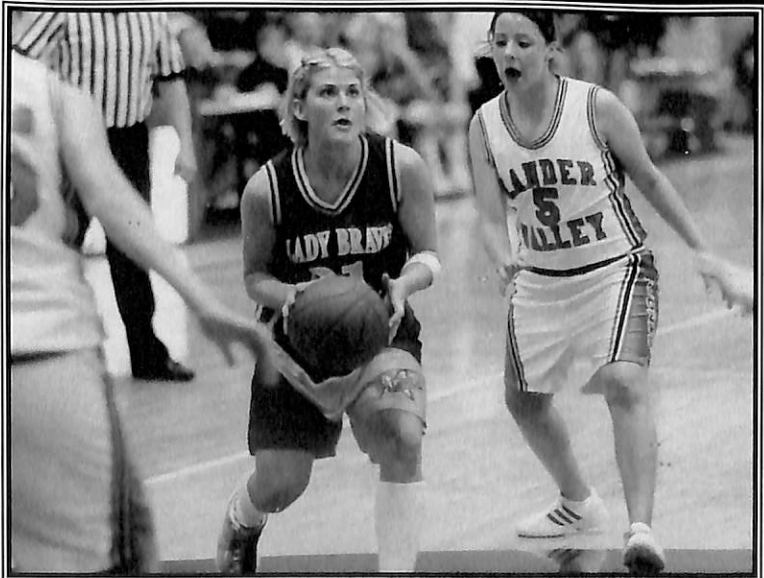

Many new clubs and organizations have popped up over the past couple of years here at Star Valley. Super Heroes, Swing Club, and Gamers to name a few.

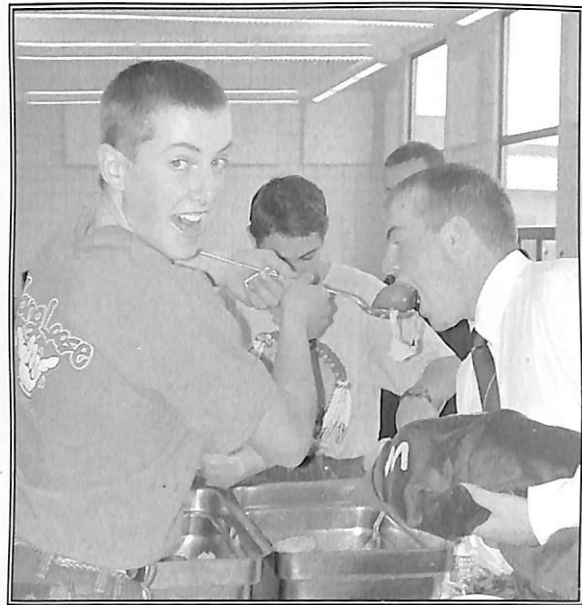

With the awakening of spring, many activities come along with it. Prom, track, elections week, festival, symposium, and so much more.

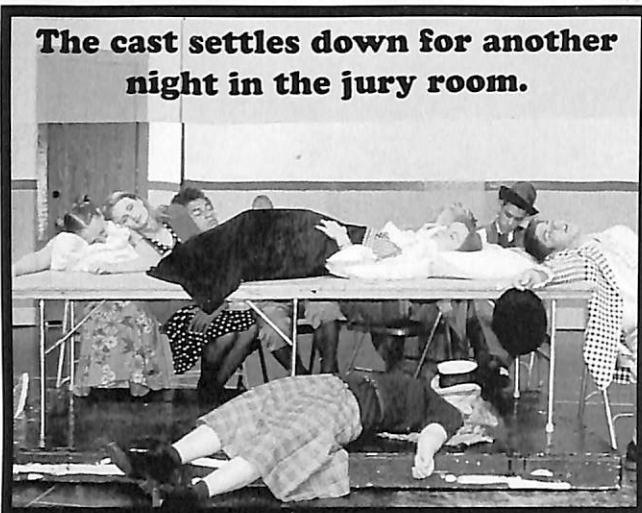

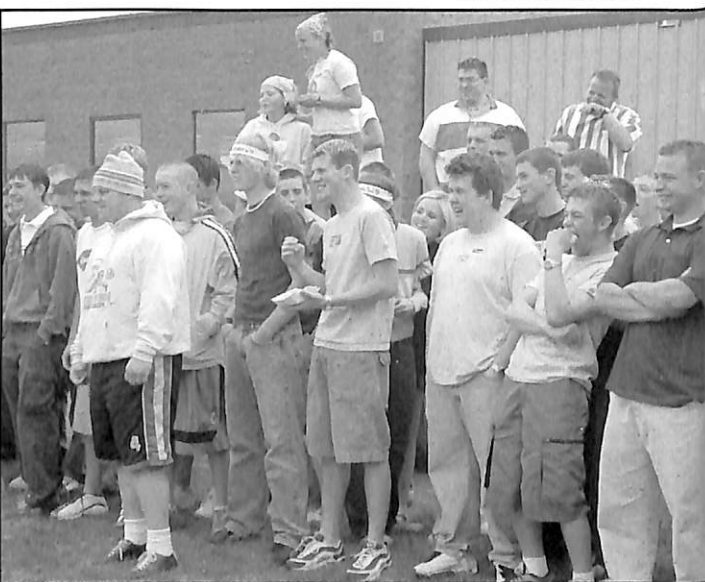

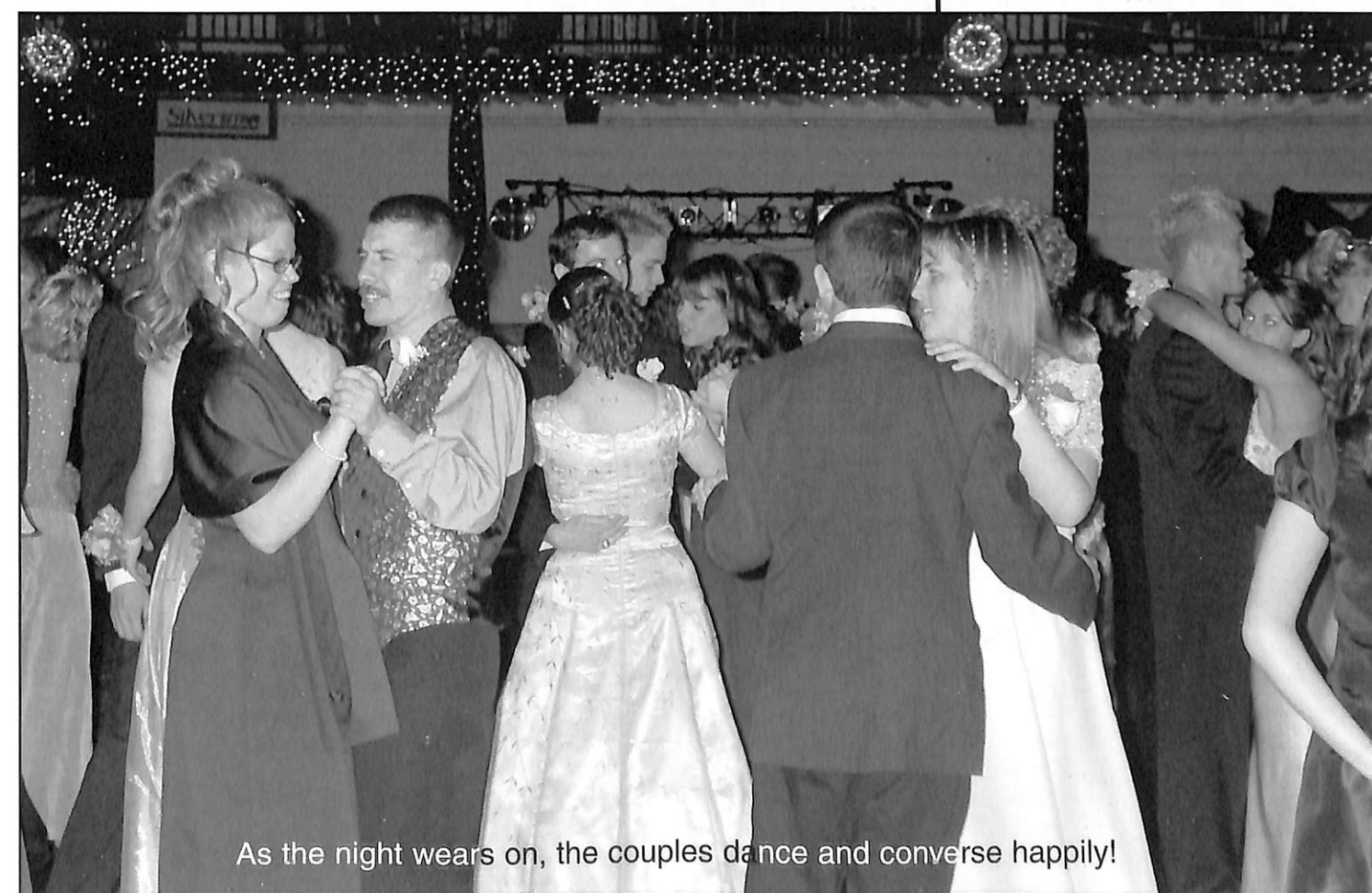
It Is You...

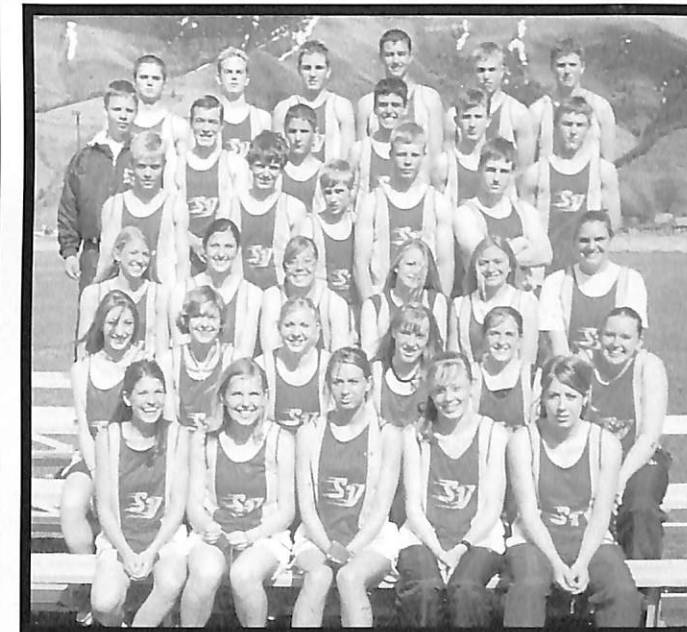
