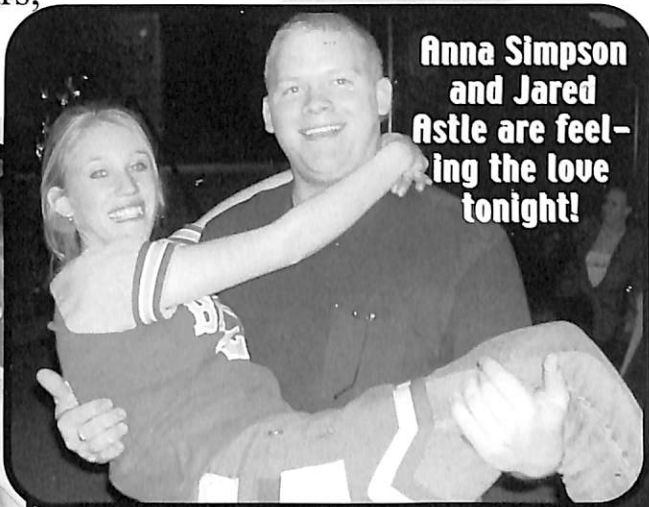
## A Place to Get Away From It All

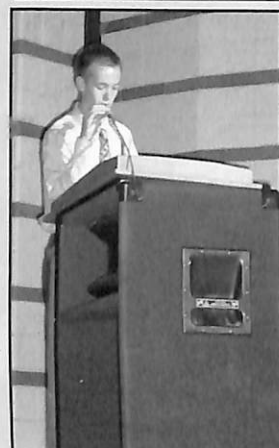

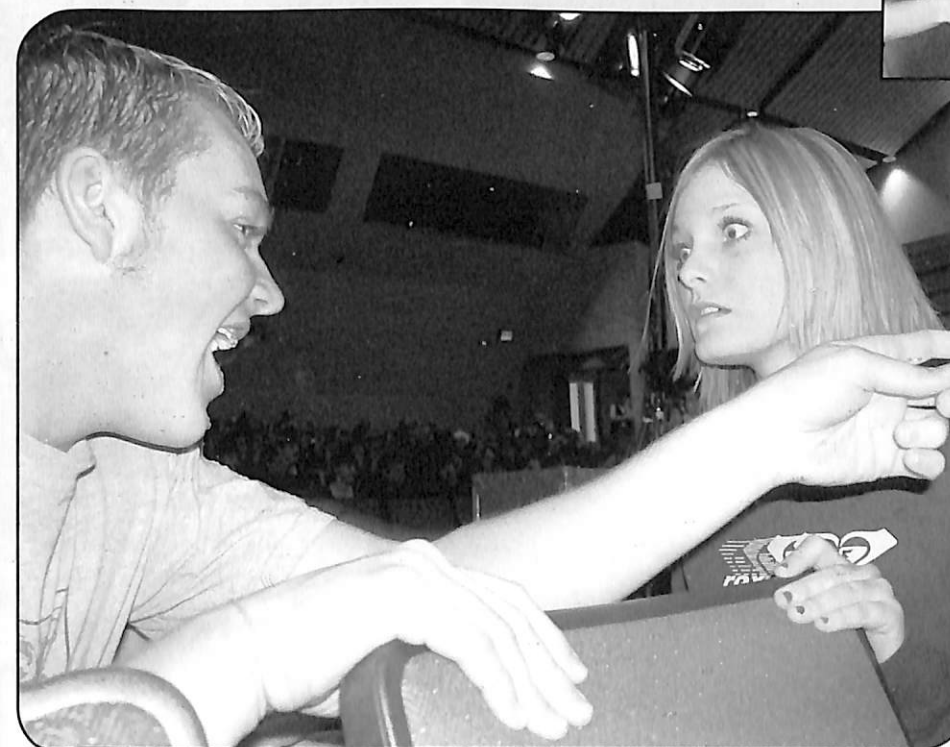

## Lancaster Captures Title of Jr. Miss

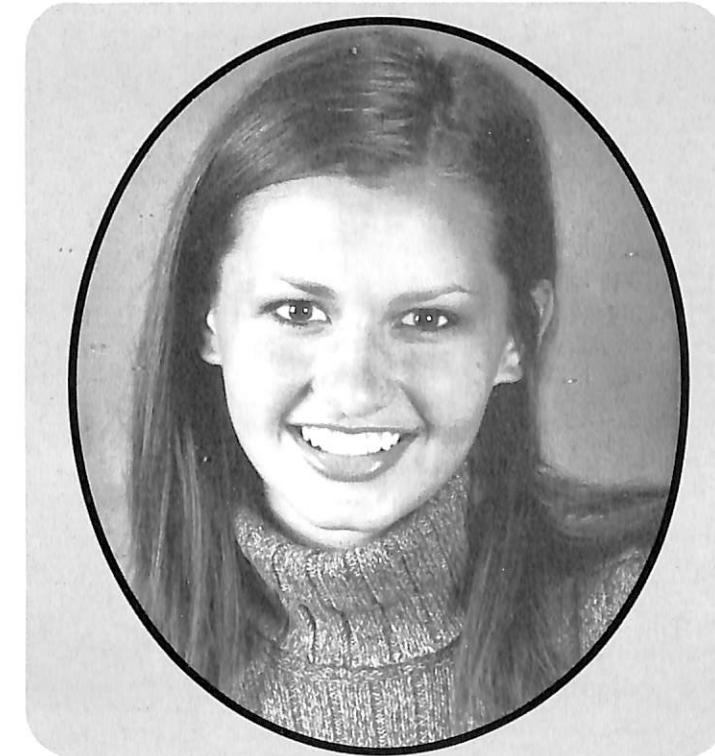

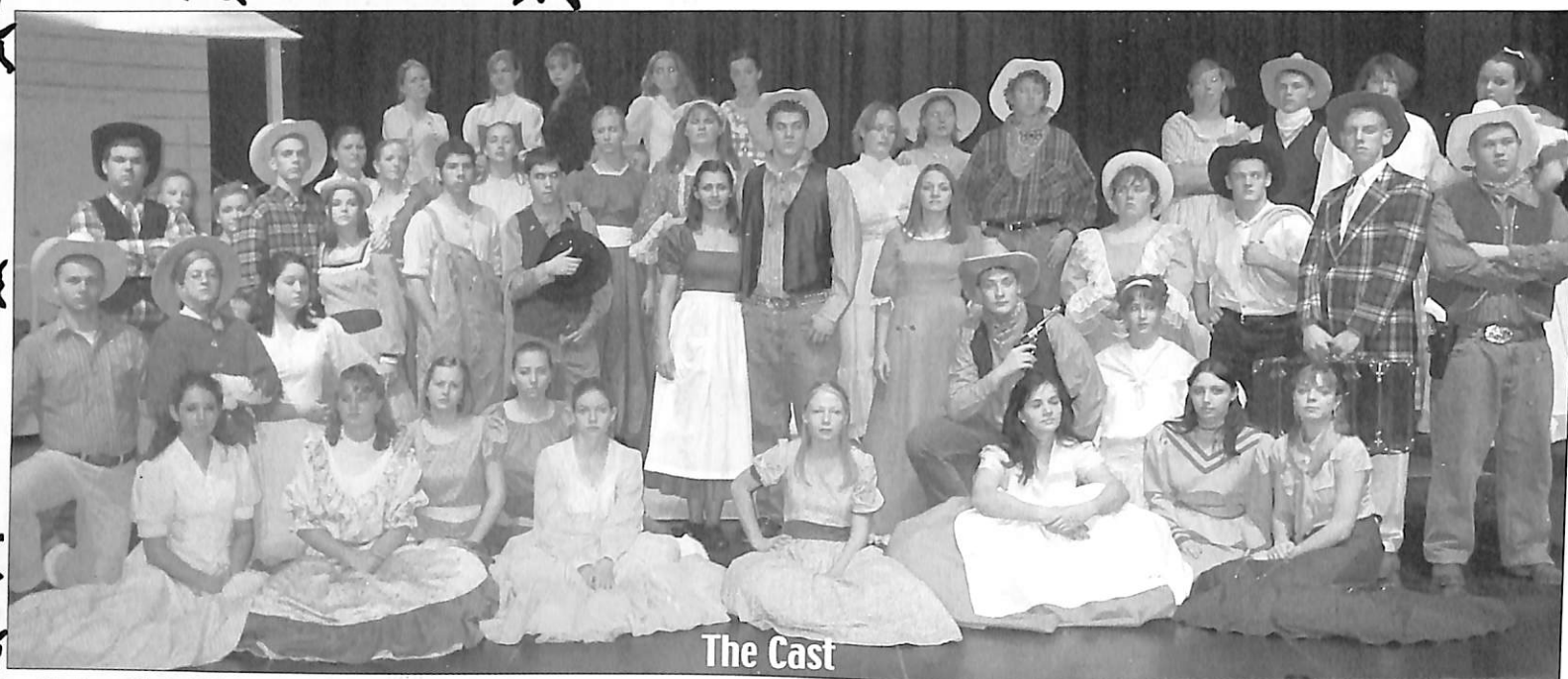

"It was funny watching everyone eat with giant utensils, and I cheated." Dan Scherbel on dinning etiquette.

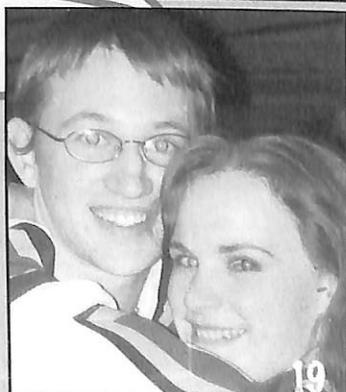
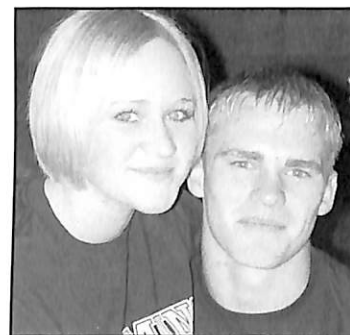

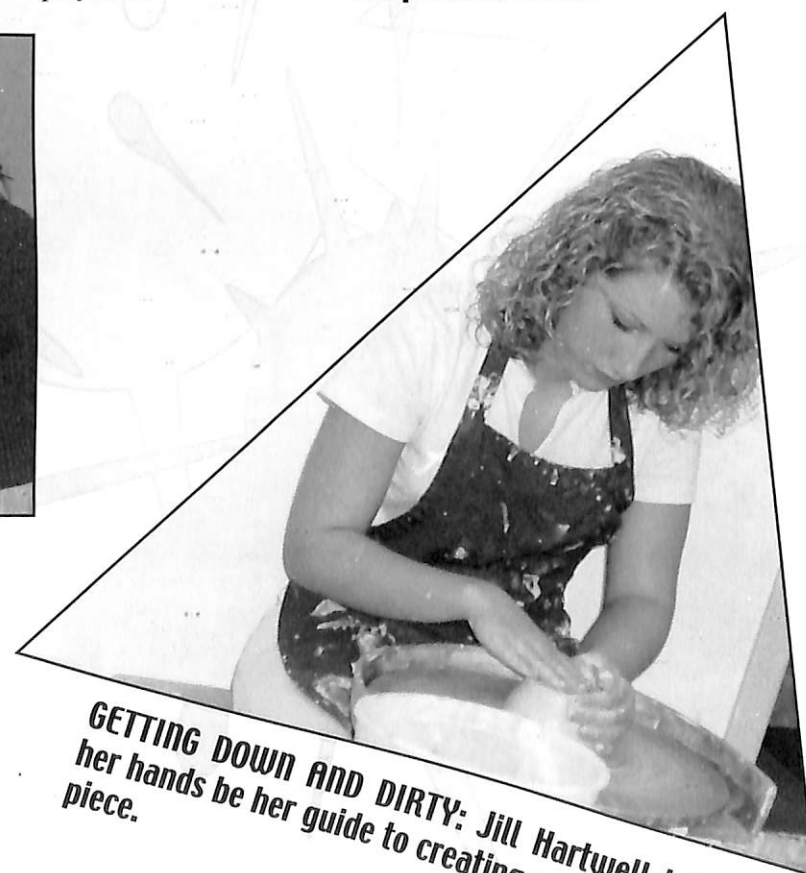

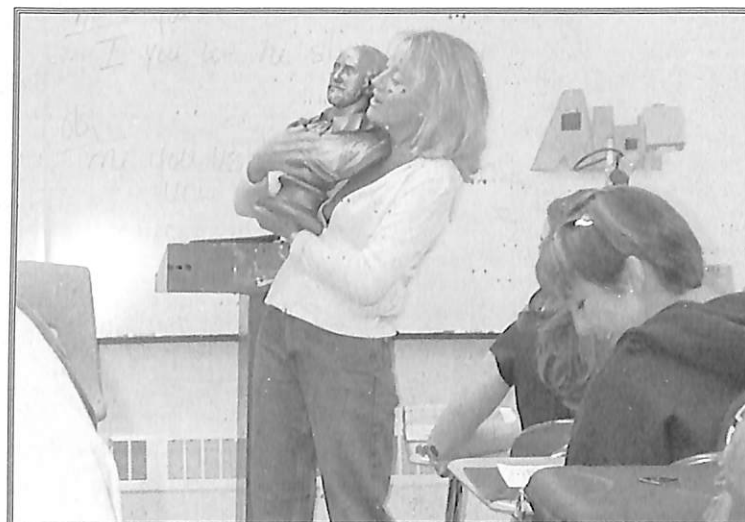

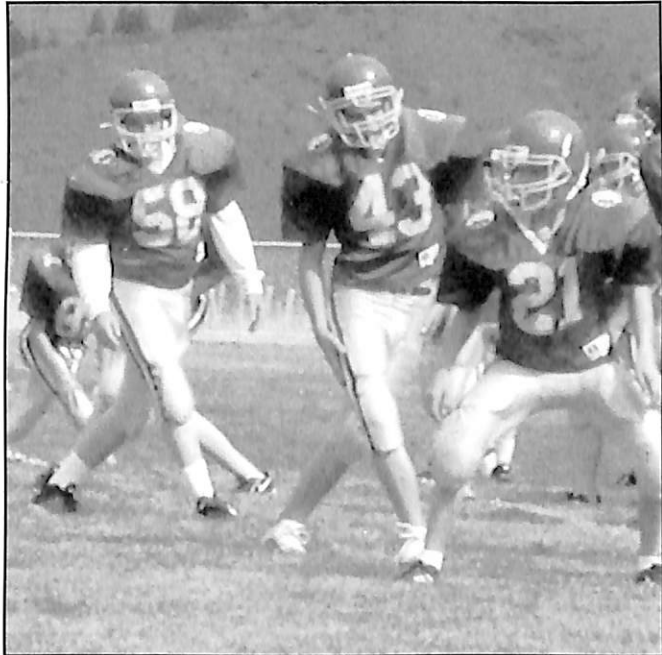
# The Unforgettable Braves

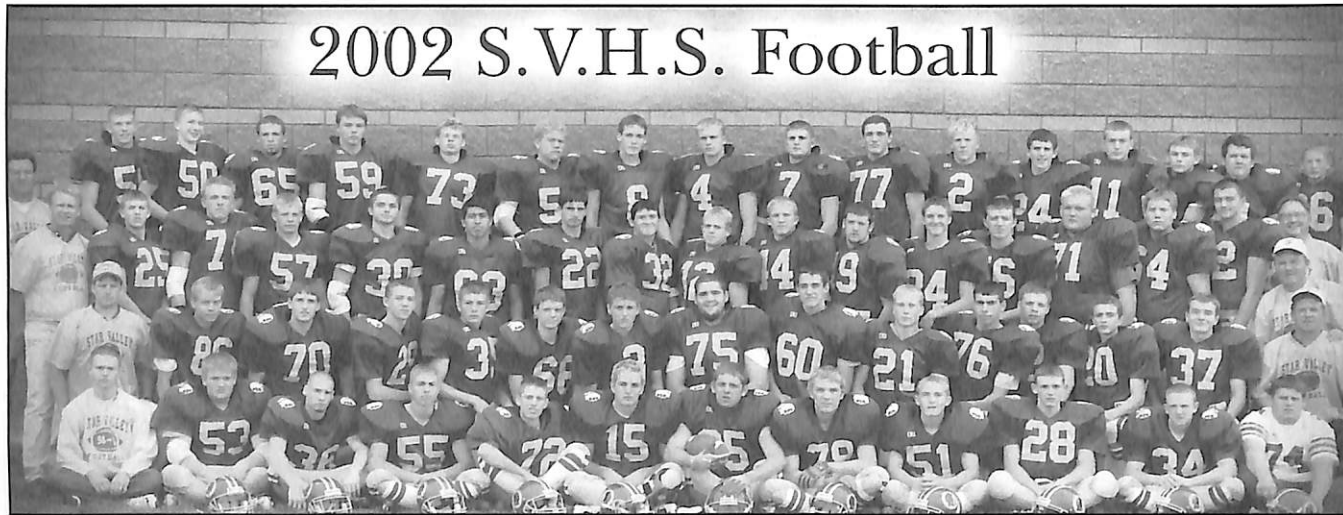

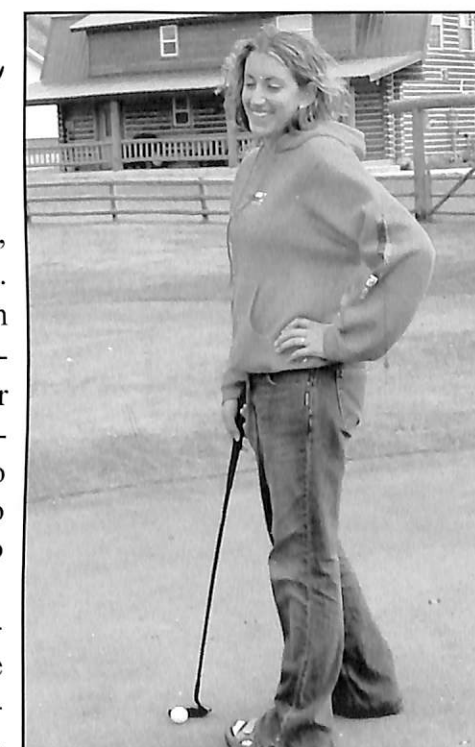
**G**olf is a game where individuals can shine and destroy their competitors, but the Star Valley High School golf team had to play together to win.

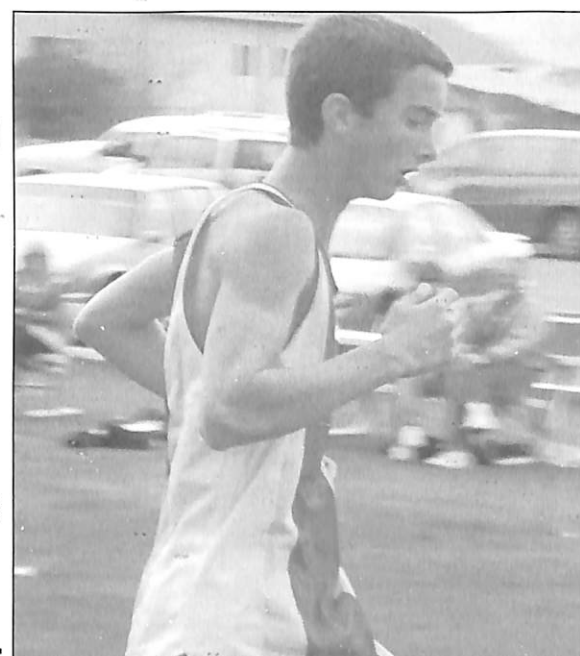

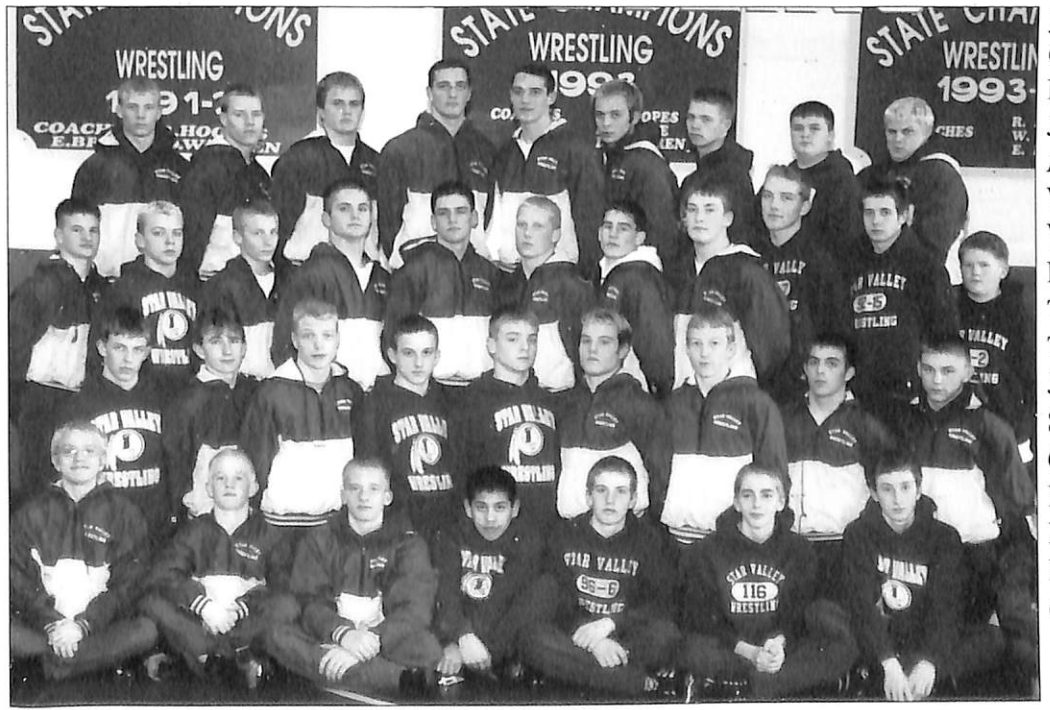

## Cheerleaders Shout Out To SVHS

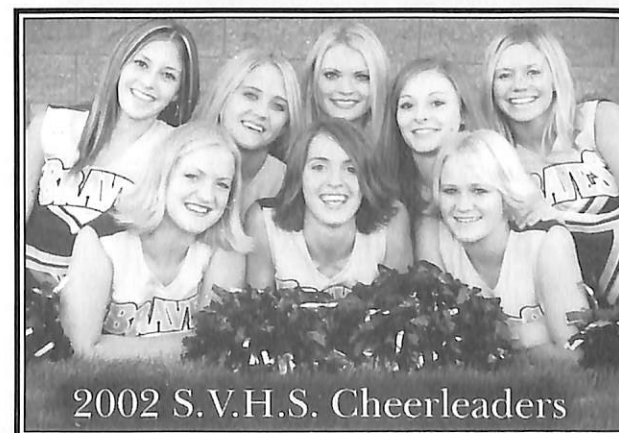
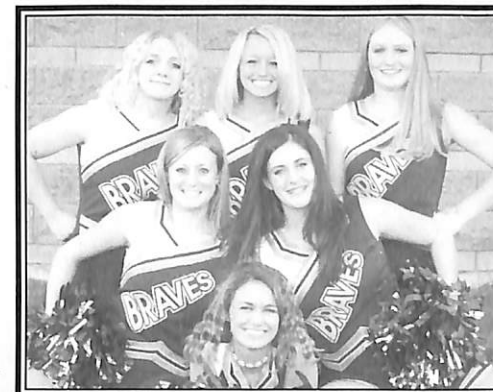
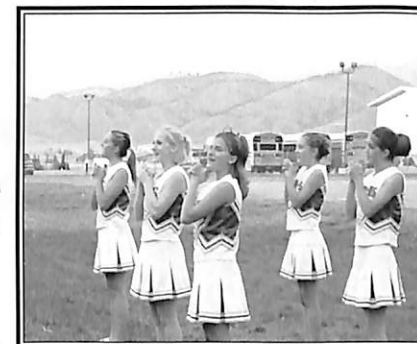

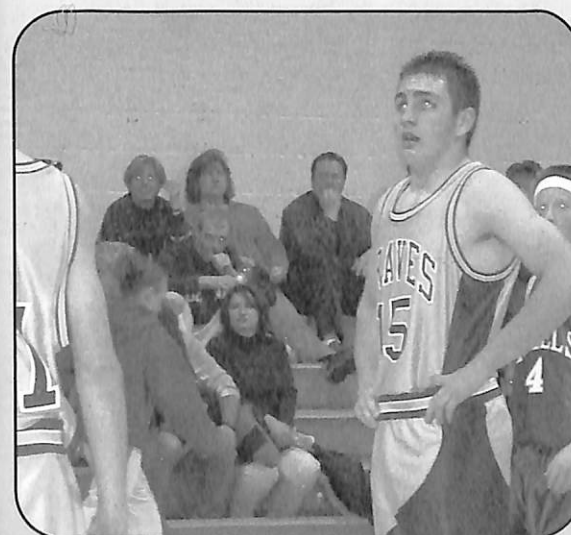

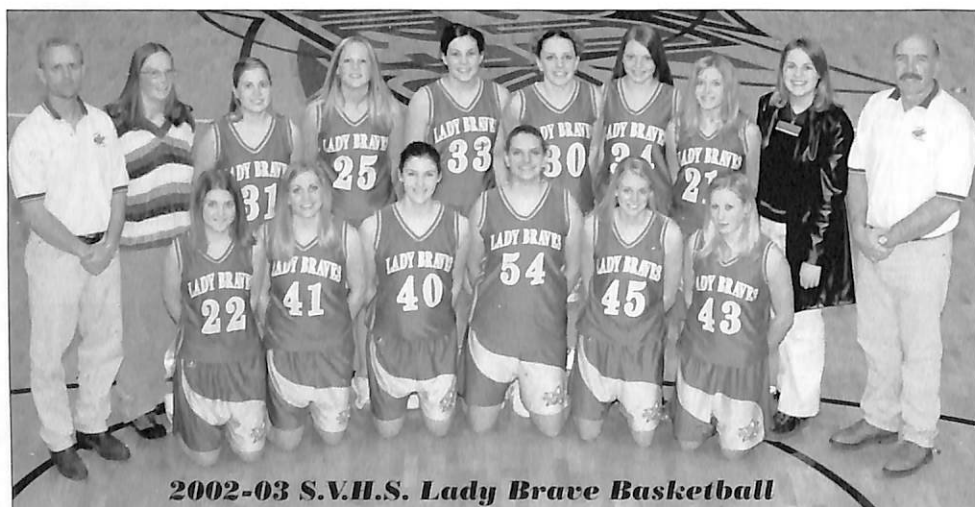
# TOUGH GALS

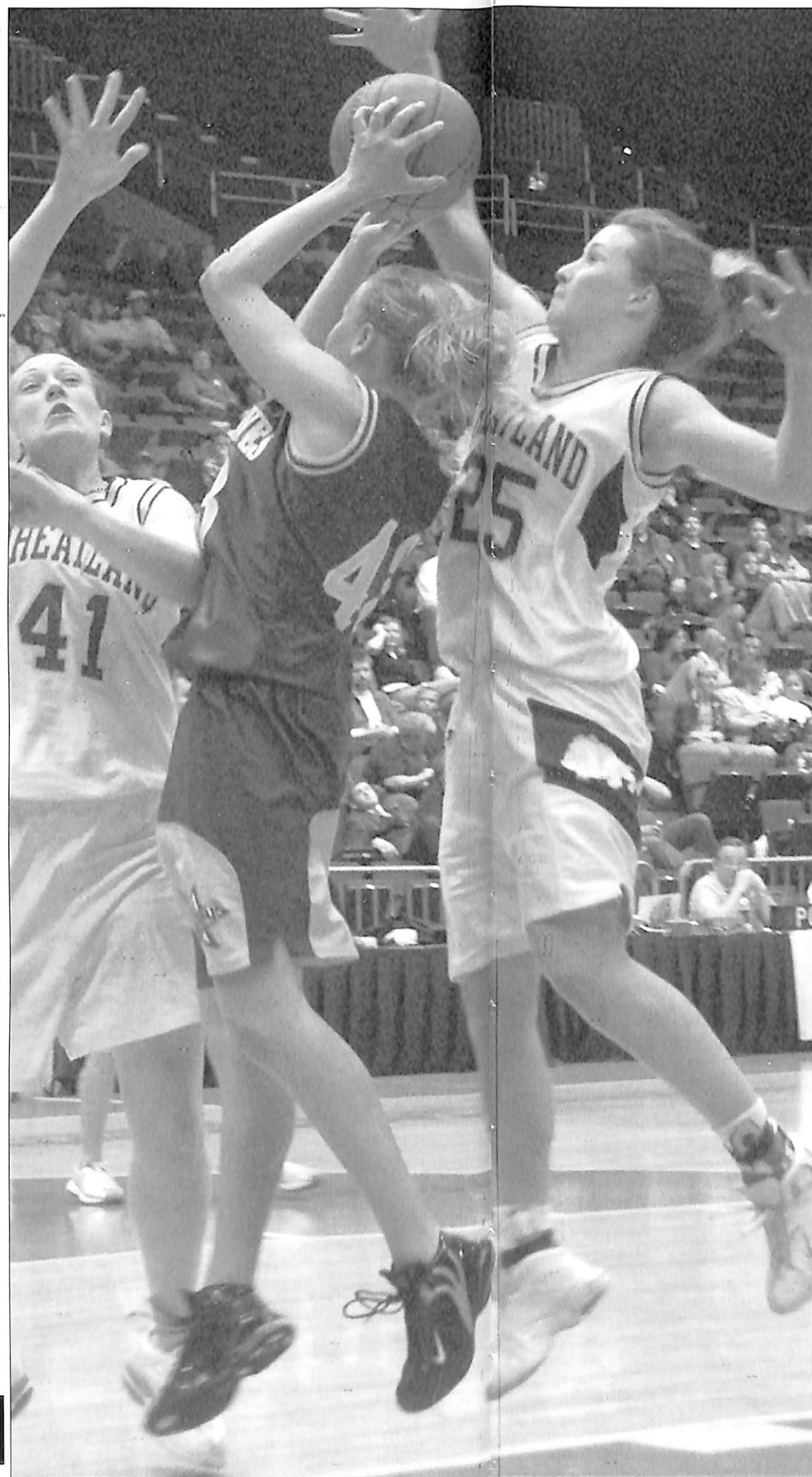

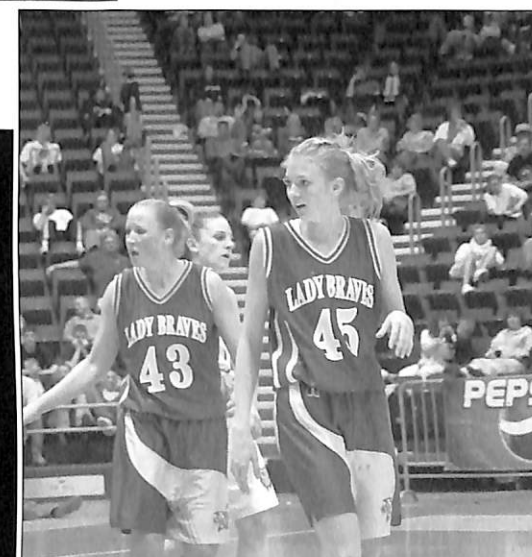

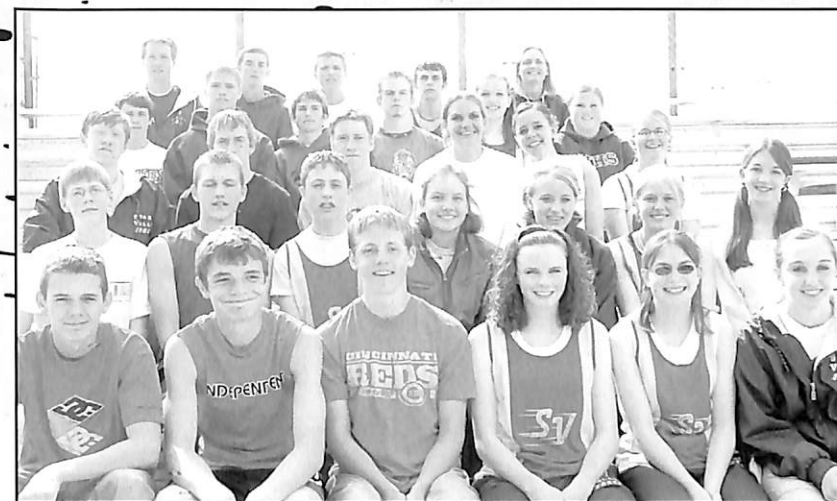
crossed the line in first place for the 4x100 relay.

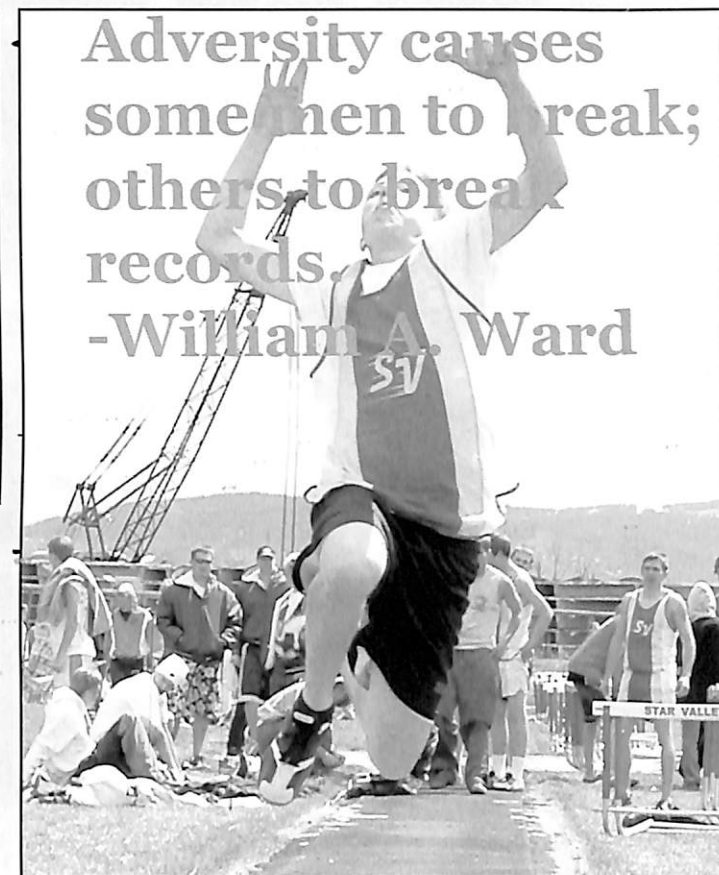

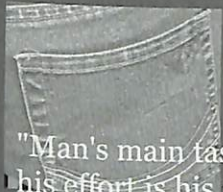

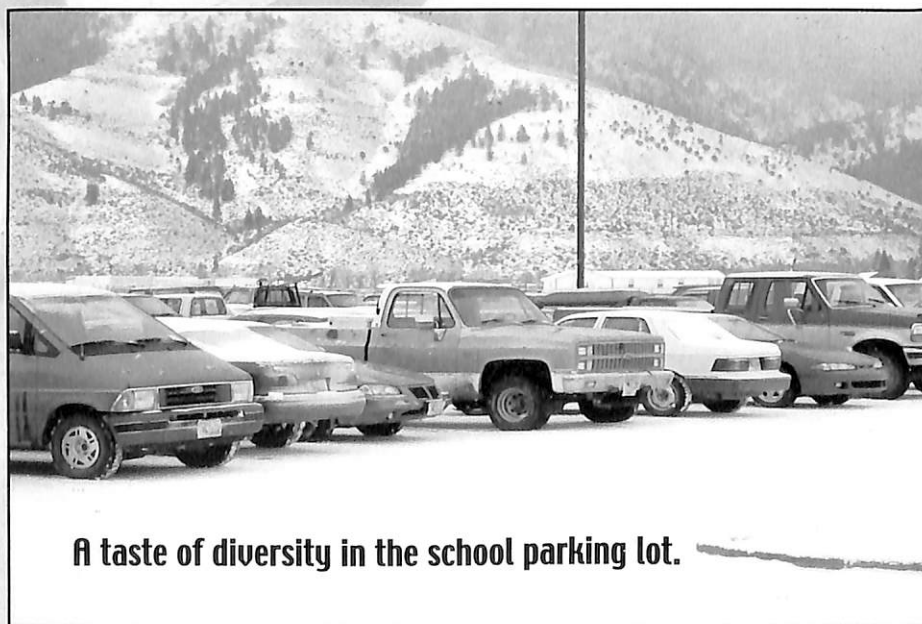

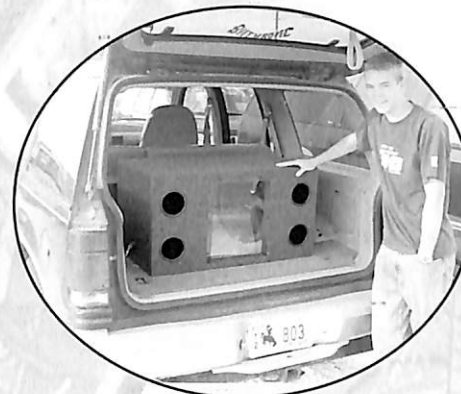

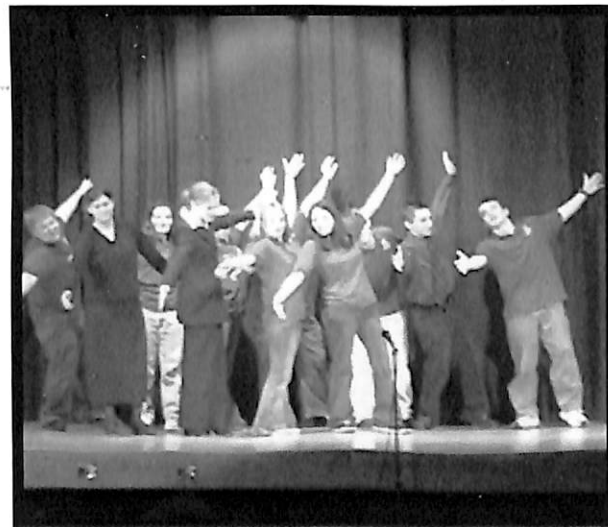

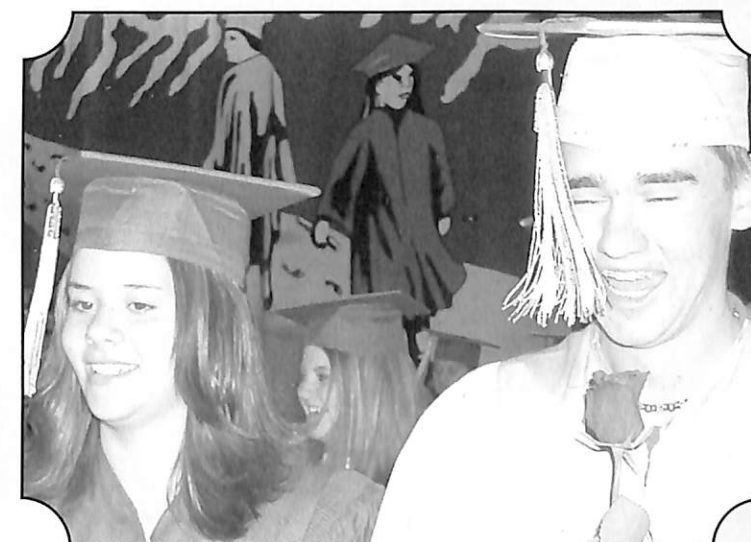
## Beginning Our Future While Remembering Our Past
